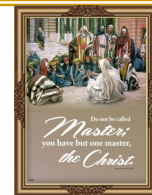

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we move into the final weeks of the Liturgical Year, the biblical texts especially for Holy Mass lead us to consider the last things - Heaven, Hell, Death, and Judgement. The Christian life is meant to be lived with the aim of reaching eternal life. The promise of eternal life is given to us in Baptism and renewed with every reception of Holy Communion. And so, with every day of our life on earth, with the help of God's grace, we strive to live according to the way and Word of Jesus, seeking forgiveness for our sins, with a consistent love of God and neighbor. We do this trusting in the promise of Heaven. One certain way that we know we are on the right path in this life as we move toward the next is to follow the lesson of today's Gospel - practice what you preach. Jesus is harsh in his criticism of the scribes and Pharisees for doing just the opposite - preaching but not practicing what they preached. The more mindful we are of living an integrated Christian life - acting on what we believe or practicing what we preach - the more mindful we are that the goal of what we do today is Heaven.

The Annual Appeal for Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary kicks-off this weekend all throughout the Archdiocese of Philadelphia with the theme, "For Today. For Tomorrow. FOR ALL OF US." This appeal is conducted through the mail with a request for support sent to every parishioner. Next, weekend, Dominic Mirenda, in Second Theology, will speak at all the Sunday Masses on behalf of the annual appeal. I thank you in advance for your generosity to the Seminary. I also ask for your continued prayers for all our seminarians.

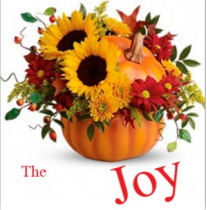

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el trigésimo primer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. A medida que avanzamos hacia las últimas semanas del año litúrgico, los textos bíblicos especialmente para la Santa Misa nos llevan a considerar las últimas cosas: el Cielo, el Infierno, la Muerte y el Juicio. La vida cristiana debe vivirse con el objetivo de alcanzar la vida eterna. La promesa de vida eterna se nos da en el Bautismo y se renueva con cada recepción de la Sagrada Comunión. Y así, cada día de nuestra vida en la tierra, con la ayuda de la gracia de Dios, nos esforzamos por vivir según el camino y la Palabra de Jesús, buscando el perdón de nuestros pecados, con un constante amor a Dios y al prójimo. Hacemos esto confiando en la promesa del Cielo. Una manera segura de saber que estamos en el camino correcto en esta vida a medida que avanzamos hacia la próxima es seguir la lección del evangelio de hoy: practicar lo que predicamos. Jesús es duro en su crítica a los escribas y fariseos por hacer todo lo contrario: predicar pero no practicar lo que predicaban. Cuanto más conscientes seamos de vivir una vida cristiana integrada (actuando según lo que creemos o practicando lo que predicamos), más conscientes seremos de que la meta de lo que hacemos hoy es el Cielo.
