

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. "No servant has two masters. [...] You cannot serve both God and mammon (Luke 16: 13)." The Lord is rather direct in his instruction to us with this Sunday's Gospel. Last Sunday's parables - the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son - all focused on the Lord's desire to seek us out, forgive us our sins and keep us in his company. In every age - and perhaps especially in our time - to live the Christian life without distraction, including the insidious distraction of sin, demands a singular focus in our lives. This focus keeps us in the company of the Lord. The focus must be God. God is our master. God, and not our riches, regardless of the form they take, must receive our complete and undistracted attention as Christians. This way of living the Christian life needs to be habitual and allowed to mature over time. This way of living the Christian life is the witness we must give to others, especially our families and friends. This Sunday as we hear the Lord's instruction to serve God alone let us reflect on how we do just this. Is prayer a part of my everyday routine? Do I examine my conscience each evening? Do I consider what the Gospel teaches and the Commandments require in my daily choices? Do I regularly seek virtue over vice? Just how is God the master of my life, the focus of my life? God's grace is with us as we make him the focus of our Christian lives. Let us be confident in our decision to be a Christian disciple!

October is Respect Life Month in the United States. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia will anticipate Respect Life Month with a commemoration of this theme at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass on Sunday, September 25, 2022. Bishop John McIntyre will be the celebrant of the Mass and the homilist. There are several ways to observe Respect Life Month. Perhaps the most significant way is to learn more about the life issues and to grasp more fully our Catholic commitment to do all we can to protect life from the first moment of conception until natural death. Another way to observe this month is to pray for the intention of respect for human life. Since October is also the month of the Holy Rosary, I suggest that we pray the Holy Rosary throughout this month with the intention of deepening respect for human life. The Holy Rosary can be prayed in a variety of settings - at home, on the way to work, or during a walk. Praying the Holy Rosary before or after Mass is also a great setting.

Panhandlers are often attracted to gatherings at our Cathedral Basilica. I assure you that we have services available to assist the poor and homeless who frequent the Cathedral Basilica. Please do not give any money to the panhandlers inside or outside the Cathedral Basilica. If you are approached by a panhandler, please alert one of the parish priests or sacristans, or greeters.

Invite a family member, a neighbor, and/or a friend to join you for Holy Mass next Sunday at the Cathedral Basilica.

Please keep the intention for peace in our City and an end to gun violence in our neighborhoods in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to the support of the liturgical music programs of the Cathedral Parish. If possible, please make use of the on-line possibility of making your weekly offering. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el Vigésimo Ouinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. "No hay criado que pueda servir a dos amos. [...] No puedes ustedes servir a Dios y a al dinero (Lucas 16:13)." El Señor es más bien directo en su instrucción para nosotros con el evangelio de este domingo. Las parábolas del domingo pasado - la oveja perdida, la moneda perdida y el hijo prodigo - todas se centraron en el deseo del Señor de buscarnos, perdonar nuestros pecados y mantenernos en su compañía. En cada época, y quizás especialmente en nuestro tiempo, vivir la vida cristiana sin distracciones, incluida la insidiosa distracción del pecado, exige un enfoque singular en nuestras vidas. Este enfoque nos mantiene en la compañía del Señor. El foco debe ser Dios. Dios es nuestro amo. Dios, y no nuestras riquezas, independientemente de la forma que adopten, debe recibir nuestra atención completa y sin distracciones como cristianos. Esta forma de vivir la vida cristiana necesita ser habitual y madurar con el tiempo. Esta forma de vivir la vida cristiana es el testimonio que debemos dar a los demás, especialmente a nuestras familias y amigos. Este domingo, mientras escuchamos la instrucción del Señor de servir sólo a Dios, reflexionemos sobre cómo hacemos precisamente esto. ¿Es la oración parte de mi rutina diaria? ¿Examino mi conciencia cada noche? ¿Considero lo que enseña el evangelio y exigen los mandamientos en mis elecciones diarias? ; Busco regularmente la virtud sobre el vicio? ¿Cómo es Dios el amo de mi vida, el centro de mi vida? La gracia de Dios está con nosotros cuando hacemos de Él el centro de nuestra vida cristiana. ¡Tengamos confianza en nuestra decisión de ser un discípulo cristiano!
