Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. "Increase our faith (Luke 17: 5)." The Apostles in the Gospel this Sunday beseech the Lord Jesus to increase their faith. The Twelve knew the Lord deeply and followed him closely. They heard his saving instructions and witnessed his marvelous deeds. Yet, together they pleaded with Jesus to increase their faith. What could have been lacking in their belief at this point in the Gospel story? Perhaps, nothing was lacking in their belief in Jesus, in his words and deeds. However, they knew their own weaknesses, their sinfulness, and their fears. They were aware of their struggles to follow him with the faithfulness he expected of them. Is not this our story as well as modern day Christians? We love the Lord Jesus. We believe all that he and his holy Church teaches us. We are in wonder and awe of his great signs in the Gospel and the Sacraments we celebrate today, especially the Holy Eucharist. Yet, we too know our weaknesses, our sinfulness, our fears - our struggles to follow him faithfully. Like the Apostles, we beg the Lord to increase our faith. We ask for the gift and grace to have confidence in the Lord's presence to us to do all that he asks of us. We ask for his generous assistance to carry our crosses. We pray for the help to witness to him with a holy way of life - to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. The Lord will not fail to hear our prayers for an increase in faith. It is for us to petition him for an increase in faith, to nourish it, and to protect it.

The Parish Pastoral Council serves our parish in many fine ways, especially as a group of parishioners that offers me sound advice. Council meetings cover a wide range of topics and concerns that directly impact the life and mission of the Cathedral Parish. I am extremely grateful to the Council members for their time and interest in the work of the Council and the assistance they give to me. Every year there is a turnover of one or two members. This year we are looking for candidates from among our parishioners who can represent those who carry out a liturgical ministry and who can represent the Spanish-speaking members of the Cathedral Parish. We had expected to have more nominees than we did at the end of September for both of these categories. So, we are going to extend the opportunity to nominate until Sunday, October 9, 2022. If you would like to nominate yourself or would like to nominate someone for either or both of these categories, please contact me, Father Biedrzycki, or a member of the Parish Pastoral Council. Thank you!

Please keep the intention for Peace in our City and an end to gun violence in our neighborhoods in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!





# "This is the will of God, your Holiness..." Growing in Prayer (Part 1)

Friends, the month of October is dedicated to one of the most important prayer practices we know, the Rosary. Prayer, especially daily prayer, is an essential part habit of every follower of Jesus Christ. I am excited to offer you this first installment of several about growing in prayer. It is prayer that enables us to accomplish God's will. Let's start there.

St. Paul writes to the Christians in Thessalonica:

"Finally, brothers we earnestly ask and exhort you in the Lord Jesus that, as you received from us how you should conduct yourselves to please God [...] This is the will of God, your holiness..." (1 Thes 4:1a, 3a)

Holiness is the end of the Christian Life. It is God's will for us. Why? First, let's consider Sacred Scripture. In the Book of Leviticus, God instructs Moses to admonish the people: "Be holy, for I, the Lord your God am holy." (Lev 19:2). Jesus uses another word to describe holiness saying in the Sermon on the Mount: "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5:48). Some of us may see these lines and think: "I know myself – that is impossible! Only Jesus is perfect!" So true. And yet, what happened to us Baptism? St. Paul helps us: "...all you who have been baptized into Christ, have put on Christ." (Gal 3:27)

Paul's words are not metaphorical. The spiritual life is all about living out what begins with faith and effected in Baptism. One holy bishop observed, "Christian life is the reproduction of Jesus in souls; and perfection, the most faithful and perfect reproduction, consists in the transformation of souls into Jesus." This is the end for which we strive. To be transformed into Jesus. This is perfect charity; a foretaste of heaven.

Friends, the way we get there is prayer. As we read in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the mystery of faith, "requires that the faithful believe in it, that they celebrate it, and that they live from it in a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God. This relationship is prayer." (CCC 2558) Over the next several weeks, let's consider how we can cultivate that personal and vital relationship with the God and become holy as he is holy, Amen!
