Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. The Gospel for this Sunday, nicknamed the Last Judgment Gospel, speaks to our personal judgment upon death when the Lord will scrutinize our living the Christian life according to our good deeds. “Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me (Matthew 25: 40).” In the Kingdom of Christ, we all belong to him and to one another. One of the essential aspects of this Kingdom is living our Christian lives in imitation of the King of the Universe, laying down our lives for one another. Concretely, this manifests itself in our genuine service to the needs of our brothers and sisters. As we read this Gospel (see Matthew 25: 31-46), we see everyday ways that we can provide for the corporal and spiritual needs of one another. In a time when isolation from others has become the norm for so many, all the more we are compelled as brothers and sisters of the Lord, the King of the Universe, to make his Kingdom more real in our midst as we extend ourselves to one another. Christ gives us the grace and strength to do this now and always.

Today, November 26 is also the birthday of Saint Katharine Drexel, born in 1858. With her sacred remains in our Cathedral Basilica, she is so very near to us here and in glory. I encourage you to turn to Saint Katharine Drexel frequently in prayer for her heavenly aid for your many intentions.

*Next Sunday, December 3, 2023, is the First Sunday of Advent and the Opening of our Annual Eucharistic Devotion, our Parish Forty Hours. Advent gives us the opportunity to prepare for the Nativity of the Lord with a deeper sense of God’s provident love for us in sending us our Savior and Redeemer. Perhaps this year the need is even greater for us to take seriously this time of joyful anticipation of the Birth of Jesus with focused prayer and reflection. Participation in the Annual Eucharistic Devotion is a wonderful Advent opportunity to be in the Presence of the Lord and know his Real Presence to us. Plan now to be a part of the Forty Hours. Please see more information about the Forty Hour in this edition of the parish bulletin. *Come, let us adore him!**

During these last days of November, we continue to pray in an intentional way for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. May their souls, and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

I thank all of you who have been so generous with your contribution to the annual Parish Fall Collection (formerly known as the Block Collection). The income from this collection is a tremendous help, especially as we look forward to the painting of the interior of the Cathedral Basilica. The response to date has been much less than in years past. If you have already made your contribution, thank you so very much. If you have not, please consider doing so.

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, último domingo del Año Litúrgico. El evangelio de este domingo, apodado el evangelio del Juicio Final, habla de nuestro juicio personal sobre la muerte, cuando el Señor examinará nuestra forma de vivir la vida cristiana de acuerdo con nuestras buenas obras. “Yo les aseguro que, cuando lo hicieron con el más insignificante de mis hermanos, conmigo lo hicieron (Mateo 25:40)”. En el Reino de Cristo, todos le pertenecemos a él y a los demás. Uno de los aspectos esenciales de este reino es vivir nuestra vida cristiana a imitación del Rey del Universo, entregando nuestra vida unos por otros. Saint John's Hospice is a Catholic Social Services shelter for men located in Center City Philadelphia. Established in 1963 by Monsignor Anthony J. O'Neill, Pastor of Saint John the Evangelist Church, and The Little Brothers of The Good Shepherd, Saint Johns was created as an outreach ministry to serve and assist the poor and homeless in the community. Saint John's continues to provide crucial, life-sustaining services with dignity, respect and compassion to homeless men in Philadelphia. Saint John's Hospice is an independent 501c3 agency associated with the charitable work of Catholic Social Services.

Programs: Residence with 40 bed residential facility for men and a 12 bed residential facility for medically fragile men in St. John's Hospice & Good Shepherd programs; Case management, medical and counseling for all residents and day service guests; Mail Room for over 900 homeless men; 160 showers with clean clothing, underwear & shoes every week; Over 3,000 meals each week to homeless & needy men; Emergency bed overnight shelter for 28 homeless men where they can receive a meal & bed every night.

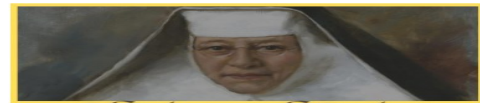
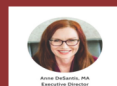
