

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. The last few weeks of the liturgical year direct us to the end of time, the end of our lives. After having celebrated the saving Mysteries of Christ from last Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter as well as all the Sundays in between, we look to his promise of life with him in glory. The Church in her liturgical celebrations in the weeks before the new liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, helps us to mediate on the important need to be ready for the next life. Our Christian lives are about how we follow Christ at this moment and how this moment leads to the next life. Meditating on what lies ahead for us prepares us for the next life as we commit to live this life more completely rooted in Christ and his Gospel. The Gospel for this Sunday (see Matthew 25: 1-13) is the familiar parable of the ten virgins, half foolish and half wise, in preparation for the bridegroom's return. This Gospel is proclaimed this Sunday to point us to the next life, to be reminded of what lies ahead, and to be encouraged to be prepared. Our lives will come to an earthly end. We will be judged on how we followed Jesus. We want to be in heaven with Mary and all the Saints. So, let us recommit to living a more robust Christian life now. Let us turn away from sin and be even more faithful to the Word of God. Let us live now as if we were already in Heaven, eyes only on the Lord.

Please keep in mind that next Sunday, November 19, 2023, is the World Day of the Poor. The observance of this Sunday, established by Pope Francis in 2016, is to raise awareness of the poor in our midst and encourage a communal and individual response to come to the aid of the poor. Next Sunday, I invite everyone to bring some non-perishable food items to Mass. These items will be brought forward with the gifts of bread and wine for the Eucharist and then later in that same week be distributed to Catholic facilities that serve the poor in the City of Philadelphia. In addition to this effort, I encourage everyone to pray for the poor and to be ready to act on behalf of the poor when presented with the opportunity.

As a reminder, low-gluten hosts for Holy Communion and listening devices for the hearing impaired are always available for those coming to Mass at the Cathedral Basilica. Please see the sacristan in the sacristy before Mass begins.

During this month of November, we continue to pray for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. May their souls, and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

I am very grateful to all our parishioners for your generous response to our annual Parish Fall Collection (Block Collection). If you have not already made your contribution, please consider doing so as soon as possible.

Invite a family member, a neighbor, and/or a friend to join you for Holy Mass next Sunday at the Cathedral Basilica.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. #### REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el trigésimo segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Las últimas semanas del año litúrgico nos dirigen al fin de los tiempos, al fin de nuestras vidas. Después de haber celebrado los misterios salvadores de Cristo desde el último Adviento-Navidad y Cuaresma-Pascua, así como todos los domingos intermedios, miramos su promesa de vida con él en gloria. La Iglesia en sus celebraciones litúrgicas en las semanas previas al inicio del nuevo año litúrgico el Primer Domingo de Adviento, nos ayuda a meditar sobre la importante necesidad de estar preparados para la próxima vida. Nuestra vida cristiana trata de cómo seguimos a Cristo en este momento y cómo este momento nos lleva a la próxima vida. Meditar en lo que nos espera nos prepara para la próxima vida a medida que nos comprometemos a vivir esta vida más completamente arraigada en Cristo y su evangelio. Seremos juzgados por cómo seguimos a Jesús. Queremos estar en el cielo con María y todos los santos. Entonces, volvamos a comprometernos a vivir una vida cristiana más sólida ahora. Alejémonos del pecado y seamos aún más fieles a la Palabra de Dios. Vivamos ahora como si ya estuviéramos en el Cielo, con los ojos puestos sólo en el Señor.

Tengan en cuenta que el próximo domingo 19 de noviembre del 2023 es la Jornada Mundial de los Pobres. La observancia de este domingo, establecida por el Papa Francisco en el 2016, tiene como objetivo crear conciencia sobre los pobres entre nosotros y fomentar una respuesta comunitaria e individual para ayudar a los pobres. Además de este esfuerzo, animo a todos a orar por los pobres y a estar preparados para actuar en nombre de los pobres cuando se presente la oportunidad.

Como recordatorio, siempre hay hostias bajas en gluten para la Sagrada Comunión y dispositivos de escucha para personas con discapacidad auditiva disponibles para quienes asisten a misa en la Catedral Basílica. Por favor vea al sacristán en la sacristía antes de que comience la Misa.

Durante este mes de noviembre, continuamos orando por todas las Almas del Purgatorio. Que sus almas, y todas las almas de los fieles difuntos, por la misericordia de Dios, descansen en paz. Amén.
