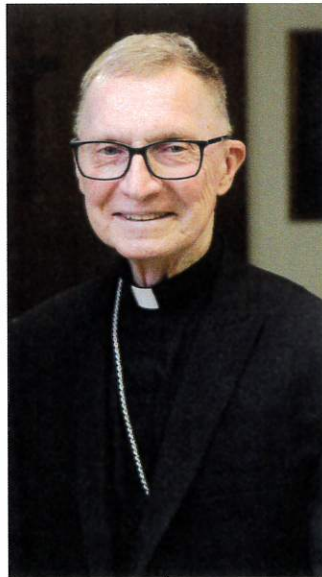
OUR BENEFICIARIES

There are 18 Mission Parishes within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Without CCA donations, these parishes would not survive. These parishes are anchors in their communities.



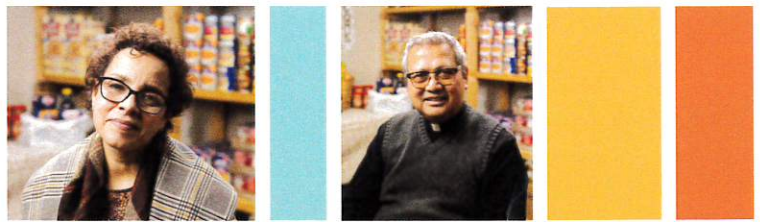
LOCAL MISSION ACTIVITIES
