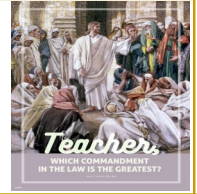

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Holy Gospel today gives us the two summary commandments of all the Commandments of the Lord (see Matthew 22: 34-40). Love God with all that we are and love our neighbor as ourselves. We have become so accustomed to hearing these words of Jesus that their weight and force may be less than they should be in guiding us in living the Christian life. Jesus means what he says and gives us the grace to do what he says. For followers of the Lord Jesus, God must be at the center of our lives. Jesus shows us in the Gospels how his Father, and our Father, was the source and aim of his every deed. Likewise, in a conscious and consistent manner, our prayers, thoughts, and actions need to begin with God and then they will end with God. In this way, our prayers, thoughts, and actions will necessarily turn toward our neighbor. To love God then is to love our neighbor.

The month of November begins this week with two very important observances for all Catholics. Wednesday, November 1, 2023 is the Solemnity of All Saints, a *Holy Day of Obligation*. Thursday, November 2, 2023 is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). Please see the schedule of Masses for the Holy Day and for All Souls Day elsewhere in this edition of the Parish Bulletin.

All Saints, as a Holy Day of Obligation, requires us to participate at Mass and to conduct ourselves throughout the day as much as possible like a Sunday. For many, this Wednesday is a typical workday and therefore brings a challenge to observe the Holy Day as the Church intends. Yet, it is possible in most cases with some effort to rearrange schedules to participate at Holy Mass and to be mindful of all the saints, especially our patron saints, and their example and prayers for us as we strive to live the Christian life.

All Souls' Day, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, reminds us of the spiritual work of mercy to pray for the dead. We remember the dead, especially during the celebration of Mass. Our faith assures us of the power of Christ's Sacrifice to aid the souls in Purgatory as they are purified for the glory of heaven. On November 2, we remember our beloved deceased with special devotion and all through the month of November. The All Souls Envelopes, listing the dead to be remembered this month at Mass, will be placed at the All Souls Altar in the Basilica. I encourage you to obtain a Memorial Candle for your beloved deceased to be placed at the All Souls Altar. Please see elsewhere in the Parish Bulletin for more information about the Memorial Candles.

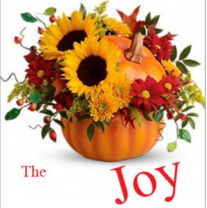

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el trigésimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El santo evangelio de hoy nos da los dos mandamientos resumidos de todos los Mandamientos del Señor (ver Mateo 22: 34-40). Amar a Dios con todo lo que somos y amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos. Nos hemos acostumbrado tanto a escuchar estas palabras de Jesús que su peso y fuerza pueden ser menores de lo que deberían ser para guiarnos en la vida cristiana. Jesús quiere decir lo que dice y nos da la gracia de hacer lo que dice. Para los seguidores del Señor Jesús, Dios debe estar en el centro de nuestras vidas. Jesús nos muestra en los evangelios cómo su Padre, y nuestro Padre, fue la fuente y el objetivo de cada uno de sus actos. Asimismo, de manera consciente y consistente, nuestras oraciones, pensamientos y acciones deben comenzar con Dios y luego terminarán en Dios. De esta manera, nuestras oraciones, pensamientos y acciones necesariamente se dirigirán hacia nuestro prójimo. Amar a Dios entonces es amar a nuestro prójimo.

El mes de noviembre comienza en esta semana con dos celebraciones muy importantes para todos los católicos. El miércoles 1 de noviembre del 2023 es la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos, un Día de Precepto. El jueves 2 de noviembre del 2023 es la Conmemoración de todos los Fieles Difuntos (Día de todas las Almas del Purgatorio). Consulte el calendario de Misas para el Día de Precepto u Obligación y el Día de Todos los Difuntos en otra parte de esta edición del boletín parroquial.

Todos los Santos, como Día Santo de Obligación, requiere que participemos en la Misa y nos conduzcamos durante todo el día lo más posible como un domingo. Para muchos, este miércoles es un día laboral típico y, por lo tanto, presenta el desafío de observar el Día de Precepto como lo pretende la Iglesia. Sin embargo, en la mayoría de los casos es posible, con un poco de esfuerzo, reorganizar los horarios para participar en la Santa Misa y tener presente a todos los santos, especialmente a nuestros santos patronos, y su ejemplo y oraciones por nosotros mientras nos esforzamos por vivir la vida cristiana.

El Día de los Difuntos, la conmemoración de todos los fieles difuntos, nos recuerda la obra espiritual de misericordia de orar por los muertos. Recordamos a los muertos, especialmente durante la celebración de la Misa. Nuestra fe nos asegura el poder del Sacrificio de Cristo para ayudar a las almas del Purgatorio mientras son purificadas para la gloria del cielo. El 2 de noviembre recordamos con especial devoción a nuestros queridos difuntos y durante todo el mes de noviembre. Los sobres de los difuntos, que enumeran a los muertos que serán recordados este mes en la Misa, se colocarán en el Altar de Difuntos de la Basílica. Le animo a obtener una vela conmemorativa para su amado difunto para colocarla en el Altar de Todos los Difuntos. Una vez más, invito a todos nuestros feligreses que quieran hacerlo a nominar a un posible matrimonio y un (a) adulto (a) mayor para ser miembros del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial. Estas nominaciones deben enviarse directamente a mí a fr.dgill@archphila.org con el motivo de la nominación. Las nominaciones continuarán el 31 de octubre del 2023. 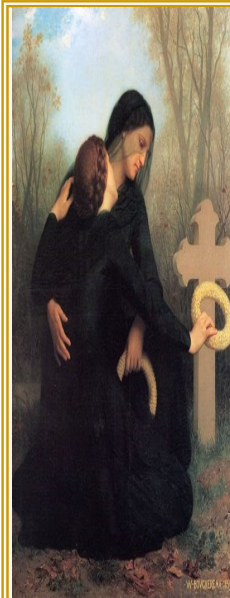
