

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them (Luke 15: 2)." This was the complaint of the Pharisees and scribes about Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel. The Lord responds to their complaint with three very familiar parables - the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the prodigal son. All three of these parables teach us about the Father's great love for each of us, each of us sinners. Our Father in heaven has made us, saved and redeemed us with the death and rising of his divine Son, and filled us with his grace with the outpouring of his Holy Spirit. We belong to him. He made us for himself. This is how he loves us and wants us to be in a right relationship with him - a relationship without sin, especially serious sin. When we do sin, and unfortunately we do, we make the choice to separate ourselves from God's love. In turn, God desperately seeks our return to him. His invitation is constant. He searches for us for our return like a lost sheep, a lost coin, a lost son or daughter. When we do make our return - as the Scriptures says - there is great rejoicing in heaven! It is truly remarkable to ponder the depth of God's love for each of us. At the same time, we need to consider our desire to return to the Father's love from our sin, our sinful ways. God's love for us inspires contrition. God's love for us should lead us to the regular confession of our sins in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. God's love for us sinners is not to be taken for granted nor it is to be presumed. God's love, a Father's love for his sons and daughters, is for us to love him completely in return.

Next Sunday, September 18, 2022, we observe Catechetical Sunday throughout the United States. Catechetical Sunday provides the opportunity to highlight those in our parish community who assist the priests in teaching and passing on the Faith. At the 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass for Sunday next Saturday, our parish catechists will receive a blessing for their important work among us. In a sense, all of us are catechists, perhaps not in a formal way, by way of our Baptism into Christ. We all have the duty to pass on the Faith to family members, friends, and those we meet each day. Many times this takes place with good example. It also takes place when we stand up for the Faith or correct an erroneous presentation of the Faith. Let us pray for our parish catechists and for ourselves for the strength to be solid witnesses to Jesus and all he teaches us through his Church.

The Saint Anthony Society will celebrate 100 Years next Saturday, September 17, 2022 with Holy Mass at 3:00 PM in the Cathedral Basilica. The Mass will be followed by a procession with Saint Anthony outside the Basilica. All are welcome! The beautiful statue of Saint Anthony in the Baptistery is a gift from the Saint Anthony Society. The Saint Anthony Society in the Archdiocese continues to serve the Catholic Community with its support of Catholic Education and outreach ministries.

Invite a family member, a neighbor, and/or a friend to join you for Holy Mass next Sunday at the Cathedral Basilica.

Please keep the intention for peace in our City and an end to gun violence in our neighborhoods in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

Este es el Vigésimo Cuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. "Éste recibe a los pecadores y come con ellos (Lucas 15:2)." Esta fue la queja de los fariseos y escribas sobre Jesús en el evangelio de este domingo. El Señor responde a su queja con tres parábolas muy familiares: la oveja perdida, la moneda perdida y el hijo pródigo. Las tres parábolas nos enseñan sobre el gran amor del Padre por cada uno de nosotros, cada uno de nosotros pecadores. Cuando pecamos, y desafortunadamente lo hacemos, tomamos la decisión de separarnos del amor de Dios. A su vez, Dios busca desesperadamente nuestro regreso a Él. Su invitación es constante. Él nos busca para nuestro regreso como una oveja perdida, una moneda perdida, un hijo o una hija perdido (a). Cuando regresamos, como dicen las escrituras, ¡hay un gran regocijo en el cielo! Es verdaderamente extraordinario reflexionar sobre la profundidad del amor de Dios por cada uno de nosotros. Al mismo tiempo, debemos considerar nuestro deseo de volver al amor del Padre desde nuestro pecado, nuestros caminos pecaminosos. El amor de Dios por nosotros inspira contrición. El amor de Dios por nosotros debe llevarnos a la confesión regular de nuestros pecados en el Sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación. El amor de Dios por nosotros, los pecadores, no debe darse por sentado ni debe presumirse. El amor de Dios, el amor de un Padre por sus hijos e hijas, es que nosotros lo amemos completamente a cambio.


