justice and peace have *embraced*.



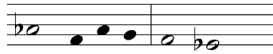

Blessed be God who comforts us in all our trials (2 Corinthians 1:3, 4).

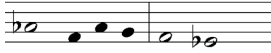
Turn your ear, O Lord, *and* give answer *

Guide my heart to fear your *name*.

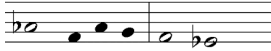
I will praise you, Lord my God, with *all* my heart *
