Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. "They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them (Luke 16: 29)." This is the heart of the lesson of this Sunday's Gospel. The rich man had many opportunities to live the life of charity and justice, especially when it came to giving food and drink to the poor Lazarus. In death, the rich man perishes in the netherworld and Lazarus rests in the bosom of Abraham. Abraham tells the rich man that he is across the great divide from Lazarus' resting place because of the way he lived, the way he ignored the opportunities to give food and drink to a poor man. The rich man does not want his brothers to suffer the same fate. He begs Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers. Abraham refuses and says, "They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them." My friends, we do not want to suffer the fate of the rich man; and, it is possible. How do we avoid this fate? Let us heed the advice of Abraham. Let us see all the opportunities given to us to follow the way of Moses, the prophets, and the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Now is the time to live the Christian life as fully and honestly as possible. This is how we avoid the fate of the rich man. Every Sunday, when we participate in Mass, we should listen carefully to the word of God for its instruction to live, as God wants us to live. Every Sunday, when we receive Holy Communion, we receive the grace and strength to keep the word we hear. Again, this is how we avoid the fate of the rich man. Let us listen!

The Parish Fall Collection (formerly known as the Block Collection) is upon us. Information about this annual collection and our parish financial status will be sent to your homes in the coming days. It is rather obvious from the published data on our Sunday collections that the monies collected provide insufficient income to meet the weekly expenses. Our weekly expenses run about 20,000 dollars. Our weekly income is supplemented from other sources - the shrine offerings, wedding fees, the Keys and Sword Event, and a small grant from the Archdiocese - but this still leaves us in need of additional funds for our operational expenses. We count on this Parish Fall Collection to help us meet these expenses. Each parishioner is asked to consider a two hundred fifty dollar gift contribution to the Parish Fall Collection. I thank you in advance for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish.

Invite a family member, a neighbor, and/or a friend to join you for Holy Mass next Sunday at the Cathedral Basilica.

Please keep the intention for peace in our City and an end to gun violence in our neighborhoods in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

October is the Month of the Holy Rosary. Let us turn to the Holy Rosary with renewed devotion this coming October for our intentions! Our Lady, Mother of us all, cannot fail to take our prayers to her Son.

The second collection at Mass next Sunday will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Parish. If possible, please make use of the on-line possibility of making your weekly offering. Thank you so very much for all of your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish.




