



For the intentions of June Oliver

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! In the Gospel, the teaching of Jesus in the synagogue astonishes those listening. "What kind of wisdom has been given him?" (Mark 6: 2) At the same time, the same people who were astonished were also offended by his teaching. Thus, the Lord remarks, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." (Mark 6: 4) This dual reaction to the Word of the Lord might describe our own. Jesus is very attractive to many of us. His personality as it comes through the Scriptures, his outreach to sinners and the marginalized, and his never-failing expressions of mercy and compassion draw us to him. Yet, his absolute clarity about what it means to be his follower - to take up the cross, to keep the commandments and sin so more, may keep us at a distance from the one who is our Lord and Savior. As we reflect upon the Gospel today, let us ask ourselves this serious question. Do I follow the whole Christ, all that he teaches and entrusts to the Church to lead us to salvation? Or am I selective in what I make my own as taught by Jesus? As authentic followers of the Lord, there is no place to be selective when it comes to the Word of the Lord. In another part of the Scriptures, when some disciples found Jesus' teaching difficult and chose to walk away from him, he asked the Twelve Apostles if they also wanted to walk away from him. Peter responded for the Twelve, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe; we are convinced that your God's holy One." (John 6: 68-69) Every word uttered by Jesus leads all of us to heaven.

The sacred relics of the Martin Saints, Saint Therese, the Little Flower, and her parents, Saints Louis and Zelie Martin, return to the Cathedral Basilica. The beautiful reliquary and relics were a gift to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia at the time of the Magnificat celebration in 2013 and for these past ten-plus years were located at the Carmelite Monastery in Philadelphia for prayer and veneration. Now, they will be in the baptistry of the Basilica for prayer and veneration for our parishioners and many visitors. The Martin Saints remind all our families that they form the domestic church and have the duty to encourage one another in a truly Christian way of life. The feast day of Saints Louis and Zelie Martin is July 12. Holy Martin Saints, pray for us!

Plans are underway for our fall sessions for Christian Initiation of Adults. If you are interested in being a parish sponsor for one of our adult candidates, please contact me directly, fr:dgill@archphila.org. The parish sponsor does not need to be an expert in the knowledge of the Faith. Rather, the parish sponsor is someone who guides, who mentors, the candidate on the journey to follow Jesus faithfully in his Church.

Summer is a good time for some additional reading, especially some spiritual reading. I encourage you to read the life of a saint or a book on prayer. The US Catholic Bishops published a fine short piece, The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church (available in our Cathedral Shop). This booklet is a great refresher on the great gift to the Church of the Holy Eucharist.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the support of liturgical ministries in the Cathedral Parish. 

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

¡Hoy es el décimo cuarto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario! En el evangelio, la enseñanza de Jesús en la sinagoga sorprende a quienes la escuchan. "¿Donde aprendió este hombre tantas cosas?" (Marcos 6: 2) Al mismo tiempo, las mismas personas que estaban asombradas también se ofendieron por su enseñanza. Por eso, el Señor comenta: "Todos honran a un profeta, menos los de su tierra, sus parientes y los de su casa". (Marcos 6: 4) Esta doble reacción a la Palabra del Señor podría describir la nuestra. Jesús es muy atractivo para muchos de nosotros. Su personalidad tal como se expresa a través de las Escrituras, su acercamiento a los pecadores y los marginados, y sus infalibles expresiones de misericordia y compasión nos atraen hacia él. Sin embargo, su absoluta claridad sobre lo que significa ser su seguidor: tomar la cruz, guardar los mandamientos y no pecar más, puede mantenernos alejados de quien es nuestro Señor y Salvador. Al reflexionar hoy sobre el evangelio, planteémonos esta seria pregunta. ¿Sigo a Cristo en su totalidad, todo lo que él enseña y confía a la Iglesia para conducirnos a la salvación? ¿o soy selectivo en lo que hago mío según lo enseñó Jesús? Como auténticos seguidores del Señor, no hay lugar para ser selectivos cuando se trata de la Palabra del Señor. En otra parte de las escrituras, cuando algunos discípulos encontraron difícil la enseñanza de Jesús y decidieron alejarse de él, él preguntó a los doce apóstoles si ellos también querían alejarse de él. Pedro respondió por los doce: "Señor, ¿a quién iremos? Tú tienes las palabras de vida eterna. Hemos llegado a creer; estamos convencidos de que tu Dios es santo". (Juan 6: 68-69) Cada palabra pronunciada por Jesús nos lleva a todos al cielo.

Las sagradas reliquias de los Santos Martín, Santa Teresa, la Pequeña Flor, y sus padres, los Santos Luis y Celia Martín, regresan a la Catedral Basílica. El hermoso relicario y las reliquias fueron un regalo a la Arquidiócesis de Filadelfía en el momento de la celebración del Magnificat en 2013 y durante los últimos diez años estuvieron ubicados en el Monasterio Carmelita de Filadelfía para oración y veneración. Ahora, estarán en el baptisterio de la Basílica para oración y veneración por nuestros feligreses y muchos visitantes. Los Santos Martín recuerdan a todas nuestras familias que ellos forman la iglesia doméstica y tienen el deber de animarse unos a los otros en una forma de vida verdaderamente cristiana. La fiesta de los Santos Luis y Celia Martín es el 12 de julio. ¡Santos Martín, rueguen por nosotros!


