

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel for this Sunday provides an excellent prelude to Lent. The leper, kneeling before Jesus, begged, “If you wish, you can make me clean (Mark 1: 40).” Immediately, the Lord responded, “I do will it, be clean (Mark 1: 41).” The leper was very much aware of his own serious disease and of the Lord’s power to free him from it. The Lord, ever true to his saving and healing love for all, cures the pleading leper. Lent gives us the annual occasion to search ourselves for all that separates us from Christ and his Gospel, to take note of our sinfulness, and sincerely to seek repentance. The forty days of Lent give us a sustained period of time, with all the members of the Church, to convert from the ways of darkness and sin to the ways of light and grace. The same Lord who cured the leper is ready to accept our repentance and fill us with his life, his glorious risen life. I encourage you to take the time today to plan your Lent. Be serious and steadfast in your observance. Dedicate yourself to increased prayer, fasting (perhaps all through Lent), and giving to those in need.

Lent begins this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024. Please see the information in today’s parish bulletin about Lent at the Cathedral Parish, especially for the schedule for Masses on Ash Wednesday with the distribution of blessed ashes. Every effort should be made to begin Lent with the celebration of Holy Mass. Blessed Ashes are distributed after the Homily at the Masses on Ash Wednesday. Confessions will take place in the Basilica on Ash Wednesday beginning at 11:30 AM.

Next Sunday, February 18, 2024, the First Sunday of Lent, the Rite of Election, and of the Call to Continuing Conversion takes place in the Cathedral Basilica. This is an important step for catechumens and candidates on their way to the reception of the Easter Sacraments. The Archbishop, after consultation with those engaged in their preparation, elects the catechumens for Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist, and exhorts the already baptized non-Catholics to continue their preparation to come into the Church and adult Catholics for the reception of Confirmation and the Eucharist. All are welcome to join the Cathedral Parish catechumens and candidates at the 3:00 PM celebration next Sunday. Please keep all the catechumens and candidates throughout the Archdiocese in your prayers.

The 2024 Catholic Charities Appeal, Giving Hope to All, is underway. Please see the insert in today’s Parish Bulletin for more information.

Today, February 11, 2024, is also World Marriage Day. This observance invites us to pray for all married couples and for a renewed understanding of the role of married life for the benefit of families and society. *Today is also the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, World Day of the Sick.* This day is especially given over to prayer for all the sick, asking the special heavenly help of Our Blessed Mother. Please remember all the sick, even more so this Sunday. Turn to Mary for her healing intercession for the sick.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el sexto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El evangelio de este domingo ofrece un excelente prelude a la Cuaresma. El leproso, arrodillado ante Jesús, suplicó: “Si quieres, puedes limpiarme (Marcos 1:40)”. Inmediatamente, el Señor respondió: “Si quiero; Sana (Marcos 1: 41)”. El leproso era muy consciente de su grave enfermedad y del poder del Señor para librarlo de ella. El Señor, siempre fiel a su amor salvador y sanador por todos, cura al leproso suplicante. La Cuaresma nos da la ocasión anual de buscar en nosotros mismos todo lo que nos separa de Cristo y su evangelio, de tomar nota de nuestra pecaminosidad y de buscar sinceramente el arrepentimiento. Los cuarenta días de Cuaresma nos dan un período de tiempo sostenido, con todos los miembros de la Iglesia, para convertirnos de los caminos de la oscuridad y el pecado a los caminos de la luz y la gracia. El mismo Señor que curó al leproso está dispuesto a aceptar nuestro arrepentimiento y llenarnos de su vida, de su gloriosa vida resucitada. Te animo a que hoy te tomes el tiempo para planificar tu Cuaresma. Sean serios y firmes en su observancia. Dedicarte a aumentar la oración, el ayuno (quizás durante toda la Cuaresma) y a dar a los necesitados.

La Cuaresma comienza este miércoles, Miércoles de Ceniza, 14 de febrero del 2024. El Arzobispo, después de consultar con quienes participan en su preparación, elige a los catecúmenos para el Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía, y exhorta a los bautizados no católicos a continuar su preparación para venir a la Iglesia y a los católicos adultos para la recepción de la Confirmación y la Eucaristía. Todos son bienvenidos a unirse a los catecúmenos y candidatos de la Parroquia de la Catedral en la celebración de las 3:00 PM el próximo domingo. Por favor mantengan en sus oraciones a todos los catecúmenos y candidatos de toda la Arquidiócesis.

LENTEN SCHEDULE

The holy season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Thursday with the celebration of the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. The Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. For catechumens, this takes place through the several stages of Christian initiation. For the faithful, this takes place through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices.

COLLECTION OF OLD BLESSED PALM

You are invited to bring your old blessed palm to church **on Sunday, February 4 and Sunday, February 11**. Please place it in the baskets near the sanctuary. This palm will be burned for the ashes for Ash Wednesday. You may also reverently dispose of your blessed palm by burning it and burying it at home.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT AND FASTING DURING LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, *as a minimal obligation*, that all persons who are **fourteen years of age and older** are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. Keeping a voluntary fast throughout Lent is encouraged on the part of all.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

The description and schedule of the Lenten Rites for the Elect (catechumens) and Candidates for the Easter Sacraments will be announced in the Parish Bulletin all throughout Lent. These rites will take place at the **Saturday evening 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass** for Sunday and at the **Sunday 11:00 AM Solemn Mass**.

Blessed Ashes will be distributed at all the Masses. Mass will be celebrated on Ash Wednesday at:

7:15 AM (Cathedral Chapel)

12:05 PM (Cathedral Basilica)

5:15 PM (Cathedral Basilica)

7:00 PM (Cathedral Chapel) in Spanish

In addition to the celebration of Mass with the distribution of Ashes, there will be Celebrations of the Word of God and the distribution of Ashes in the medical facilities within the parish boundaries on Ash Wednesday.


ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR EVENTS DURING THIS LENT
