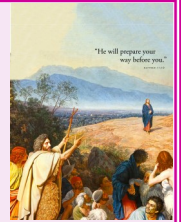

Dear Parishioners,

“Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.” This is the Entrance Antiphon in the *Roman Missal* for Mass for this Third Sunday of Advent. The antiphon comes from Saint Paul’s Letter to the Philippians (4: 4-5). In fact, the nickname for this Sunday, *Gaudete* Sunday, derives from the Latin for the first word of the antiphon, “rejoice.” For two weeks, we have been devoutly anticipating the celebration of the Birth of our Savior with Christmas. Hopefully, these two weeks have been marked by a seriousness of purpose - focusing on our need to prepare for the coming of Christ anew into our lives, repenting of our sins and seeking ways to be more faithful to the Word of the Lord, and reflecting on our Father’s goodness in sending us his only begotten Son. Now, after two such weeks we truly do rejoice that the promised coming of Christ with Christmas is around the corner. We are halfway through this holy time of preparation. Indeed, the Lord is near! As real as our rejoicing might be, so we must continue with sincerity to look toward Christmas with a desire to further ready our hearts for the Savior. Continue the Advent journey, listening to the prophet Isaiah, heeding the voice of Saint John the Baptist, and quietly praying with Mary, the Mother of Jesus.

An Advent Confession is a very important part of our preparation for Christmas. A soul free from sin, from serious sin, is a soul ready for Christmas. We have Confessions every day of the week at the Cathedral Basilica - on Sunday at 9:00 AM and 5:30 PM, on Saturday at 4:15 PM and Monday through Friday at 11:30 AM. Parents bring your children, children bring your parents, neighbors bring your neighbors, to the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. The Lord is kind and merciful!

On Monday, December 12, 2022, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of the Americas. Archbishop Nelson Perez will celebrate Mass on Sunday evening, December 11, 2022 at 9:00 PM in the Cathedral Basilica to commemorate Our Lady of Guadalupe. On Monday, the schedule is as usual with Mass at 7:15 AM and 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

This Wednesday, December 14, 2022, the Nativity Scene outside the Cathedral Basilica, at 18th Street and the Benjamin Franklin Parkway, will be blessed at 3:00 PM. Everyone is welcome to the blessing!

Once again, the generous response to the Parish Giving Tree has been overwhelming. Many, many children and adults will benefit from your generosity this Christmas. If anyone is interested in assisting with the delivery of these gifts, please contact the Parish Office, 215-561-1313.

Please keep the intention for peace in our City and an end to gun violence in our neighborhoods in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

“Estén siempre alegres en el Señor siempre; les repito, estén alegres. El Señor está cerca”. Esta es la Antífona de entrada en el Misal Romano para la Misa de este Tercer Domingo de Adviento. La antífona proviene de la Carta de San Pablo a los Filipenses (4, 4-5). De hecho, el apodo de este domingo, Domingo de Gaudete, se deriva del latín de la primera palabra de la antífona, “alégrate”. Durante dos semanas, hemos estado anticipando con devoción la celebración del Nacimiento de nuestro Salvador con la Navidad. Con suerte, estas dos semanas han estado marcadas por una seriedad de propósito, centrándonos en nuestra necesidad de prepararnos para la venida de Cristo nuevamente a nuestras vidas, arrepintiéndonos de nuestros pecados y buscando formas de ser más fieles a la Palabra del Señor, y reflexionando en la bondad de nuestro Padre al enviarnos a su Hijo unigénito. Ahora, después de dos de esas semanas, verdaderamente nos regocijamos de que la prometida venida de Cristo con la Navidad está a la vuelta de la esquina. Estamos a la mitad de este tiempo sagrado de preparación. ¡Verdaderamente, el Señor está cerca! Tan real como pueda ser nuestro regocijo, debemos continuar con sinceridad mirando hacia la Navidad con el deseo de preparar aún más nuestro corazón para el Salvador. Continuar el camino de Adviento escuchando al profeta Isaías, escuchando la voz de San Juan Bautista y orando en silencio con María, la Madre de Jesús.

Una Confesión de Adviento es una parte muy importante de nuestra preparación para la Navidad. Una alma libre de pecado, de pecado grave, es una alma preparada para la Navidad. Tenemos Confesiones todos los días de la semana en la Catedral Basílica: los domingos a las 9:00 AM y las 5:30 PM, los sábados a las 4:15 PM y de lunes a viernes a las 11:30 AM. Los padres traigan a sus hijos, los niños traigan a sus padres, los vecinos traigan a sus vecinos, al Sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación. ¡El Señor es bondadoso y misericordioso!

El lunes 12 de diciembre del 2022 celebramos la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, la patrona de las Américas. El Arzobispo Nelson Pérez celebrará la Misa del domingo 11 de diciembre del 2022 a las 9:00 PM en la Catedral Basílica para conmemorar a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. El lunes tendremos nuestro horario de Misas habitual a las 7:15 AM y 12:05 AM en la Capilla Catedral.

Este miércoles, 14 de diciembre del 2022, se bendecirá El Nacimiento en el césped de afuera de la Catedral Basílica, en la calle 18va y Benjamin Franklin Parkway a las 3:00 PM. ¡Todos son bienvenidos a la bendición!

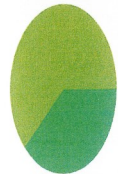

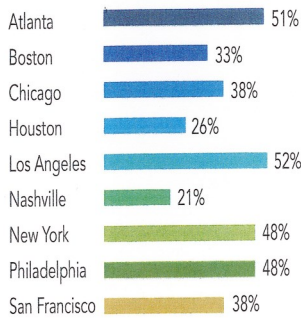
