Dear Parishioners,

This is the Third Sunday of Lent. Lent is passing by quickly! Taking time to reread the Sunday Gospels of Lent keeps our focus on this holy time and its compelling call to turn away from sin and be more committed to the Gospel of Christ. Today, we hear the Gospel passage about the woman at the well (see John 4:5-52). This Gospel is directed especially to those adults among us who have been elected on the First Sunday of Lent for Baptism at the Easter Vigil. Through the conversation between the Lord and the Woman of Samaria, it slowly becomes clear to her that she is finally encountering the only One who can satisfy her real thirst, Jesus. This has been the journey of our catechumens/elect and also for every one of us who have been baptized and are members of the Church. This Sunday reminds all of us of this truth and invites us to turn to Jesus more fully as the Savior. May we always and only thirst for the living water of salvation that comes from Christ alone. May this thirst guide our deeper conversion during Lent.

This Friday, March 17, 2023 is the Memorial of Saint Patrick. With the coincidence of a Friday of Lent and the Saint Patrick's Day, Archbishop Pérez has given a dispensation from the obligation to abstain from meat to all Roman Catholics in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia this March 17th. Lent does not disappear with Saint Patrick's Day. In fact, Friday, especially a Friday of Lent, is always a penitential day. So, like all Fridays of the year, when the choice is made to eat meat then another personal penance should replace it. So, this Friday, for those who make use of the dispensation, then another personal penance in memory of the passion and death of the Lord should be observed.

Monday, March 20, 2023, is the transferred Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Fourth Sunday of Lent displaces the observance of Saint Joseph on the 19th. Saint Joseph is the patron of the Universal Church and our intercessor for a happy death. On Monday, Saint Joseph's Day this year, consider attending Holy Mass at 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

I would like to remind you that listening devices are available in the sacristy for anyone who has any difficulty with hearing during the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. All that is necessary is to go to the sacristy before the celebration and ask one of the sacristans for the use of a listening device.

Please keep the intention for peace in our City and an end to gun violence in our neighborhoods in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to religious education programs in the Cathedral Parish. Abstinence from meat and fasting during Lent

The bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on **all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday**. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. Keeping a voluntary fast throughout Lent is encouraged on the part of all.

The Way of the Cross will take place **each Friday of Lent immediately following the 12:05 PM Mass in the Chapel**. El Vía Crucis, the Way of the Cross in Spanish, will also take place each Sunday following the 12:30 PM in the Basilica.

The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation will be available:

- On Sundays at 9:00 AM (Basilica), 12:00 Noon in Spanish (Chapel) and 5:30 PM (Basilica)
- On Weekdays at 11:30 AM (Basilica)
- On Saturdays at 4:15 PM (Basilica)

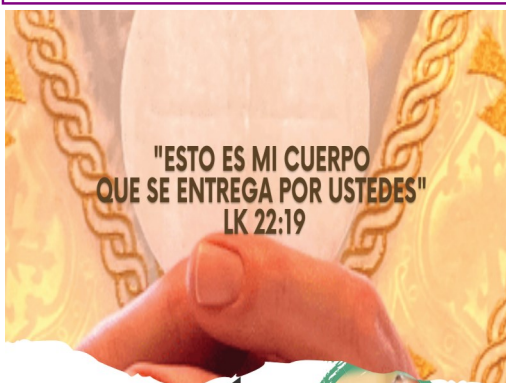

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el tercer domingo de Cuaresma. ¡La Cuaresma está pasando rápido! Tomarse el tiempo para releer los evangelios dominicales de Cuaresma mantiene nuestro enfoque en este tiempo sagrado y su llamado apremiante a alejarse del pecado y comprometerse más con el evangelio de Cristo. Hoy escuchamos el pasaje evangélico sobre la mujer junto al pozo (ver Juan 4:5-52). Este evangelio está dirigido especialmente a aquellos adultos entre nosotros que han sido elegidos en el primer domingo de Cuaresma para el Bautismo en la Vigilia Pascual. A través de la conversación entre el Señor y la Mujer de Samaria, poco a poco se le hace claro que finalmente se encuentra con el único que puede saciar su verdadera sed, Jesús. Este ha sido el camino de nuestros catecúmenos/elegidos y también de todos los que hemos sido bautizados y somos miembros de la Iglesia. Este domingo nos recuerda a todos esta verdad y nos invita a volvernos más plenamente a Jesús como el Salvador. Que siempre y sólo tengamos sed del agua viva de la salvación que viene sólo de Cristo. Que esta sed guíe nuestra conversión más profunda durante la Cuaresma.

Este viernes 17 de marzo del 2023 es el Memorial de San Patricio. Con la coincidencia de un viernes de Cuaresma y el Día de San Patricio, el Arzobispo Pérez ha otorgado una dispensa de la obligación de abstenerse de comer carne a todos los católicos romanos en la Arquidiócesis de Filadelfia este 17 de marzo. La Cuaresma no desaparece con el Día de San Patricio. De hecho, el viernes, especialmente un viernes de Cuaresma, es siempre un día de penitencia. Entonces, como todos los viernes del año, cuando se toma la decisión de comer carne, otra penitencia personal debe reemplazarla. Así pues, este viernes, para los que hagan uso de la dispensa, entonces se deberá observar otra penitencia personal en memoria de la pasión y muerte del Señor.

La Solemnidad de San José, Esposo de la Santísima Virgen María se traslada al lunes 20 de marzo del 2023. El cuarto domingo de Cuaresma desplaza la observancia de San José del día 19. San José es el patrón de la Iglesia Universal y nuestro intercesor para una muerte feliz. El lunes, día de San José de este año, considere asistir a la Santa Misa a las 7:15 AM o a las 12:05 PM en la Capilla de la Catedral.

Me gustaría recordarles que en la sacristía están disponibles aparatos de escucha para cualquier persona que tenga alguna dificultad para oír durante la celebración de la Sagrada Liturgia. Todo lo que se necesita es ir a la sacristía antes de la celebración y pedir a uno de los sacristanes el uso de un dispositivo de escucha.

Mantenga en sus oraciones la intención de paz en nuestra ciudad y el fin de la violencia armada en nuestros vecindarios. ¡Nuestra Señora, Reina de la Paz, ruega por nosotros!

Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad a la Parroquia Catedral. La segunda colecta del próximo domingo estará dirigida a los programas de educación religiosa en la Parroquia Catedral. EVANGELIZATION

"Go Forth!"

Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord (Part 3)

Friends, last Sunday we learned about the context in which we hear the "Dismissal" which is given at the conclusion of Holy Mass. We reviewed the various parts of the Mass and the end they prepare us to accomplish, that is, to send us on mission into the world. We looked at the first of these forms: **"Ite, Missa Est"** or **"Go forth, the Mass is ended."** Today, we want to consider the second of these forms which goes: **"Ite, ad Evangelium Domini annuntiandum"** or **"Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord."**

The word **"Ite"** is an imperative, that is, a command. When the priest or deacon speaks these words to us, in a sense, it is not them commanding us to **"Go!"** but Jesus. The second of the dismissal formulas helps us understand what it is we are meant to be doing as we go. We are to go forth in order to spread the good news of salvation. The word **"Evangelium"** is also significant.

We often translate **"Evangelium"** as **"Gospel."** More exactly, it refers to "good news" or "joyful tidings." In its original context in the 1st Century, it communicated the announcement of a great military victory or the coronation of the emperor. One scholar notes: **"For the Old Testament prophets, especially, Isaiah, the 'good news' is not a past event but a promise that God is coming to save his people..."**² She continues to explain that when the evangelists, for example Mark begin their Gospels, their announcement is a **"resounding proclamation that now, in Jesus, the long-promised visitation of God has begun."**

This is the "good news" that Jesus sends us to share with all the world as we leave Mass. With the Second Vatican Council, renewed emphasis was given to the need for all of Christ's faithful to not only understand what it means to share the Gospel, to evangelize, but to actually do it. For many, both then and now, the work of spreading the Gospel is the domain of "professionals" alone. It seems clear from the structure of the Holy Mass that Jesus does not send a **"crack team of experts"** but rather all men and women forth in order to carry on the work of Salvation until he comes again.

Living the teaching of Jesus goes hand-in-hand with actually proclaim his name aloud. As Pope St. Paul VI reflects:

"The Good News proclaimed by the witness of life sooner or later has to be proclaimed by the word of life. There is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the kingdom and the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth is not proclaimed." (EN 22)

Jesus sends us in the power of his name to make known the good news of Salvation. Next week, we will consider the third of the formulas of dismissal and what it teaches us about giving witness by our lives to the good news of Jesus.
