

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Having passed the Easter Time, Holy Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi Sunday, this Sunday the Holy Gospel (see Luke 9: 51-62) points us again in the direction of the duty of a faithful disciple of the Lord Jesus. The past several weeks and their liturgical observances have prepared us to hear the Lord call us to follow him in a consistent and intentional way this Sunday. With the summer months with a bit more time for reflection, let us consider the depth of our fidelity to the Lord, to his Word, to his Church.

This past Friday evening, we held our annual Keys and Sword Event. It was again a tremendous success for our Cathedral Parish. This annual event promotes a culture of financial support for the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia beyond the limits of our own parish community. The Cathedral Basilica serves the Archbishop, the whole Archdiocese, and our parish. So, it is right that many be invited to provide financial support for her service to our local Church. I thank all of you who supported our Keys and Sword Event by attending the dinner on Friday evening, by a donation, and/or by an ad in the Ad Book. This is appreciated so very much.

This Wednesday, June 29, 2022, is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles, the patrons of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, and of our Cathedral Basilica. We will celebrate our feast day twice. On Wednesday, the actual day, we will commemorate these Holy Apostles at the 7:15 AM Mass in the Chapel at the 12:05 PM Mass and the 7:00 PM Mass in the Cathedral Basilica. Next Sunday, we will observe the Solemnity at all the Sunday Masses, including the Anticipated Mass. We turn to our heavenly patrons to pray for us, especially in these days, that we may be faithful to Jesus in every way. This is the Collect for the Mass during the Day for Saints Peter and Paul. I invite you to pray it as we lead up to our great feast:

O God, who on the solemnity of the Apostles Peter and Paul, give us the noble and holy joy of this day, grant, we pray, that your Church may in all things follow the teaching of those through whom she received the beginnings of right religion.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

The celebration of the anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral Basilica is on Thursday, June 30, 2022, and will be observed at the 12:05 PM Mass. This Mass will be celebrated in the Cathedral Basilica.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to the national collection for the Campaign for Human Development. EVANGELIZATION

SS. Peter and Paul and Eucharistic Revival

On June 29th, we celebrate the Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul, our patrons. SS. Peter and Paul are counted among Jesus' earliest followers. Peter is the brother of Andrew who first brought him to Jesus. Peter would quickly become one of Jesus' closest friends and collaborators. Eventually, Peter would become the leader of the apostolic band.

Paul began life as a deeply religious man. He was a Jewish Pharisee and desired God's honor and glory, however not as a follower of Jesus. We first encounter him in the story of St. Stephen's martyrdom, where Paul (who is also called Saul) is there consenting to the action his Jewish brothers undertake to silence Stephen. Paul himself would come to see Jesus as Stephen did that day and he would never be the same.

Both Sts. Peter and Paul's stories speak to us in different ways as we determine to live truly Christian lives. One aspect that I believe can teach us a great deal if we pay attention is the growth and maturing each undergoes in his following of Jesus Christ. What do I mean? Neither starts out as saints!

Pope Emeritus Benedict noted in a series of teachings on the lives of the apostles that Peter undergoes not one but several moments of "conversion" in his life. His words:

"...it seems to me that these conversions of St. Peter on different occasions and his whole figure are a great lesson for us. We too have a desire for God, we too want to be generous, but we too expect God to be strong in the world and transform the world on the spot, according to our ideas and the needs that we perceive. God chooses a different way. God chooses the way of the transformation of hearts in suffering and humility. And we, like Peter, must convert, over and over again. We must follow Jesus and not go before him: it is he who shows us the way."

Peter learns over time the suffering and humility that purify the heart of a disciple. He will also experience the power and promise of that faith as well as the cross. Paul too; will suffer much for the sake of Jesus' name however, love will make it light. He writes in his letter to the Galatians as a man whose heart has been given over to Christ entirely:

"I have been crucified with Christ, yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me." (Gal 2:19b-20)

On the feast of Corpus Christi, we began a three-year period of Eucharistic Revival in our local Church and throughout the United States. This period is meant to be a time for deepening our faith in the living God present in the Eucharist. Let us determine like SS. Peter and Paul to set our eyes upon him and not on ourselves.

Making a visit to the Blessed Sacrament, that is spending time adoring the Lord in the Tabernacle of exposed upon the altar with faith and fervor can help us to grow in that Eucharistic Amazement that cannot but leave us changed. SS. Peter and Paul became saints because of the intentional time they passed with Jesus. Wherever our faith may be today, let us determine to start fresh. SS. Peter and Paul, pray for us!

Cathedral Sacramental Preparation 2022-2023

The Cathedral Parish will offer classes again this coming year for children who need to prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. This is NOT a full religious education program.
