#### A GIFT OF AN INDULGENCE FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL (JUNE 29) AND THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEDICATION OF THE CATHEDRAL (JUNE 30)

The liturgical calendar of our Cathedral Basilica gives the clergy and faithful the opportunity to receive the gift of a plenary or full indulgence on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul and the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral both of which we observe this weekend.

An indulgence obtains for us through power of the death and resurrection of Jesus the removal of the temporal punishment due to sin (the experience of purgatory) for ourselves or for a deceased loved one. To obtain an indulgence on both days, we must be intentional about all its parts and be in the state of grace--no attachment to sin. We must visit the Cathedral Basilica, pray the Creed and the Our Father--and this can happen alongside with participating in Holy Mass--receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation and Holy Communion on the day or several days before or after visiting the Cathedral Basilica as well as pray for the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary). Only one plenary indulgence can be obtained a day. One confession suffices for several plenary indulgences in the days before or after visiting the Cathedral Basilica.

On Thursday, July 4, 2024, Independence Day, Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 AM in the Cathedral Chapel. Following the 9:00 AM Mass on July Fourth, everyone is invited to join in praying the Holy Rosary for the intentions of our nation. The Basilica and the Parish Office will be closed on Independence Day.

This past Friday evening, we held our annual Keys and Sword Event. It was again a tremendous success for our Cathedral Parish. This annual event promotes a culture of financial support for the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia beyond the limits of our own parish community. The Cathedral Basilica serves the Archbishop, the whole Archdiocese and our parish. So, it is right that many be invited to provide financial support for her service to our local Church. I thank all of you who supported our Keys and Sword Event by attending the dinner on Friday evening, by a donation and/or by an ad in the Ad Book.

We continue to look for a part-time cook at the Cathedral Rectory for Tuesday through Thursday evenings. As I mentioned previously, our long-time faithful cook decided to step away from cooking and take on another type of work. I have tried various avenues to find a new cook but with no success. #### ARCHBISHOP PÉREZ ANNOUNCEMENT

Earlier this spring, it was a great joy for us to welcome three new auxiliary bishops in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Following the Episcopal Ordinations of Bishops Chylinski, Cooke, and Esmilla, Archbishop Pérez promised to share detailed information about their pastoral and administrative assignments.

#### **Pastoral Responsibilities**

Each bishop will be a visible presence in the parishes of his region, especially in making parish

visits, the celebration of Confirmation, and the installation of pastors, as well as presiding over the funeral rites of priests and deacons.

As of July 1, 2024, the Archdiocese will consist of four **Episcopal** 

Regions as outlined below.

- **Episcopal Region I (Delaware and Chester** Counties): Most Reverend John J. McIntyre
- **Episcopal Region II (Montgomery County):** Most Reverend Keith J. Chylinski
- **Episcopal Region III (Bucks County):** Most Reverend Christopher R. Cooke
- **Episcopal Region IV (City of Philadelphia):** Most Reverend Efren V. Esmilla

Together with Bishop Edward Deliman, Bishop Cooke will also take on pastoral responsibility for the Spanishspeaking Catholic community, which is spread over many parishes in all of the Episcopal Regions.

#### **Administrative Responsibilities**

Each auxiliary bishop is also entrusted to watch over and lead particular aspects of the life and ministry of the Archdiocese, working in my name and in close coordination with me. The areas of administrative oversight in which the auxiliary bishops will serve are:

- Oversight for the Ministry of Charity: Most Reverend John J. McIntyre
- **Oversight for the Ministry of Evangelization:** Most Reverend Efren V. Esmilla
- **Oversight for Ministry to Hispanic Catholics:** Most Reverend Christopher R. Cooke in conjunction with Most Reverend Edward M. Deliman
- **Oversight for the Ministry of Catholic Education:** Most Reverend Keith J. Chylinski

Bishop Chylinski will continue to serve as Rector of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary throughout the coming academic year. He will also retain oversight of the Redemptoris Mater Seminary and the Vocation Office to Diocesan Priesthood during that time.

Beginning in June 2025, a new Rector will lead the Seminary and Bishop Chylinski will assume oversight of the Office for Catholic Education, including elementary schools, secondary schools, and schools of special education. In that role, he will also maintain relationships with Catholic colleges and universities in our local Church.

In the interim, until next June, I will continue to oversee those aspects of the Ministry of Catholic Education with the cooperation of Father Philip Bochanski, Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia.
