Dear Parishioners.

Today is the Second Sunday of Advent. Saint John the Baptist is a principal figure of Advent. He is the last of the great prophets to announce the coming of the Savior. We meet him in the Gospel this Sunday as the promised messenger to help prepare the way of the Lord (see Mark 1: 1-8). Not only does Saint John announce the advent of Christ but he also announces how to prepare for the coming of the Lord. This preparation is to be marked by repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Yes, as with the first advent declared by the Baptist, so our Advent, this Advent 2023, is time to repent. With the celebration of Christmas, the Divine Infant comes anew to us with his grace and life. Our Christian task is to prepare interiorly for such gifts and so we keep the days of Advent with sincere efforts to turn away from what separates us from the grace and life already given to us and to be given again. In this way, the celebration of Christmas will truly be an occasion to receive the Savior in our hearts and souls. Sin and grace cannot live side by side. Let us do everything we can to purify ourselves and rededicate ourselves to the Gospel this Advent. Let us lead a more examined life. Let us make a good Advent Confession. We have Confessions every day of the week at the Cathedral Basilica - on Sunday at 9:00 AM, 12:00 Noon in Spanish, and 5:30 PM, on Saturday at 4:15 PM and Monday through Friday at 11:30 AM. Saint John the Baptist is speaking directly to each of us this Second Sunday of Advent.

On Tuesday, December 12, 2023, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of the Americas. Archbishop Nelson Perez will celebrate Mass on Monday evening, December 11, 2023, at 9:00 PM in the Cathedral Basilica. All are welcome! Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us!

On Wednesday, December 13, 2023, at 3:00 PM, the Blessing of the Nativity on the lawn of the Cathedral Basilica at 18th Street and the Benjamin Franklin Parkway will take place. The choral group from Saint Francis Xavier School will sing prior to and following the Blessing. All are welcome!

Our Parish Pastoral Council is a vital organ within our parish community. This representative group of parishioners advises me on matters that are central to our parish life. I am so very grateful for their assistance and their keen pastoral insights. I am thankful to all of you who nominated potential new members this past Fall. EVANGELIZATION

Disruptive Peace is Coming...

As we begin this second week of Advent, we continue in this season of *devout and expectant delight*, viewed through the lens of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. Last week we explored the theme of Hope, where we realized we live in the "already, but not yet" hope of Christ's coming: we prepare to recall the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity at Christmas, and we look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time, when He will come in glory with salvation for His people. Today we continue with our reflection on Peace.

We have become very complacent as people, as a society, as Catholic Christians. We live in a world of intense darkness, in many aspects, and we have become content living in this darkness. Our status quo of loneliness, divorce, racism, violence, fear, anxiety, sickness, poverty, of never *being* enough, of never *having* enough... desperately needs to be disrupted. This is precisely why we need God to "disrupt us" ... with His *Peace*. What was that, Father Artman?!

The opposite of peace isn't necessarily conflict. More often than not, its opposite is chaos. Just reread Genesis 1: "In the beginning... the earth was without form, with darkness over the abyss." This situation was in need of a good, holy disruption. "God said: Let there be light, and there was light." God saw that the light was good, and everything he created after that was good, as well. Peace – God's peace, His creation of order – is the over-arching theme of the creation story: God puts everything in its right place.

Then sin entered the world. The Fall of Man made us believe that we are not enough, that we do not have enough, the God is not enough. Psalm 23 tells us that the Lord is our Shepherd, and we shall not want. But we do want, more and more, in all kinds of different ways. This becomes our new status quo. Deep down, we know this isn't right, but we don't know how to fix it. We cry out for God's disruptive peace to make everything right.

Soon, God will come to us in the piercing cry of a newborn to disrupt our status quo. Isaiah prophesizes, "For to us a child is born, unto us a son is given... he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." The angels' song of "Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth" will soon be heard.

God's disruptive Peace approaches, bringing a healing that will restore harmony to all. In the midst of pain and suffering, the balm of God's peace is drawing near. Amidst desperate pleas for freedom from oppression, the soothing presence of God's peace is on the horizon. In the depths of loneliness and sadness, the comforting embrace of God's peace is on its way.

As we continue on the path of Advent, may our hearts resonate with the promise of the Peace of God that surpasses all understanding, heralded by the birth of Christ. Come, Lord Jesus!
