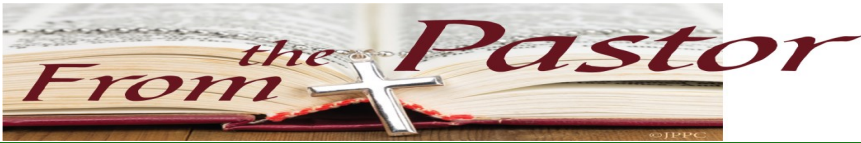

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Jesus continues to teach us about being his followers in today's Holy Gospel (see Mark 10: 35-45). The Evangelist has been leading us to this point of the teaching of Jesus in a gradual way over the last several Sundays. The Lord has invited us to be comprehensive and complete in our discipleship. In following Jesus there is no room for serious sin, our way of life must be rooted in his plan for life, and keeping the Commandments must run deeply in our souls. During the dispute among the disciples about who will sit on the right or left of him, Jesus seized the occasion to bring his teaching on discipleship to a significant next step. To follow Christ is to follow him to the Cross. His true baptism is the offering of his life on the Cross for the glory of the Father and for our salvation. He desires that all who are redeemed and saved by his Cross likewise share in this type of "baptism." His Cross empowers us also to give our lives, every part of our lives, over to him for the glory of the Father and for the service of one another. Every time we participate in Mass, the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, we receive the grace to share in the Cross of Christ.

The presence of the sacred remains of Saint Katharine Drexel in our Cathedral Basilica continues to bring many blessings, especially to the countless pilgrims who visit her tomb for her heavenly help. At the tomb of Saint Katharine Drexel, there are envelopes for our parishioners and visitors to list their intentions and donate to the Shrine. These intentions are especially remembered every Thursday in our perpetual Novena to Saint Katharine Drexel following the 7:15 AM and 12:05 PM Masses in the Cathedral Chapel. I am also grateful for the offerings that accompany these prayer requests. They contribute to the promotional development of the Shrine. I invite our parishioners to remember all those requests made at the Tomb of our Philadelphia Saint in their prayers as well, especially at Mass. *Saint Katharine Drexel, pray for us!*

Next Sunday, October 27, 2024, we will commemorate Saint Camilla Battista Varani at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass. You can learn more about Saint Camilla at <https://saintcamillavarani.com/>. Pope Benedict XVI canonized Saint Camilla on October 17, 2010. This commemoration of the anniversary of her canonization is an occasion to spread devotion to this Poor Clare Saint with many Philadelphia connections.

I remind you that October is Respect Life Month and the Month of the Holy Rosary. When you pray the Rosary during these days, please remember the intention of respect for human life from the first moment of conception until natural death.

¡Hoy es el vigésimo noveno domingo del Tiempo Ordinario! En el santo evangelio del día de hoy, Jesús continúa enseñándonos cómo ser sus seguidores (ver Marcos 10: 35-45). El evangelista nos ha ido guiando hasta este punto de la enseñanza de Jesús de manera gradual durante los últimos domingos. 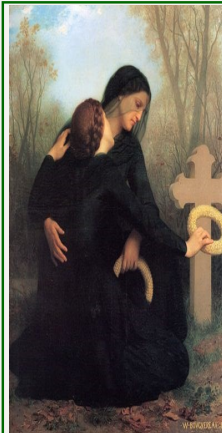

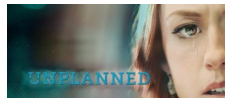
