

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The lessons of the Gospel for these Sundays during the year give us excellent instruction on what it means to follow Jesus in a complete way. This Sunday we hear the familiar story of the Good Samaritan (see Luke 10: 25-37). The lesson moves in two directions at the same time. On the one hand, we are called by Jesus to know more than the Commandments by heart. Rather, we are called to give them vivid expression with our lives. It is one thing to know that we are to love our neighbor and altogether something greater - especially for the follower of Jesus - to actually do so in imitation of the Savior. This loving of our neighbor costs us. It involves going out of our way in conscious loving service of others for the glory of the Lord and for their benefit. This was the action of Jesus on the cross, the action of the Mass, the action of Christ within us as we live our Christian lives. We are also called by Jesus to be the beneficiaries of love and mercy. Like the victim to the robbers, we are called to be open and ready to receive the love and mercy of others, of the Lord. When we have the blessing of the Gospel love bestowed upon us - and acknowledge it - we are schooled to then show it to others.

Reverend Monsignor John M. Savinski moves into our Cathedral Rectory from Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary this week. Monsignor is already a very familiar face to all of us. He has been assisting with Mass and Confessions for quite some time here at the Cathedral Basilica. In addition to his assistance here at the Cathedral Basilica, Monsignor is the Master of Ceremonies for the Archbishop as he celebrates the Sacred Liturgy throughout the Archdiocese. Please join me in welcoming Monsignor Savinski to his new residence at the Cathedral Rectory.

Saturday, July 16, 2022, is the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This midsummer commemoration of our Blessed Mother is another reminder of how Mary is always near to us, praying for us, listening to us, and ready to come to our aid. The Collect for the Mass of Our Lady of Mount Carmel beautifully illustrates these ideas:

May the venerable intercession of the glorious Virgin Mary come to our aid, we pray, O Lord, so that, fortified by her protection, we may reach the mountain which is Christ. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to the summer landscape needs of the Cathedral Parish. If possible, please make use of the on-line possibility of making your weekly offering. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish.

#### REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el Decimoquinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Las lecciones del evangelio para estos domingos del año nos dan una excelente instrucción sobre lo que significa seguir a Jesús de manera integral. Este domingo escuchamos la conocida historia del Buen Samaritano (ver Lucas 10: 25-37). La lección se mueve en dos direcciones al mismo tiempo. Por un lado, Jesús nos llama a saber más de los mandamientos de memoria. Más bien, estamos llamados a darles una expresión vívida con nuestras vidas. Una cosa es saber que debemos amar a nuestro prójimo y algo mucho más grande, especialmente para el seguidor de Jesús, realmente hacerlo imitando al Salvador. Este amar al prójimo nos cuesta. Se trata de salir de nuestro camino en el servicio amoroso consciente de los demás para la gloria del Señor y para su beneficio. Esta fue la acción de Jesús en la cruz, la acción de la Misa, la acción de Cristo dentro de nosotros mientras vivimos nuestra vida cristiana. También somos llamados por Jesús a ser los beneficiarios del amor y la misericordia. Como la víctima de los ladrones, estamos llamados a estar abiertos y dispuestos a recibir el amor y la misericordia de los demás, del Señor. Cuando se nos otorga la bendición del amor del evangelio, y lo reconocemos, se nos enseña a mostrárselo a los demás.

El Reverendo Monseñor John M. Savinski se muda a nuestra Rectoría de la Catedral desde el Seminario San Carlos Borromeo esta semana. Monseñor ya es un rostro muy familiar para todos nosotros. # **Cathedral Sacramental Preparation 2022-2023**

The Cathedral Parish will offer classes again this coming year for children who need to prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. This is NOT a full religious education program.

Your child may attend these classes whether he or she is attending a Catholic school in the Archdiocese, is in a religious education program at another parish, is **NOT** in religious education, or is in a home-based program.

There will be a section of each class for primarily English-speaking children/families, and another for primarily Spanish-speaking children/families.

The schedule for 2022-2023 will be out very soon! Classes for the English-speaking section will start on October. Children coming for First Holy Communion preparation will be prepared for the Sacrament of Penance during the fall; after New Year classes will focus on the Holy Eucharist and specific preparation for First Holy Communion. Confirmation preparation will follow the same schedule.

More information will be on this website very soon, along with registration forms! Please stay tuned!

The Sacrament of Confirmation for school age children will be on Sunday, April 16, 2023 at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass.

Bishop Joseph Coffey will administer the Sacrament.

First Holy Communion will be on Sunday, May 7, 2023 At the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass.



# PILGRIMAGE OPPORTUNITIES Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel

The following components can be combined to create a pilgrimage to the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul and the Shrine of Saint Katharine Drexel:

- Presentation on Saint Katharine Drexel
- Guided Tour of the Cathedral Basilica
- Mass (public or separate) and opportunity for Confessions
- Prayer to begin or end the day of pilgrimage (suggestions for the group)

The maximum number of people for a pilgrimage is 50 total, students and adults. For lower school students, the ratio of students to adults must be 10 to 1, and for middle and upper school students, the ratio must be 15 to 1. At this time, face coverings or masks must be worn by all who enter the Cathedral Basilica and social distancing must take place wherever possible. The pilgrimage opportunity is offered on Wednesdays by appointment, but note that the order of these components is flexible as is the time of day, all subject to available resources.
