Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This annual observance is more popularly known as Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ. In the United States, to allow greater participation of the faithful in this holy day, Corpus Christi takes place on a Sunday. In its origin, it was established to be celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday. Holy Thursday is the day to commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist. And so, the Thursday celebration of Corpus Christi brings forward the Church's Faith in Christ's great gift to us of his Holy Body and Blood, given on the night before he died for us. Every Sunday, when we celebrate the Sacrifice of the Lord and receive Holy Communion, we profess our common faith in the saving death and resurrection of Christ that takes place with the Eucharist and that the same Christ is truly and completely present in the bread and wine that becomes his Body and Blood. This great Mystery celebrated so frequently can become routine and even careless. Corpus Christi gives us a necessary pause to proclaim with even greater vigor what we believe and recall the need to celebrate the Eucharist and receive Holy Communion with renewed reverence and devotion.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us to always enter into the celebration of Mass as a divine event. Christ dies for us and rises for us. As Christ carries out this divine work from his place at the right hand of the Father in heaven for all eternity, so we - through the power of the Holy Spirit -encounter this same event here on earth with every Mass. This is why we must be alert to all the parts of the Mass and participate with Christian joy in this actual work of Christ. We are reminded today to be mindful in action and prayer of the real presence of Christ in the reserved hosts in the tabernacle. We genuflect in adoration before we enter our pew and when we leave our pew. We enter the Communion procession for the reception of Holy Communion if we have fasted from food and drink for an hour, are free from serious sin, and believe with the Church that the bread and wine are truly the glorified Lord. Our manner of reception of Holy Communion - our bow beforehand, our consuming the hos - is a public declaration of our corporate and interior love for this "wonderful Sacrament."

Today is also Father's Day. As we pray for our own fathers today, we are reminded of how significant this vocation is for all children. Fathers need our encouragement today as they lead their families in the ways of faith. This aspect of fatherhood needs renewed attention and support on the part of all of us.

Religious Freedom Week 2022 begins with the Memorial of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, June 22, 2022, and will conclude on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, June 29, 2022. This week is an invitation for all Catholics to reflect on the value of our freedom to express our faith freely in society and to do whatever is possible to protect this freedom. The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus occurs this Friday, June 24, 2022. Devotion to the Sacred Heart reminds us of the profound personal love the Lord has for each of us and compels us to love him without reservation in return. Plan on coming to Mass on this Solemnity at 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

Dear Clergy, Religious, and Lay Faithful of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia,

This year's celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, on June 19, 2022, also marks the inauguration of a three-year National Eucharistic Revival called for by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The goal of the Eucharistic Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

The first year of the Eucharistic Revival, which begins on June 19, 2022, is the Diocesan Phase. Various diocesan-level events will be offered in which we hope you will participate and invite your communities to do the same. An introductory webinar will be held for clergy and parish leaders of the Archdiocese on May 25, 2022 from 10-11 am to assist parishes in using the Diocesan Phase to begin planning for the Parish Phase the following year. Additionally, several resources are being developed and will be made available to clergy and parish leaders to assist them in the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, catechesis, devotion, and mission. These materials and the link to register for the webinar are available on the Archdiocesan website, <u>phillyeucharisticrevival.org</u>.

The second year of the Eucharistic Revival, which begins on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord in June of 2023, is the Parish Phase. During this year, parishes, institutions, and religious communities are asked to devote their attention to (1) a renewed excellence in the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, (2) intentional catechesis of all the faithful on the Church's teachings on the Eucharist, (3) cultivation of a deeper appreciation for the Church's Eucharistic devotion (e.g., processions, Eucharistic Adoration, and Forty Hour Devotions), and (4) the important connection between the Eucharist and mission. Also, an Archdiocesan Eucharistic Congress will be held on Saturday, September 30, 2023, at the Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown.

We look forward to sending a delegation to the National Eucharistic Congress, which will be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, from July 17-24, 2024. This national gathering of the faithful will begin the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, which is the Year of Going Out on Mission.

Please join me in praying that the National Eucharistic Revival will bear good fruit in our spiritual lives as we focus more intentionally on our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.
