Dear Parishioners,

*Today is the Second Sunday of Easter or the Sunday of Divine Mercy. We continue to celebrate our Lord's Resurrection from the dead this Sunday and every day until Pentecost Sunday, the conclusion of the fifty days of Easter. The Resurrection of our Lord is indeed an event that happened once in history but also happens now. The eternal Son of God went to the cross for us and so his death is eternal, present to everyone in every time. The same eternal Son of God was raised from the dead for us and so his resurrection is likewise eternal, present to everyone in every time. All that we hear about the Resurrection of Jesus in the Gospels, we hear with the ears of faith today, confident that the gifts given in history are given anew. Today, as the Gospel of John reveals, we receive the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of our sins. We follow the witness and example of Saint Thomas and believe Jesus is truly risen. Let us constantly profess our faith in the Risen Lord. Our faith in the Resurrection needs to be firm and comprehensive. Let us listen carefully these weeks of Easter Time to the prayers and the readings from Sacred Scripture at Sunday Mass to deepen our faith in the Resurrection. *Christ is risen! He is truly risen, Alleluia!**

Our celebration of the Sacred Paschal Triduum was a tremendous witness to our faith in the Risen Lord and a great service to our parishioners and so many visitors. I am so very grateful to all our parish priests, staff, liturgical ministers, employees, and volunteers, who provided countless hours of preparation and service to help celebrate Easter in such an extraordinary way this Easter Triduum.

We are very well schooled in keeping a good Lent. The Forty Days are marked by a seriousness to do personal penance and prepare for the renewal of our Baptism with Easter. Often, Easter Time does not receive the same seriousness when it comes to how we might observe it. I propose that, as with Lent, we need some personal engagement of Easter Time. Perhaps you might consider coming to Mass during the week with greater frequency, stopping by the Basilica or Chapel to spend some time in adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, or reading the Acts of the Apostles which describes the life of the early Christians after the Resurrection. Easter Time is a period of reflection on the Christian life. The grace of the Easter Sacraments - Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist - gives us the strength and power to live more fully the life of Christ and to be his witnesses among others. When we take the time to ponder the saving mystery of the Lord so generously shared with us, we find delight in his love and a desire to be even more faithful to his Gospel.

The next several weeks are very important for the success of our Parish Keys and Sword Event 2024. I invite our parishioners to ask among business associates and other institutions, especially restaurants, to consider an ad in our Ad Book. We depend on the success of the Keys and Sword Event to supplement the many significant needs of the Cathedral Basilica. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el segundo domingo de Pascua o el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Continuamos celebrando la Resurrección de nuestro Señor de entre los muertos este domingo y todos los días hasta el Domingo de Pentecostés, la conclusión de los cincuenta días de Pascua. La Resurrección de nuestro Señor es en verdad un evento que ocurrió una vez en la historia pero que también sucede ahora. El eterno Hijo de Dios fue a la cruz por nosotros y por eso su muerte es eterna, presente para todos en todo tiempo. El mismo Hijo eterno de Dios resucitó de entre los muertos por nosotros y por eso su resurrección es igualmente eterna, presente para todos en todo tiempo. Todo lo que escuchamos sobre la resurrección de Jesús en los evangelios, lo escuchamos hoy con los oídos de la fe, confiados en que los dones dados en la historia se vuelven a dar. Hoy, como revela el evangelio de Juan, recibimos el Espíritu Santo para el perdón de nuestros pecados. Seguimos el testimonio y el ejemplo de Santo Tomás y creemos que Jesús verdaderamente ha resucitado. Profesemos constantemente nuestra fe en el Señor Resucitado. Nuestra fe en la Resurrección debe ser firme y completa. Escuchemos atentamente en estas semanas del Tiempo Pascual las oraciones y lecturas de la Sagrada Escritura en la Misa dominical para profundizar nuestra fe en la Resurrección. *¡Cristo ha resucitado! ¡Ha resucitado verdaderamente, Aleluya!*

Nuestra celebración del Sagrado Triduo Pascual fue un tremendo testimonio de nuestra fe en el Señor Resucitado y un gran servicio para nuestros feligreses y tantos visitantes. Estoy muy agradecido a todos nuestros sacerdotes parroquiales, empleados, ministros litúrgicos, y voluntarios, que brindaron innumerables horas de preparación y servicio para ayudar a celebrar la Pascua de una manera tan extraordinaria en este Triduo Pascual.

Estamos muy bien educados para mantener una buena Cuaresma. Los Cuarenta Días están marcados por la seriedad de hacer penitencia personal y prepararnos a la renovación de nuestro Bautismo con la Pascua. A menudo, el tiempo de Pascua no recibe la misma seriedad en cuanto a cómo debemos observarlo. Propongo que, como ocurre con la Cuaresma, necesitemos algún compromiso personal con el tiempo pascual. Quizás podrías considerar venir a Misa durante la semana con mayor frecuencia, pasar por la Basílica o la Capilla para pasar un tiempo en adoración al Santísimo Sacramento, o leer los Hechos de los Apóstoles que describen la vida de los primeros cristianos después de la Resurrección. El Tiempo Pascual es un período de reflexión sobre la vida cristiana. La gracia de los Sacramentos Pascuales (Bautismo, Confirmación y Eucaristía) nos da la fuerza y el poder para vivir más plenamente la vida de Cristo y ser sus testigos entre otros. Cuando nos tomamos el tiempo para reflexionar sobre el misterio salvador del Señor que tan generosamente compartió con nosotros, encontramos deleite en su amor y el deseo de ser aún más fieles a su evangelio.

Las próximas semanas son muy importantes para el éxito de nuestro Evento Parroquial Llaves y Espadas 2024 «Keys and Sword por su nombre en inglés». Invito a nuestros feligreses a solicitar entre socios comerciales y otras instituciones, especialmente restaurantes, que consideren un anuncio en nuestro Libro de Anuncios. 
