

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This Sunday we hear Jesus instruct us with the parable of the sower in the Holy Gospel (see Matthew 13: 1-23). The seed that is sown is the saving Word of God, the Word that brings us happiness in this life and leads us to eternal life. The parable reminds us as followers of Christ to have hearts ready to receive the Word so that it can bear fruit in our Christian lives.

What does this mean? The Word of God is Jesus, the Son of God, spoken to us by his Father with the breath of the Holy Spirit. The Sacred Scriptures, inspired by the Holy Spirit, are the texts of all that the Father wants us to know from his Son through the Church. As we listen, as we read, the Sacred Scriptures, we encounter the living Word. This encounter requires faith in the Word, a readiness to make it our own and live by it, and to have confidence in its unfailing truth. The Word of God leads us to turn away from sin and to turn to God's ways. A heart that is ready to receive the Word of God is a heart ready and open to receive Jesus. I encourage you to read the Bible in your home regularly. I encourage you as you hear the Biblical Readings at Holy Mass to do so with ears attentive to the voice of God himself. In his way, the seed of the Word sown in your heart indeed will bear much fruit.

This Saturday, July 22, is the Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene. Perhaps, when we first think of Saint Mary Magdalene, we recall her rather sinful life and the Lord's generous forgiveness of her. While this is very much a part of the story of this New Testament Saint, the Sacred Liturgy has us focus on her privileged role as a witness to the Resurrection of the Lord. As we live the Christian life, we struggle to be sincere and authentic. We know our sins and seek the mercy and forgiveness of the Lord. All this is very good and to be encouraged. However, it is only one side of discipleship - turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel. The other side is to manifest the Risen Lord. Mary Magdalene, the forgiven sinner, was entrusted before all others to announce the great joy of the Resurrection (see the Collect for the Feast). What does this mean for us? The world needs to hear about the Risen Lord - each of us, our families, our friends, everyone. The Risen Lord is announced by us above all by example and then by words. We do this when Christ is obviously the center of our lives and directs our thoughts and actions. We do this when we are able to encourage faith in others, especially when they are separated in their thoughts and actions from the Risen Lord. Let us ask the heavenly help of Saint Mary Magdalene to pray for us sinners and to help us to announce the Lord, risen among us, by our lives. Saint Mary Magdalene, pray for us!

The violence in our City, especially the gun violence, is unspeakable. Oftentimes, the shootings are random. Lives are senselessly ended. Families and communities are devastated. And, violence frequently begets violence. Many times, we feel helpless in the face of such constant tragedy. One thing that we as Christians can do and must do is to pray. I encourage you to pray each day in an intentional way for an end to violence in our City. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the support of the liturgical music programs in the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el décimo quinto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Este domingo escuchamos a Jesús instruirnos con la parábola del sembrador en el santo evangelio (ver Mateo 13: 1-23). La semilla que se siembra es la Palabra salvadora de Dios, la Palabra que nos hace felices en esta vida y nos conduce a la vida eterna. La parábola nos recuerda como seguidores de Cristo tener el corazón listo para recibir la Palabra para que pueda dar fruto en nuestra vida cristiana.


¿Qué quiere decir esto? La Palabra de Dios es Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, que nos habla su Padre con el soplo del Espíritu Santo. Las sagradas escrituras, inspiradas por el Espíritu Santo, son los textos de todo lo que el Padre quiere que sepamos de su Hijo a través de la Iglesia. Al escuchar, al leer las sagradas escrituras, nos encontramos con la Palabra viva. Este encuentro requiere fe en la Palabra, disponibilidad para hacerla nuestra y vivir de ella, y tener confianza en su verdad indefectible. La Palabra de Dios nos lleva a alejarnos del pecado y volvernos a los caminos de Dios. Un corazón que está listo para recibir la Palabra de Dios es un corazón listo y abierto para recibir a Jesús. Le animo a leer la biblia en su casa con regularidad. Los animo a escuchar las lecturas bíblicas de la santa Misa, a hacerlo con los oídos atentos a la voz de Dios mismo. A su manera, la semilla de la Palabra sembrada en nuestro corazón ciertamente dará mucho fruto.

Este sábado 22 de julio es la Fiesta de Santa María Magdalena. Quizás, cuando pensamos por primera vez en Santa María Magdalena, recordamos su vida bastante pecaminosa y el generoso perdón del Señor hacia ella. Si bien esto es una parte muy importante de la historia de esta Santa del Nuevo Testamento, la sagrada liturgia nos hace centrarnos en su papel privilegiado como testigo de la Resurrección del Señor. Mientras vivimos la vida cristiana, luchamos por ser sinceros y auténticos. Conocemos nuestros pecados y buscamos la misericordia y el perdón del Señor. Todo esto es muy bueno y hay que animarse. Sin embargo, es solo un lado del discipulado: alejarse del pecado y ser fiel al evangelio. El otro lado es manifestar al Señor Resucitado. A María Magdalena, la pecadora perdonada, se le encomendó antes que todos anunciar la gran alegría de la Resurrección (ver la Oración Colecta de la Fiesta). ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros? El mundo necesita escuchar acerca del Señor Resucitado: cada uno de nosotros, nuestras familias, nuestros amigos, todos. El Señor Resucitado es anunciado por nosotros sobre todo con el ejemplo y luego con las palabras. Hacemos esto cuando Cristo es obviamente el centro de nuestras vidas y dirige nuestros pensamientos y acciones. Hacemos esto cuando somos capaces de alentar la fe en los demás, especialmente cuando están separados en sus pensamientos y acciones del Señor Resucitado. Pidamos la ayuda celestial de Santa María Magdalena para que ruegue por nosotros pecadores y nos ayude a anunciar al Señor, resucitado entre nosotros, con nuestra vida. ¡Santa María Magdalena, ruega por nosotros!

La violencia en nuestra ciudad, especialmente la violencia armada, es indescriptible. A menudo, los tiroteos son aleatorios. Las vidas se terminan sin sentido. Las familias y las comunidades están devastadas. Y, la violencia frecuentemente engendra violencia. Muchas veces nos sentimos impotentes ante una tragedia tan constante. Una cosa que nosotros como cristianos podemos y debemos hacer es orar. Los animo a orar cada día de manera intencional por el fin de la violencia en nuestra ciudad. ¡Nuestra Señora, Reina de la Paz, ruega por nosotros!

Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad a la Parroquia Catedral. La segunda colecta el próximo domingo estará dirigida al apoyo de los programas de música litúrgica en la Parroquia Catedral. 


