Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus is a wonderful teacher. The parables we have been hearing over the past few weeks have guided us to see the importance of following Jesus and living as members of his Kingdom on his terms and not our terms. Today, the Lord makes use of a conversation asking those listening for their opinion. In this Sunday’s Gospel (see Matthew 21: 28-32), with the example of the two sons, one who delays upon following his father’s request but in the end does it and the other who says yes but doesn’t do it, we learn several lessons. What matters most to the Lord is fidelity to his saving will for us. Sometimes our response is delayed. In the end, our eventual accepting response is the desire of our heavenly Father as we follow the path of his Son. It is rather easy to judge, externally, that some may not be following the will of God, yet this is matter for the Lord alone. Perhaps, a final lesson is that following the will of God requires doing so with mind, heart and soul. May we please the Lord with renewed efforts to listen carefully to his Word and follow with greater fidelity his will.

October is Respect Life Month and today is Respect Life Sunday. Not everyone in the same way can participate in the many public and political opportunities to demonstrate a positive position on respect for human life from the first moment of conception until natural death. However, every one of us can pray for the intention of respect for all human life. Respect Life Month raises our awareness to do just this, to pray for life and especially its legal protection in our land. This intention will be especially remembered in the Sunday Universal Prayer during the month of October.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. The Memorial of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary is this Saturday, October 7, 2023. I encourage all of you to pray the Holy Rosary as frequently as possible, perhaps every day. Grandparents, I encourage you to invite your grandchildren to pray the Holy Rosary with you.

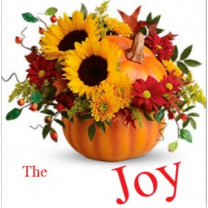

Over the past several weeks, several unbaptized adults in our community have gathered for initial formation in the Catholic Faith. They have expressed their desire to know the Lord more fully, to convert from old ways to his ways, and to be baptized. With their acceptance as catechumens, they publicly declare their intention to be more completely formed as Christians and prepared to celebrate the Sacraments of Christian Initiation -Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist - at Easter. Please keep these men and women in your prayers. Please, greet them when you see them at the Anticipated Mass.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el vigésimo sexto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Jesús es un maestro maravilloso. Las parábolas que hemos escuchado durante las últimas semanas nos han guiado a ver la importancia de seguir a Jesús y vivir como miembros de su Reino en sus términos y no en los nuestros. Hoy, el Señor hace uso de una conversación pidiendo su opinión a quienes escuchan. En el evangelio de este domingo (ver Mateo 21, 28-32), con el ejemplo de los dos hijos, uno que tarda en seguir el pedido de su padre pero al final lo hace y el otro que dice que sí pero no lo hace, aprender varias lecciones. Lo que más le importa al Señor es la fidelidad a su voluntad salvadora para con nosotros. A veces nuestra respuesta se retrasa. Al final, nuestra eventual respuesta de aceptación es el deseo de nuestro Padre celestial mientras seguimos el camino de su Hijo. Es bastante fácil juzgar, externamente, que algunos pueden no estar siguiendo la voluntad de Dios, pero esto es asunto únicamente del Señor. Quizás, una lección final es que seguir la voluntad de Dios requiere hacerlo con la mente, el corazón y el alma. Que agradeamos al Señor con renovados esfuerzos por escuchar atentamente su palabra y seguir con mayor fidelidad su voluntad.

Octubre es el Mes del Respeto a la Vida y hoy es el Domingo del Respeto a la Vida. No todos pueden participar de la misma manera en las numerosas oportunidades públicas y políticas para demostrar una posición positiva sobre el respeto a la vida humana desde el primer momento de la concepción hasta la muerte natural. Sin embargo, cada uno de nosotros puede orar por la intención de respetar toda vida humana. El Mes del Respeto a la Vida aumenta nuestra conciencia para hacer precisamente esto, orar por la vida y especialmente por su protección legal en nuestra tierra. Esta intención será especialmente recordada en la Oración Universal dominical durante el mes de octubre.

Octubre es el mes del Santo Rosario. La Memoria de Nuestra Señora del Santo Rosario es este sábado 7 de octubre del 2023. Los animo a todos a rezar el Santo Rosario con la mayor frecuencia posible, quizás todos los días. Abuelos, los animo a que inviten a sus nietos a rezar el Santo Rosario con nosotros.

El próximo sábado por la noche, 7 de octubre del 2023, en la Misa Anticipada de las 5:15 PM, se llevará a cabo el Rito de Aceptación en la Orden de los Catecúmenos. Durante las últimas semanas, varios adultos no bautizados de nuestra comunidad se han reunido para recibir formación inicial en la fe católica. Han expresado su deseo de conocer más plenamente al Señor, de convertirse de los viejos caminos a sus caminos y de ser bautizados. Con su aceptación como catecúmenos, declaran públicamente su intención de estar más completamente formados como cristianos y preparados para celebrar los sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana (Bautismo, Confirmación y Eucaristía) en la Pascua. Por favor mantengan a estos hombres y mujeres en sus oraciones. Por favor, salúdenlos cuando los vean en la Misa Anticipada.
