Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel today (see Mark 4: 26-34) Jesus offers us an understanding of the Kingdom of God, the living presence of God in our midst. The Kingdom of God is not a place but an encounter, an experience, with Almighty God - on earth and fully in heaven. It is our duty and responsibility to be open in mind and heart to live in the Kingdom of God with an attentiveness to the Word of God and the Way of Jesus, to avoid sin, and to live in God's grace. Since this Kingdom is God's, it knows no limit in filling us with all we need to worship him fully and live freely as his sons and daughters. All too often we choose to live in our own "world" and keep a distance from the Kingdom of God. Today, I encourage you to take some time and fix your eyes on the Lord and recommit to a renewed fidelity to him in every way and the pathway to the Kingdom is yours. This is our petition with every Our Father, "thy kingdom come."

Today, we observe Father's Day. As Catholics, today is an occasion to pray for our fathers, living or dead, during the celebration of Holy Mass. The vocation of fatherhood deserves renewed attention and respect. More and more studies indicate the powerful influence a father has on his children, especially when it comes to the living of the faith. Fatherhood has been diminished and needs to be relaunched with a regard for its dignity and purpose in the family and in society. Today as we pray for our fathers, let us also encourage fathers in their role and support them in their vocation to lead their children to Christ. *Happy Father's Day to all fathers!*

The location of our Cathedral Basilica and Chapel in the heart of Center City allows it to be a place of refuge for the homeless all throughout the day. We have a Christian duty to see the homeless men and women who spend time during the day in the Basilica and Chapel as our brothers and sisters in the Lord. At the same time, issues of safety and respect are also of equal concern. If you see any behavior that is not acceptable, please notify one of the priests or sacristans immediately. Pan handling in the church is forbidden and I ask you not to participate in this. Also, please be mindful not to leave your personal belongings behind in the pew at any time.

Religious Freedom Week 2024 begins with the Memorial of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, June 22, 2024, and will conclude on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, June 29, 2024. Religious Freedom Week is an invitation for all Catholics to reflect on the value of expressing our faith freely in society and to do whatever is possible to protect this freedom. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el undécimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En el evangelio de hoy (ver Marcos 4, 26-34) Jesús nos ofrece una comprensión del Reino de Dios, la presencia viva de Dios entre nosotros. El Reino de Dios no es un lugar sino un encuentro, una experiencia con Dios Todopoderoso, en la tierra y plenamente en el cielo. Es nuestro deber y responsabilidad estar abiertos de mente y corazón para vivir en el Reino de Dios con atención a la Palabra de Dios y al camino de Jesús, para evitar el pecado y vivir en la gracia de Dios. Dado que este reino es de Dios, no conoce límites para llenarnos con todo lo que necesitamos para adorarlo plenamente y vivir libremente como sus hijos e hijas. Con demasiada frecuencia elegimos vivir en nuestro propio “mundo” y mantenernos alejados del Reino de Dios. 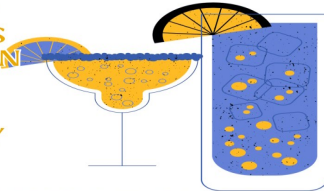
