Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels and most likely the first of the four to be written. The evangelist has a keen way of saying a great deal in a few words. This Sunday's Gospel is no exception. We hear how the Lord cured the mother-in-law of Saint Peter, how a great number gathered at the door of the home of Saint Peter and Saint Andrew for healing from diseases and demons. We also hear how he woke the next morning for prayer in a deserted place and finally how he moved on to a nearby village for more preaching and healing. What strings all these brief episodes together is the Lord's work to heal the sick, people sick with "various diseases." The Lord continues to heal, to heal us, of all types of illnesses. The greatest healing comes to our souls when we allow the Lord to forgive our sins, especially with the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Let us turn to him in a serious way and ask him to heal us, make us whole before him, with confidence that he alone can take away our sins and even bring healing to our bodies and minds.

Today, in the United States, we observe the World Day for Consecrated Life. This day reminds us to pray in thanksgiving for all those called to follow in a complete way the evangelical counsels of chastity, poverty and obedience. Here in the Cathedral Parish, we are blessed by the service of several Religious Sisters and are most grateful for them—Sister Mary Marta, RSM, Sister Mary Raphael, RSM, Sister Malyia Grace, RSM, and Sister Mary Luchia, PVMI. May the Lord bless all those in the Consecrated Life and lead many more men and women to profess publicly the evangelical counsels.

This Sunday, the annual Catholic Charities Appeal begins, Giving Hope to All. The Catholic Charities benefits countless groups, organizations, and agencies in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The appeal is primarily conducted through the mail but it is also possible to support the appeal through the Sunday Collection. Materials to do this will be at the entrances to the Basilica for the month of February. Our Cathedral Parish goal for the Catholic Charities is nearly 50,000 dollars. 

LENTEN SCHEDULE

The holy season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Holy Thursday with the celebration of the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. The Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. For catechumens, this takes place through the several stages of Christian initiation. For the faithful, this takes place through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices.

COLLECTION OF OLD BLESSED PALM

You are invited to bring your old blessed palm to church on Sunday, February 4 and Sunday, February 11. Please place it in the baskets near the sanctuary. This palm will be burned for the ashes for Ash Wednesday. You may also reverently dispose of your blessed palm by burning it and burying it at home.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT AND FASTING DURING LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as a minimal obligation, that all persons who are **fourteen years of age and older** are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. Keeping a voluntary fast throughout Lent is encouraged on the part of all.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

The description and schedule of the Lenten Rites for the Elect (catechumens) and Candidates for the Easter Sacraments will be announced in the Parish Bulletin all throughout Lent. These rites will take place at the **Saturday evening 5:15 PM Anticipated Mass** for Sunday and at the **Sunday 11:00 AM Solemn Mass**.
