Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus in the Gospel for this Sunday (see Mark 3, 20-35) identifies those most intimately related to him - “my mother and my brothers” - as the ones who do the will of his Father. We do the will of the Father of Jesus and our Father when we are obedient to his love and faithful in keeping his commandments. Jesus is the perfect example of this in his fidelity to the will of his Father to the point of giving up his life for us on the cross. This fidelity to the will of God keeps Satan at a distance from us and allows us to live truly as the sons and daughters of the Father and in communion with Jesus, our Savior and our Brother. We might ask ourselves today just how aware and committed am I to God’s will.

A farewell for Father Brandon Artman will take place next Sunday, June 16, 2024, after the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass in Drexel Hall. Everyone is invited to this reception! We again extend to Father Artman our prayers and gratitude for his priestly ministry here at the Cathedral Parish over this past year. His new assignment at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Morton, Pennsylvania, becomes effective Monday, June 17, 2024. Father Matthew Carrol, a Dominican Priest, will be Father Artman’s replacement beginning Monday, July 22, 2024. There are a few other changes to our parish staff that I will outline in next Sunday’s Parish Bulletin.

We need a part-time cook at the Cathedral Rectory for Tuesday through Thursday evenings. Our long-time faithful cook decided to step away from cooking and take on another type of work. I have tried various avenues to find a new cook but with no success. If you might be interested or know someone who is, please contact me directly at fr.dgill@archphila.org. Thank you!

Plans are now underway for the 2024-2025 Sacramental Preparation program for school age children here at the Cathedral Parish. A Note from Father Artman

Change: it is often a good and healthy thing, but it is rarely easy. Being a priest, I know that change is a necessary part of my life. Having dedicated my life to the service of God and His Church, and having made my promise of obedience to the Archbishop to serve where the Church needs my gifts and talents, I "knew what I was signing up for." But that doesn't necessarily make change easy.

It was formally announced on May 18, that effective June 17, Archbishop Pérez has appointed me the Parochial Administrator of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Morton, Delaware County. A Parochial Administrator has the same duties and scope of authority as a Pastor. In the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, a priest serving the first time as Pastor, is often appointed as Parochial Administrator for a time, before being named Pastor. My last weekend here at the Cathedral will be June 15 and 16, Father's Day Weekend.

After serving as Parochial Vicar here for only 1 year, my reassignment was unexpected, and it is bittersweet. However, I understand that the pastoral needs of the Archdiocese make this change of assignment necessary. I am grateful to Archbishop Pérez for his confidence in me to be the shepherd of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. I am also so very grateful to Father Gill, Monsignor Savinski, Father Bochanski, Father Welsh, Deacon Jesus... and all of you... for welcoming me, accompanying me, and teaching me so much over the past year. It's been a real pleasure to get to know all of you, and to live and serve here at the Cathedral Parish. I look forward to serving the people of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (lovingly known as OLPH), and continuing in the footsteps of Monsignor Savinski, who served as pastor there for 17 years before retiring in 2020. My new address is printed below.

Please pray for me, as well as for all the priests who are experiencing changes in their assignments, as we make these transitions. And please continue to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, and for the 3 men who were ordained priests for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia here in the Cathedral sanctuary this year. Know that you are in my prayers as well! May God bless you.
