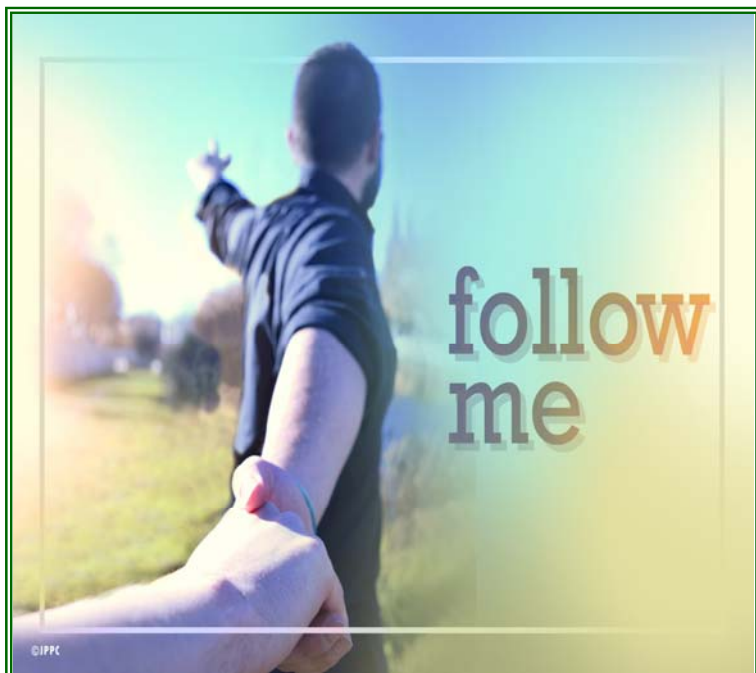

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time includes the numbered Sundays between Christmas-Epiphany Time and Lent as well as between Pentecost Sunday and Advent during the Liturgical Year. While there is not a focus on a particular aspect of the Mysteries of Christ during Ordinary Time, there is a complete presentation of Christ and all of his great works and the call to be his faithful followers as members of the Church. This Sunday, the Sunday following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we are invited by Saint John the Baptist to recognize Jesus as the Lamb of God. Jesus is the One sent to us to save us from our sins as our Savior and Redeemer. As we begin this period of Ordinary Time, let us respond to the word of God with a renewed commitment to follow the Lord more faithfully as we observe all he teaches us.

This Monday, January 15, 2024, we observe Martin Luther King Jr. Day. This holiday has come to have a twofold observance. On the one hand, we recall the legacy of Dr. King as a champion of civil rights. On the other hand, we see the need to give expression to the equal dignity of each person by deeds of service that we can freely render to one another. Let us keep the holiday by living our own Christian mandate to respect one another regardless of race and our duty to be ready to help our neighbors in their need.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins Thursday, January 18, and continues until January 25, 2024, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. Many of us know many people, often members of our own families, who are baptized Christians but not Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism - with water and the use of the Trinitarian formula given in Sacred Scripture - unites all Christians in the promises of Christ for salvation and redemption, with the grace to hear his word, to be faithful to his way of life, and to have the hope for heaven. However, the unity Christ desires for all the baptized goes deeper and is more profound. It is a unity in the Truth, he teaches us in Sacred Scripture and through the Church. This is a unity that displaces confusion on moral issues among Christians and reaches its climax with an authentic and unambiguous understanding of the Holy Eucharist. This is the unity for which we pray during this week of prayer. Please make this one of your daily prayer intentions from January 18 through to January 25.

Monday, March 4, 2024, the 2025 Mass Book opens for the scheduling of announced Masses for that year. Additionally, beginning on this same day, Weddings can be scheduled for 2025. I encourage you to arrange for the offering of Holy Mass for your loved ones, living and deceased, for all the spiritual benefits that come from the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross in the Eucharist. This is especially important for those who have recently died that they be united to the saving death of the Lord for his promise of Eternal Life.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the support of the religious education programs in the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El Tiempo Ordinario incluye los domingos numerados entre el Tiempo de Navidad-Epifanía y la Cuaresma, así como entre el Domingo de Pentecostés y el Adviento durante el Año Litúrgico. Si bien no hay un enfoque en un aspecto particular de los Misterios de Cristo durante el Tiempo Ordinario, hay una presentación completa de Cristo y todas sus grandes obras y el llamado a ser sus fieles seguidores como miembros de la Iglesia. Este domingo, domingo siguiente a la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, somos invitados por San Juan Bautista a reconocer a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios. Jesús es aquel que nos fue enviado para salvarnos de nuestros pecados como nuestro Salvador y Redentor. Al comenzar este período del Tiempo Ordinario, respondamos a la palabra de Dios con un compromiso renovado de seguir al Señor más fielmente mientras observamos todo lo que él nos enseña.

Este lunes 15 de enero de 2024 celebramos el Día de Martin Luther King Jr. Esta festividad ha llegado a tener una doble observancia. Por un lado, recordamos el legado del Dr. King como defensor de los derechos civiles. Por otro lado, vemos la necesidad de expresar la igual dignidad de cada persona mediante actos de servicio que podemos prestarnos libremente unos a otros. Mantengamos la festividad viviendo nuestro propio mandato cristiano de respetarnos unos a otros sin importar la raza y nuestro deber de estar listos para ayudar a nuestros vecinos en sus necesidades.

La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos comienza el jueves 18 de enero y continúa hasta el 25 de enero del 2024, Fiesta de la Conversión de San Pablo. Muchos de nosotros conocemos a muchas personas, a menudo miembros de nuestras propias familias, que son cristianos bautizados, pero no católicos. El Sacramento del Bautismo – con agua y el uso de la fórmula trinitaria dada en la Sagrada Escritura – une a todos los cristianos en las promesas de Cristo de salvación y redención, con la gracia de escuchar su palabra, de ser fieles a su estilo de vida y de tener la esperanza del cielo. Sin embargo, la unidad que Cristo desea para todos los bautizados va más allá y es más profunda. Es una unidad en la verdad que nos enseña en la Sagrada Escritura y a través de la Iglesia. Esta es una unidad que desplaza la confusión sobre cuestiones morales entre los cristianos y alcanza su clímax con una comprensión auténtica e inequívoca de la Sagrada Eucaristía. Ésta es la unidad por la que oramos durante esta semana de oración. Haga de esta una de sus intenciones de oración diarias desde el 18 hasta el 25 de enero.

El lunes 4 de marzo del 2024 se abre el Libro de Misas del 2025 para la programación de Misas anunciadas para ese año. Además, a partir de este mismo día se podrán programar Bodas para el año 2025. Les animo a concertar el ofrecimiento de la Santa Misa por sus seres queridos, vivos y difuntos, por todos los beneficios espirituales que se derivan del Sacrificio de Cristo en la Cruz. en la Eucaristía. Esto es especialmente importante para aquellos que han fallecido recientemente, que estén unidos a la muerte salvadora del Señor por su promesa de Vida Eterna.

Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad hacia la Parroquia Catedral. La segunda colecta el próximo domingo estará dirigida al apoyo de la educación religiosa. programas en la Parroquia Catedral.
