Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel, we hear the principal message of the preaching of the Lord during his public ministry. “This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel (Mark 1:15).” We can never tire of hearing this invitation from Jesus. Everything about being a Christian, a follower of the Lord, is to separate ourselves from sin, especially serious sin, and to live from the grace of God at work in us. Jesus was promised to the Old Testament people as the Savior and Redeemer to bring about the time of fulfillment. This he accomplished on the cross with its gift of salvation and redemption. On our part, we need to receive this gift, cooperate with it, and protect it as we live each day. We do this precisely when we repent of our sins and take to heart - take seriously as a matter of personal choice—the teachings of Jesus and his Church. With the blessings of Christmas and Epiphany still abiding within us, let us heed the invitation to be intentional Christians. Repent and believe in the Gospel.

The Third Sunday in Ordinary is now known also as the Sunday of the Word of God. It is true that every Sunday is a Sunday of the Word of God. However, the designation of this Sunday highlights the constant response of the members of the Church to listen to God as he speaks to us in the Sacred Scriptures, especially during the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. The Word of God forms our hearts and directs our prayer. The Word of God links us with our Jewish brothers and sisters and all Christians as the source of revelation and truth. This Sunday of the Word of God reminds us of the dignity and importance of the proclamation of the holy Word of God. Finally, this Sunday invites all of us to read the Bible with great interest and devotion as part of our daily lives.

Since 2011, Catholics in the United States, at the direction of the American Bishops, have observed January 22 as a day of prayer and penance - the anniversary of the 1973 decision of the Supreme Court to legalize abortion. The intention of our prayer is for the full restoration and legal guarantee of the right to life. Our penance is for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. Decide today that you will pray for this intention, especially this Monday, and what your personal sacrifice will be. Consider coming to the 7:15 AM or the 12:05 PM Mass in the Cathedral Chapel as part of your prayer for the day. The Holy Rosary will be prayed following both Masses for the protection of human life in the womb.

We are in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This week of prayer began on January 18th and will conclude this Thursday, January 25th, with the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, the Apostle. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity gives us the focused opportunity to pray for the unity of all Christians in truth and life.

On Monday, February 5, 2024, the 2025 Mass Book opens for the scheduling of Weddings for 2025. The scheduling of announced Masses for 2025 will begin at a later date—a change in the information in last Sunday’s parish bulletin - which will be announced in the parish bulletin and on the parish website.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the support of the work of the Little Sisters of the Poor and their care of the elderly poor. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En el evangelio escuchamos el mensaje principal de la predicación del Señor durante su ministerio público. "Se ha cumplido el tiempo y el Reino de Dios ya está cerca. Arrepiéntanse y crean en el evangelio (Marcos 1:15)". Nunca podemos cansarnos de escuchar esta invitación de Jesús. Todo lo relacionado con ser cristiano, un seguidor del Señor, es separarnos del pecado, especialmente del pecado grave, y vivir de la gracia de Dios obrando en nosotros. Jesús fue prometido al pueblo del Antiguo Testamento como el Salvador y Redentor para lograr el tiempo del cumplimiento. Esto lo logró en la cruz con su don de salvación y redención. Por nuestra parte, debemos recibir este don, cooperar con él y protegerlo en nuestra vida diaria. Hacemos esto precisamente cuando nos arrepentimos de nuestros pecados y tomamos en serio (tomamos en serio como una cuestión de elección personal) las enseñanzas de Jesús y su Iglesia. Con las bendiciones de la Navidad y la Epifanía todavía dentro de nosotros, prestemos atención a la invitación a ser cristianos intencionales. Arrepiéntanse y crean en el evangelio.

El Tercer Domingo Ordinario ahora se conoce también como el Domingo de la Palabra de Dios. Es cierto que cada domingo es un domingo de la Palabra de Dios. Sin embargo, la designación de este domingo resalta la respuesta constante de los miembros de la Iglesia a escuchar a Dios mientras nos habla en las Sagradas Escrituras, especialmente durante la celebración de la Sagrada Liturgia. La Palabra de Dios forma nuestro corazón y dirige nuestra oración. La Palabra de Dios nos vincula con nuestros hermanos y hermanas judíos y con todos los cristianos como fuente de revelación y verdad. Este domingo de la Palabra de Dios nos recuerda la dignidad y la importancia de la proclamación de la santa Palabra de Dios. Finalmente, este domingo nos invita a todos a leer la Biblia con gran interés y devoción como parte de nuestra vida diaria.

Desde 2011, los católicos de Estados Unidos, bajo la dirección de los obispos estadounidenses, han observado el 22 de enero como un día de oración y penitencia, el aniversario de la decisión de 1973 de la Corte Suprema de legalizar el aborto. La intención de nuestra oración es por el pleno restablecimiento y garantía jurídica del derecho a la vida. Nuestra penitencia es por las violaciones a la dignidad de la persona humana cometidas mediante actos de aborto. Decide hoy que orarás por esta intención, especialmente este lunes, y cuál será tu sacrificio personal. Considere asistir a la misa de las 7:15 AM o de las 12:05 PM en la Capilla de la Catedral como parte de su oración del día. Se rezará el Santo Rosario después de ambas Misas por la protección de la vida humana en el útero.

Estamos en la Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos. Esta semana de oración comenzó el 18 de enero y concluirá este jueves 25 de enero, Fiesta de la Conversión de San Pablo Apóstol. La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos nos brinda la oportunidad de orar por la unidad de todos los cristianos en la verdad y la vida.

El lunes 5 de febrero del 2024, se abre el Libro de Misas del 2025 para la programación de Bodas para el 2025.
