Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. “At the sight of the crowds, Jesus’ heart was moved with pity for them, because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd (Mt. 9:36).” In a similar way Jesus looks upon so many of us and knows we need his help to hear his word and follow his way. So many of us are troubled and sense abandonment when it comes to confidence in the nearness of the Lord. Then there are those who do not even know the Lord’s love for them. He is moved with pity as well for them, for everyone. In the Gospel today, the Lord calls the Twelve Apostles to be his living presence for others and to carry out many marvelous works for them in his name. This role of the Apostles continues into our own day on the part of those who serve the Church as Bishops and priests. The Lord himself recognizes even in his own day the harvest is great but the laborers are few (cf. Mt. 9: 37). It is very much the same today. Let us intentionally pray that many more men will respond to the call to be priests in the Church, especially in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. We need more priests and good priests!

This is the last Sunday for Father Matthew Biedrzycki to be with us. Tomorrow he moves to his new assignment, Saint Helena Parish, in Philadelphia. All of us are so very grateful for his tremendous priestly ministry here at the Cathedral Parish for the last four years. So many have been blessed by his kindness and compassion, his zeal and generosity. Let us accompany Father to his new assignment with our love, gratitude, and prayers. *God bless you, Father!*

Today, we observe Father’s Day. This is an occasion to pray especially for our fathers, living or dead. The vocation of fatherhood deserves renewed attention and respect. More and more studies indicate the powerful influence a father has on his children, especially when it comes to living the Faith. For a variety of reasons, fatherhood in more recent times has been diminished and needs to be relaunched with a regard for its dignity and purpose in the family and in society. So, we pray in earnest for our fathers. Let us also encourage fathers in their role and support them in their vocation to lead their children to Christ. *Happy Father’s Day to all fathers!*

Religious Freedom Week 2023 begins with the Memorial of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, on June 22, 2023 and will conclude on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, on June 29, 2023. 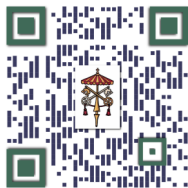

CANTATE DOMINO CHOIR CAMP

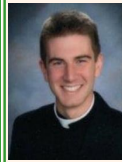
July 10-13, 2023 from 9:00am to 3:00 pm

A Message from Fr. Matthew Biedrzycki

Thank you! Let us pray for each other!

Friends, as Fr. Gill indicated in his rector's Letter on Sunday, June 4, 2023, tomorrow, Monday, June 19, 2023 I will begin a new ministry as Parochial Vicar at St. Helena Parish in Philadelphia. The last four years of service at the Cathedral Basilica have been incredible. Over the past few weeks I have had some time to reflect upon my time here and also what lies ahead. I can see the hand of Jesus throughout all and feel more confident of his care for each one of us now than when I first arrived.

This past Tuesday we celebrated the Memorial of St. Anthony of Padua, the great 13th century preacher and teacher of the Franciscan Order. St. Anthony once said:

"The man who is filled with the Holy Spirit speaks in different languages. These different languages are different ways of witnessing to Christ, such as humility, poverty, patience and obedience; we speak in those languages when we reveal in ourselves these virtues to others. Actions speak louder than words; let your words teach and your actions speak."

I have seen and hear many "languages" since arriving at the Basilica in 2019. So many examples of humility, poverty, patience, obedience and above all love. It is from love and for love that God brings into being all that is and offer redemption to Man who sins through his only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ. May the Holy Spirit, the Advocate Jesus gives us, lead us to speak loudly of the love of God by lives of faith.

Though not far, I will no longer be "next door." I love you all and promise to remember you often at the altar.
