

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The Gospel of Mark is probably the oldest of the four Gospels and is the shortest. One of the features quickly noticed in this Gospel is the way the evangelist presents a radical and clear description of what it means to be a faithful follower of the Lord. Today's Gospel is an example of this (see Mark 10: 17-30). The man who encounters Jesus in the Gospel is rather satisfied he has kept the commandments throughout his life and thus is entitled to the promised eternal life. The Lord responds to the satisfied man that this is not enough for him to receive the reward of heaven. Rather, he must sell all that he has, give it to the poor and follow Jesus. It is very easy for many of us to coast along the Christian way. It seems as if we are doing our part but there is no real cost to our discipleship. The Lord wants an ever-deepening conversion to his Gospel. Yes, we are to be faithful to the commandments in all their parts. And, yes, we are to try at the same time to root out everything that in any way separates us from a complete fidelity to the Lord not only on the surface of our lives but more completely in our hearts and souls. This takes a regular examination of our Christian lives, evaluating its radicality and pledging to do more, to follow Jesus completely.

Next Sunday, October 20, 2024, is World Mission This yearly observance highlights our personal responsibility to be a missionary at home and to support the missionaries and missions here in the United States and abroad. We can support the missionaries and missions in so many ways. An important way is financially. Next week the second collection will be for the missions. This money will be distributed all throughout the world by our Archdiocesan Pontifical Mission Society for the Propagation of the Faith. We can also support the missionaries and missions by our prayers, especially praying the Holy Rosary for this intention. The 9:30 AM Mass next Sunday will be the Mission Sunday celebration. Also, Archbishop Perez will celebrate the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass, the White Mass, for the Philadelphia medical community. This Mass is typically celebrated close to the Feast of Saint Luke, October 18, the patron of physicians.

During this month, you will receive a mailing about the annual Parish Fall Collection (formerly known as the Block Collection) which asks for the financial support of all our parishioners. I appeal to you to be generous with this annual Parish Fall Collection. We need three times as much as we receive in our Sunday Collection each week to meet our financial responsibilities. The other needed monies come from donations like this Parish Fall Collection, the Basilica shrines, the wedding fees and a small grant from the Archdiocese. Typically, this collection brings between twenty-five and thirty thousand dollars to the Parish. Let's make our goal a fifty-thousand-dollar supplement to the operation fund from the annual Parish Fall Collection. Thank you so much!

I remind you that October is Respect Life Month and the Month of the Holy Rosary. When you pray the Rosary during these days, please remember the intention of respect for human life from the first moment of conception until natural death.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the national collection for the Missions. #### REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos feligreses,

¡Hoy es el vigésimo octavo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario! El evangelio de Marcos es probablemente el más antiguo de los cuatro evangelios y el más corto. Una de las características que se advierten rápidamente en este evangelio es la forma en que el evangelista presenta una descripción radical y clara de lo que significa ser un fiel seguidor del Señor. El evangelio de hoy es un ejemplo de esto (ver Marcos 10:17-30). El hombre que se encuentra con Jesús en el evangelio está más bien satisfecho de haber cumplido los mandamientos durante toda su vida y, por lo tanto, tiene derecho a la vida eterna prometida. El Señor le responde al hombre satisfecho que esto no le basta para recibir la recompensa del cielo. Más bien, debe vender todo lo que tiene, dárselo a los pobres y seguir a Jesús. Es muy fácil para muchos de nosotros seguir el camino cristiano sin hacer nada. Parece que estamos haciendo nuestra parte, pero no hay un costo real para nuestro discipulado. El Señor quiere una conversión cada vez más profunda a su evangelio. Sí, debemos ser fieles a los mandamientos en todas sus partes. Y, sí, debemos tratar al mismo tiempo de erradicar todo lo que de alguna manera nos separa de una fidelidad completa al Señor, no solo en la superficie de nuestras vidas, sino más completamente en nuestros corazones y almas. Esto requiere un examen regular de nuestra vida cristiana, evaluando su radicalidad y comprometiéndonos a hacer más, a seguir a Jesús completamente.

El próximo domingo, 20 de octubre del 2024, es la Misión Mundial. Esta celebración anual resalta nuestra responsabilidad personal de ser misioneros en casa y de apoyar a los misioneros y las misiones aquí en los Estados Unidos y en el extranjero. Podemos apoyar a los misioneros y las misiones de muchas maneras. Una forma importante es económicamente. La próxima semana la segunda colecta será para las misiones. Este dinero será distribuido en todo el mundo por nuestra Oficina Arquidiocesana para las Obras Misionales Pontificias para la Propagación de la Fe. También podemos apoyar a los misioneros y las misiones con nuestras oraciones, especialmente rezando el Santo Rosario por esta intención.
