

WALK WITH HIM | PRAY WITH HIM

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This annual observance is more popularly known as Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ. In the United States, to allow a greater participation of the faithful in this holy day, Corpus Christi takes place on a Sunday. In its origin it was established to be celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday. Holy Thursday is the day to commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist. The traditional Thursday celebration of Corpus Christi brings forward the Church's Faith in Christ's great gift to us of his Holy Body and Blood, given on the night before he died for us. With every Mass, when we celebrate the Sacrifice of the Lord and receive Holy Communion, we profess our common faith in the saving death and resurrection of Christ that takes place with Eucharist and that the same Christ is truly and completely present in the bread and wine that becomes his Body and Blood. So great a Mystery that is our privilege to celebrate with such frequency can become routine and even careless. Corpus Christi gives us a necessary pause to proclaim with even greater vigor what we believe and recall the need to celebrate the Eucharist and receive Holy Communion with renewed reverence and devotion.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us to enter always into the celebration of Mass as a divine event. Christ dies for us and rises for us. As Christ carries out this divine work from his place at the right hand of the Father in heaven for all eternity, so we - through the power of the Holy Spirit - encounter this same event here on earth with every Mass. This is why we must be alert to all the parts of the Mass and participate with Christian joy in this actual work of Christ. We are reminded today to be mindful in action and prayer of the real presence of Christ in the reserved hosts in the tabernacle. We genuflect in adoration before we enter our pew and when we leave our pew. We enter the Communion procession for the reception of Holy Communion if we have fasted from food and drink for an hour, are free from serious sin and believe with the Church that the bread and wine is truly the glorified Lord. Our manner of reception of Holy Communion - our bow beforehand, our consuming the host - is a public declaration of our corporate and interior love for this "wonderful Sacrament."

Throughout this week the Cathedral Basilica hosts our archdiocesan and private high schools to celebrate their Baccalaureate Masses. This is a wonderful opportunity to show these high school graduates our splendid Basilica and welcome them to the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Please keep these graduates in your prayers.

This Friday, June 7, 2024, is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In fact, June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion recalls for us the immediate and constant love of Jesus for each of us. If possible, plan to come to Mass on Friday at 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo. Esta celebración anual se conoce más popularmente como Corpus Christi, el Cuerpo de Cristo. En Estados Unidos, para permitir una mayor participación de los fieles en este día de precepto, el Corpus Christi se lleva a cabo en domingo. En su origen se estableció que se celebrara el jueves siguiente al Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad. El Jueves Santo es el día para conmemorar la Institución de la Sagrada Eucaristía. La tradicional celebración del jueves del Corpus Christi presenta la fe de la Iglesia en el gran regalo que nos ha hecho la Iglesia de su Santo Cuerpo y Sangre, dado la noche antes de que Él muriera por nosotros. Con cada Misa, cuando celebramos el Sacrificio del Señor y recibimos la Sagrada Comunión, profesamos nuestra fe común en la muerte y resurrección salvadora de Cristo que tiene lugar con la Eucaristía y que el mismo Cristo está verdadera y completamente presente en el pan y el vino, que se convierte en su Cuerpo y Sangre. Un Misterio tan grande que es nuestro privilegio celebrar con tanta frecuencia puede volverse rutinario y hasta descuidado. El Corpus Christi nos da una pausa necesaria para proclamar con aún mayor vigor lo que creemos y recordar la necesidad de celebrar la Eucaristía y recibir la Sagrada Comunión con renovada reverencia y devoción.

La Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo nos recuerda entrar siempre en la celebración de la Misa como un evento divino. Cristo muere por nosotros y resucita por nosotros. Así como Cristo lleva a cabo esta obra divina desde su lugar a la diestra del Padre en el cielo por toda la eternidad, así nosotros, a través del poder del Espíritu Santo, encontramos este mismo evento aquí en la tierra con cada Misa. Es por eso que debemos estar atentos a todas las partes de la Misa y participar con alegría cristiana en esta obra actual de Cristo. Hoy se nos recuerda que debemos ser conscientes en la acción y la oración de la presencia real de Cristo en las hostias reservadas en el tabernáculo. Nos arrodillamos en adoración antes de entrar a nuestro banco y cuando lo dejamos. Entramos en la procesión de la Comunión para recibir la Sagrada Comunión si hemos ayunado de comida y bebida durante una hora, estamos libres de pecados graves y creemos con la Iglesia que el pan y el vino es verdaderamente el Señor glorificado. Nuestra forma de recibir la Sagrada Comunión (nuestra reverencia previa, consumir la hostia) es una declaración pública de nuestro amor corporativo e interior por este "maravilloso Sacramento".

Durante toda esta semana la Catedral Basílica acoge a nuestras escuelas secundarias arquidiocesanas y privadas para celebrar sus Misas de Bachillerato. Esta es una maravillosa oportunidad para mostrarles a estos graduados de secundaria nuestra espléndida Basílica y darles la bienvenida a la Iglesia Madre de la Arquidiócesis de Filadelfia. Por favor mantenga a estos graduados en sus oraciones.

Este viernes 7 de junio del 2024 es la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. De hecho, junio es el mes del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Esta devoción nos recuerda el amor inmediato y constante de Jesús por cada uno de nosotros. Si es posible, planee venir a misa el viernes a las 7:15 AM o a las 12:05 PM en la Capilla de la Catedral.
