Dear Parishioners.

Our celebration of Christmas continues with this Sunday's Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. In fact, Christmas Time this year will conclude tomorrow with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The traditional date for the Solemnity of the Epiphany is January 6. However, in those countries where the Epiphany is not observed as a Holy Day of Obligation, like in the United States, the celebration is moved to the nearest Sunday. So today, on this day - which is sometimes referred to as "Little Christmas" - we praise our Almighty Father for the manifestation of the Birth of his Divine Son to all the world. The Kings, the Magi, come with their gifts to honor the Infant Savior but receive from him the gift that is also for us. Jesus is revealed to all the nations, all people in every place and for every time, as the promised Redeemer and Savior. As we too adore Jesus, let us pray for the grace - an openness to the gift of our Redeemer and Savior - to hear more fully his Word and to live more completely his Way of life.

Traditionally, the New Year is the occasion for making resolutions. Often these resolutions focus on wanting to improve our health and circumstances of life. May I suggest there might be some spiritual resolutions as well? Consider a decision to spend serious time in prayer each day, in the early morning and/or before retiring to bed. Daily Mass makes a fine resolution and a sure way to be focused on the Lord and his Word each day. Spend some time before the Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Commit to a more regular practice of Confession. Pray the Holy Rosary more frequently. Read a book about a saint or one of the great spiritual classics. Do something for the poor each month of the New Year. This is just a brief list of some spiritual resolutions to which you could add other personal suggestions. The New Year gives us the opportunity to be fit in mind, body, and soul!

The location of our Cathedral Basilica and Chapel in the heart of Center City allows for a place of refuge for the homeless all throughout the day. We have a Christian duty to see the homeless men and women who spend time during the day in the Basilica and Chapel as our brothers and sisters in the Lord. At the same time, issues of safety and respect are also of equal concern. If you see any behavior that is not acceptable, please notify one of the priests or sacristans immediately. Panhandling in the church is forbidden and I ask you not to participate in this. Also, please be mindful not to leave your personal belongings behind in the pew at any time.

A special word of thanks to all the members of our Cathedral Parish Staff and Liturgical Ministers who worked in tireless ways to prepare for the beautiful celebration of Christmas. These men and women gave countless hours of service and ministry that benefited our parishioners and visitors for these days of Christmas for a most fitting celebration of the Birth of the Savior. Thank you so very much!

Thank you again to all our parishioners and visitors for your on-going generosity to the Cathedral Parish, especially at this time of the year. Your generosity in the Christmas Collections, in person and on-line, is so very much appreciated. Thank you as well for your generosity to the Christmas Flowers' fund. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the national collection for Catholic Relief Services. Blessing of the Home and Household on Epiphany

Each year around the feast of the Epiphany many parishes throughout the world participate in an annual blessing of chalk. It is an ancient tradition that not only places God at the entrance of your home, it places your entire family under his protection.

The blessing has biblical roots, deeply tied to the Passover in the book of Exodus, as the chalk is used to mark the doorpost of your home.

The priest will bless chalk at the Vigil Mass for the Epiphany (January 6) and make it available for the Vigil and all day on the Epiphany (January 7). The chalk and the prayers to use at home will be available after each Mass.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Nuestra celebración de la Navidad continúa con la Solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor de este domingo. De hecho, el tiempo de Navidad de este año concluirá mañana con la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor. La fecha tradicional para la Solemnidad de la Epifanía es el 6 de enero. Sin embargo, en aquellos países donde la Epifanía no se observa como día de precepto, como en los Estados Unidos, la celebración se traslada al domingo más cercano. Por eso hoy, en este día, al que a veces se hace referencia como "Pequeña Navidad", alabamos a nuestro Padre Todopoderoso por la manifestación del Nacimiento de su Divino Hijo a todo el mundo. Los Reyes Magos vienen con sus regalos para honrar al Niño Salvador pero reciben de él el regalo que es también para nosotros. Jesús se revela a todas las naciones, a todos los hombres, en todo lugar y en todo tiempo, como el Redentor y Salvador prometido. Mientras nosotros también adoramos a Jesús, oremos por la gracia (una apertura al don de nuestro Redentor y Salvador) para escuchar más plenamente su Palabra y vivir más plenamente su Modo de vida.

Tradicionalmente, el Año Nuevo es la ocasión para tomar resoluciones. Muchas veces estas resoluciones se centran en querer mejorar nuestra salud y circunstancias de vida. ¿Puedo sugerir que también podría haber algunas resoluciones espirituales? Considere la decisión de dedicar tiempo serio a la oración todos los días, temprano en la mañana y/o antes de acostarse. La Misa diaria es una excelente resolución y una forma segura de concentrarse en el Señor y su Palabra cada día. Pasa un tiempo ante el Señor en el Santísimo Sacramento. Comprométete a una práctica más regular de la Confesión. Rezar el Santo Rosario con mayor frecuencia. Lee un libro sobre un santo o uno de los grandes clásicos espirituales. Haz algo por los pobres cada mes del Año Nuevo. Esta es sólo una breve lista de algunas resoluciones espirituales a las que podrías agregar otras sugerencias personales. ¡El Año Nuevo nos brinda la oportunidad de estar en forma en mente, cuerpo y alma!

La ubicación de nuestra Catedral Basílica y Capilla en el corazón del centro de la ciudad permite un lugar de refugio para las personas sin hogar durante todo el día. Tenemos el deber cristiano de ver a los hombres y mujeres sin hogar que pasan tiempo durante el día en la Basílica y la Capilla como nuestros hermanos y hermanas en el Señor. Además, tenga en cuenta no dejar sus pertenencias personales en el banco en ningún momento.




