Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Throughout these summer Sundays, the Lord has been leading us step by step with the Gospel of Matthew to a deeper faith in him and his Church. This faith gives us confidence in Jesus and all his promises. This faith reassures us of our fears and weaknesses. This faith guides us along a path committed to all the Gospel demands of us. This faith is personal and founded on the teachings of Jesus. Now, this Sunday with the Holy Gospel for Mass (see Matthew 16: 21-27), the journey of faith requires something more from us. If it is a true faith, a faith in the Lord and in his grace for us, then we must follow him completely. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me (see Matthew 16: 24)." As believers, we can do this. We must do this. This is how faith molds us to be real disciples of Christ. Faith is not only a matter of the mind and heart. It also becomes a matter of life, our whole person. We can be like the Savior and take up all those things - in mind, heart, soul, and body - that are difficult and at times seemingly impossible as our cross. As with the cross of Jesus, we carry our crosses with his strength for the glory of the Father, for our redemption, and for the benefit of others. Faith in Jesus is the faith, the power we need, to imitate him, to deny ourselves and take up our crosses. As we celebrate Holy Mass each Sunday, we celebrate the divine event of the cross in the Eucharist. As we receive Holv Communion, we receive the cross of the Lord and so receive what we need to follow the Lord with our crosses as believers in him.

This Monday, September 4, 2023, is Labor Day. For many of us, Labor Day signals the unofficial end of summer and the return to a regular routine of activities. This last of the summer holidays was instituted as a tribute to the American laborers and their contribution to the prosperity of our country. We continue to observe Labor Day in this way. For Christians, this holiday gives us the opportunity to recognize the dignity of all workers and all work and to ask the Lord to bless the work of our hands. This Labor Day let us ask the heavenly help of Saint Joseph, the Worker, to intercede for all workers. Let us also pray for all those seeking employment, that soon they will find work.

This Monday, September 4, 2023, Mass will be celebrated in the Cathedral Chapel at 9:00 AM. Following Mass, everyone is invited to pray the Holy Rosary at the Queen of Apostles Garden behind the Cathedral Basilica. The Basilica and the Parish Office are closed on Labor Day.



Estimados feligreses,

Este es el vigésimo segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. A lo largo de estos domingos de verano, el Señor nos ha ido guiando paso a paso con el evangelio de Mateo hacia una fe más profunda en Él y su Iglesia. Esta fe nos da confianza en Jesús y todas sus promesas. Esta fe nos tranquiliza en nuestros miedos y debilidades. Esta fe nos guía por un camino comprometido con todo lo que el evangelio nos exige. Esta fe es personal y está fundada en las enseñanzas de Jesús. Ahora, este domingo con el santo evangelio para la Misa (ver Mateo 16: 21-27), el camino de fe requiere algo más de nosotros.
