Dear Parishioners,

This is the First Sunday of Lent. Everything about Lent, for every member of the Church, is the task of turning away from sin and embracing a Christian life that is even more faithful to the word and ways of Jesus. This is a year-round task and not an easy one. Lent gives us the opportunity - as we are inspired by those elected for Baptism at Easter - to root out those things in our lives that are truly obstacles to living fully the Gospel. Lent is a time to be seriously engaged in a period of enlightenment by Christ's word for purification from our sins. I encourage you to have a good Lent! Traditionally, the Holy Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent describes the temptations of Jesus by the devil in the desert. Jesus, the divine Son, gives us an example in the way he confronts the devil to overcome temptation. Jesus, the divine Son, is our power and strength to fight temptation in our lives. He constantly offers us his mercy to heal and restore us as his followers. With the help of the Lord, we cannot help but make a good Lent.

A good Confession is part of a good Lent. Here at the Cathedral Parish, there are countless opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Confessions are heard three times on Sundays - beginning at 9:00 AM, Noon in the Chapel in Spanish and 5:30 PM, once on Saturdays - at 4:15 PM, and each weekday at 11:30 AM. Confession is the staple of the Christian life and should be a part of our regular practice of the Faith. A Lenten Confession gives us the opportunity to face more fully our need for deeper conversion from sin and to live more faithfully in the grace of the Lord. Please encourage the members of your family to join you in making a good Lenten Confession. Also, please reach out to the elderly and homebound with the offer to bring them to Confession.

In addition to a good Confession, the Church invites all of us to look for ways to give alms, to pray and to fast in a more profound and consistent manner. Please consider making use of the Rice Bowls found at the entrances to the church. The money we do not spend on food goes to help the poor in many parts of the world. Consider extra time in prayer in your home, especially in the morning and the evening. Pray the psalms during Lent. Consider fasting every day during Lent. Fasting is certainly penitential but also opens the door for God and his grace to be at work in us. A personal plan of almsgiving, praying and fasting helps to make for a fruitful Lent.

The Feast of Saint Katharine Drexel is Sunday, March 3, 2024. The Solemn Novena to Saint Katharine Drexel begins on Friday, February 23, 2024. It will be prayed following each Mass in the Basilica and Chapel through March 2, 2024.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el primer domingo de Cuaresma. Todo lo relacionado con la Cuaresma, para cada miembro de la Iglesia, es la tarea de alejarse del pecado y abrazar una vida cristiana que sea aún más fiel a la palabra y a los caminos de Jesús. Esta es una tarea que dura todo el año y no es fácil. La Cuaresma nos da la oportunidad, al inspirarnos en los elegidos para el bautismo en Pascua, de erradicar aquellas cosas de nuestras vidas que son verdaderamente obstáculos para vivir plenamente el evangelio. La Cuaresma es un tiempo para participar seriamente en un período de iluminación en la palabra de Cristo para la purificación de nuestros pecados. ¡Les animo a hacer una buena Cuaresma! Tradicionalmente, el santo evangelio del primer domingo de Cuaresma describe las tentaciones de Jesús por el diablo en el desierto. Jesús, el Hijo divino, nos da ejemplo en la forma en que confronta al diablo para vencer la tentación. Jesús, el Hijo divino, es nuestro poder y fortaleza para luchar contra la tentación en nuestras vidas. Él constantemente nos ofrece su misericordia para sanarnos y restaurarnos como sus seguidores. Con la ayuda del Señor no podemos evitar hacer una buena Cuaresma.

Una buena Confesión es parte de una buena Cuaresma. Aquí en la Parroquia Catedral hay innumerables oportunidades para recibir el Sacramento de la Penitencia y la Reconciliación. Las confesiones se escuchan tres veces los domingos, comenzando a las 9:00 AM, al mediodía en la Capilla en español y a las 5:30 PM; una vez los sábados, a las 4:15 PM y todos los días laborables a las 11:30 AM. La confesión es el elemento básico de la vida cristiana y debe ser parte de nuestra práctica regular de la fe. Una Confesión Cuaresmal nos da la oportunidad de afrontar más plenamente nuestra necesidad de una conversión más profunda del pecado y de vivir más fielmente en la gracia del Señor. Por favor anime a los miembros de su familia a unirse a usted para hacer una buena Confesión Cuaresmal. Además, comuníquese con las personas mayores y confinadas en sus hogares ofreciéndoles llevarlos a la confesión.

Además de una buena Confesión, la Iglesia nos invita a todos a buscar maneras de dar limosna, orar y ayunar de una manera más profunda y consistente. Considere hacer uso de los Platos de Arroz «Rice Bowl por su nombre en inglés» que se encuentran en las entradas de la iglesia. El dinero que no gastamos en alimentos se destina a ayudar a los pobres en muchas partes del mundo. Considere tiempo adicional para orar en su hogar, especialmente en la mañana y en la tarde. Reza los salmos durante la Cuaresma. Considere ayunar todos los días durante Cuaresma. El ayuno es ciertamente penitencial, pero también abre la puerta para que Dios y su gracia obren en ustedes. Un plan personal de limosna, oración y ayuno ayuda a que la Cuaresma sea fructífera.

La Fiesta de Santa Katharine Drexel es el domingo 3 de marzo del 2024. La Novena Solemne a Santa Katharine Drexel comienza el viernes 23 de febrero del 2024. Se rezará después de cada Misa en la Basílica y Capilla hasta el 2 de marzo del 2024.

LENTEN SCHEDULE

The holy season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Thursday with the celebration of the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. The Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. For catechumens, this takes place through the several stages of Christian initiation. For the faithful, this takes place through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT AND FASTING

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as a *minimal obligation*, that all persons who are **fourteen years of age and older** are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. Keeping a voluntary fast throughout Lent is encouraged on the part of all.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

The description and schedule of the Lenten Rites for the Elect (catechumens) and Candidates for the Easter Sacraments will be announced in the Parish Bulletin all throughout Lent. These rites will take place at the **Saturday evening 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass** for Sunday and at the **Sunday 11:00 AM Solemn Mass**.

THE WAY OF THE CROSS

will take place each Friday of Lent in the Chapel immediately following the 12:05 PM Mass.

El Via Crucis, the Way of the Cross in Spanish, will also take place each Sunday of Lent in the Basilica following the 12:30 PM Mass.

By eating one simple meal weekly and placing your savings into the *Rice Bowl*, you will be joining in solidarity with all who have so little to live on and helping to reach out to assist them throughout the world and here in the Archdiocese. *Rice bowls* are available in the vestibules. Your donations can be dropped off during Holy Week and the first weeks of Easter in the collection basket at Mass or to the Parish Office.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR EVENTS

On **Wednesday, March 13, 2024**, the Cathedral Basilica will be open from **7:00 to 9:00 PM** with a large number of priests available to hear confessions in English and Spanish. All are welcome.

The Solemn Novena to Saint Katharine Drexel begins on Thursday, February 22, 2024. The Feast of Saint Katharine Drexel falls on the Third Sunday of Lent and so it will not be observed liturgically this year.

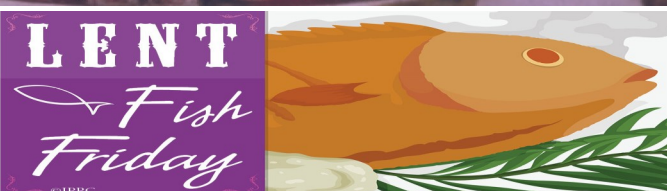
