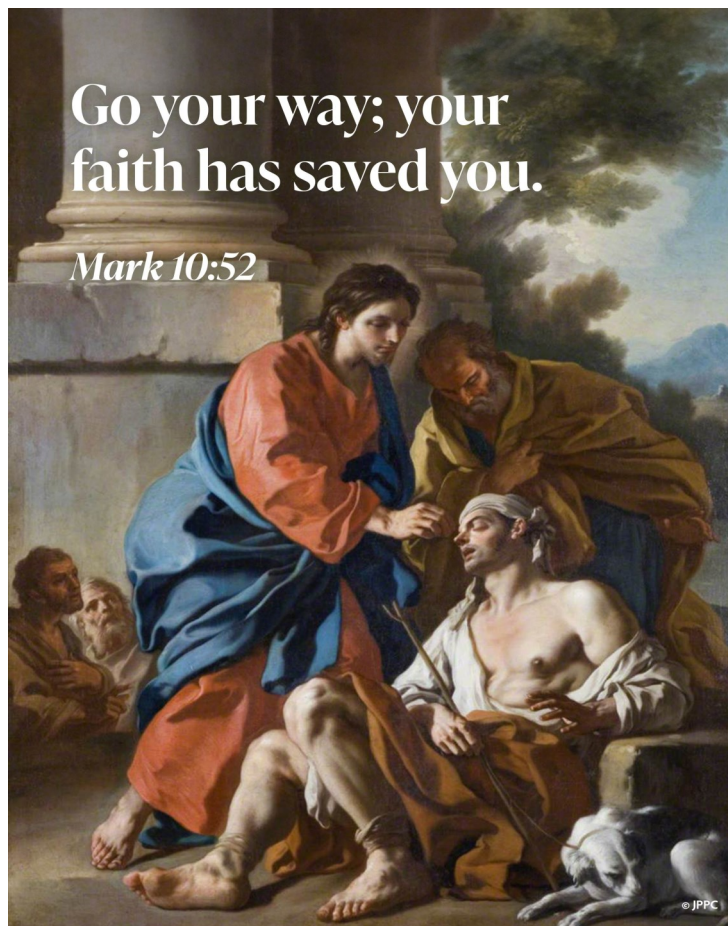

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. “Master, I want to see ((Mark 10; 51).” This is the plea of the blind man to Jesus in today’s Holy Gospel. Many of us are along the roadside of life with our worries and anxieties, our fears and doubts, about a great number of things. We ask many questions in the hope of answers that will reassure us and give us some peace. We ask these questions of the Lord and of ourselves. Is there something in the question of the blind man that may help us? He wants to see. His question is much larger than asking for the return of his sight. We know this from the response of Jesus. “Go your way; your faith has saved you (Mark 10: 52).” The blind man had a confidence in Jesus. He recognized in him the power to heal him. He desired to see with eyes filled with faith in the Lord. Our questions before the Lord - and yes there are many - and to trust the answers that come our way must be filled with the same faith in Jesus, to see with the eyes of faith. Like the blind man in the Gospel, when we see with the eyes of faith then we can more easily follow the Lord.

The month of November begins with two very important liturgical observances. Friday, November 1, 2024, is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. Saturday, November 2, 2024, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls’ Day). Please see elsewhere in the parish bulletin the Mass and Confession schedule for November 1 and 2, 2024.

All Saints, as a Holy Day of Obligation, requires us to participate in Mass and to conduct ourselves throughout the day as much as possible like a Sunday. For many, this Friday is a typical workday and therefore brings a challenge to observe the Holy Day as the Church intends. Yet, it is possible in most cases with some effort to rearrange schedules and to be mindful of all the saints, especially our patron saints, and their example and prayers for us as we strive to live in our own circumstances the Christian life. All Souls’ Day, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, reminds us of the spiritual work of mercy to pray for the dead. We remember the dead especially during the celebration of Mass. Our faith assures us of the power of Christ’s Sacrifice to aid the souls in Purgatory as they are purified for the glory of heaven. The All Souls Envelopes, listing the dead to be remembered this month at Mass, will be placed at the All Souls Altar in the Basilica. I encourage you to obtain a Memorial Candle for your beloved deceased to be placed at the All Souls Altar. Please see elsewhere in the parish bulletin the information about the Memorial Candles.

As a reminder, low gluten hosts for Holy Communion and listening devices for the hearing impaired are always available for those coming to Mass at the Cathedral Basilica. Please see the sacristan in the sacristy before Mass begins.

You should have received the Annual Parish Fall Collection letter in the mail. I thank you in advance for your generosity to our Cathedral Parish with this collection and all throughout the year.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Parish. 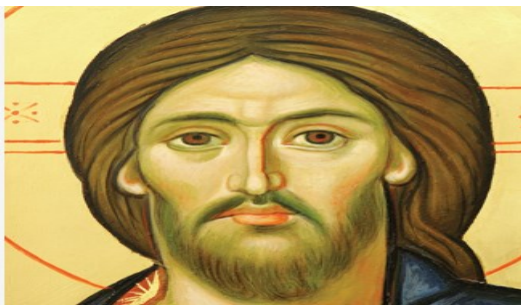

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos feligreses,

Hoy es el trigésimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. “Maestro, que pueda ver” (Mc 10, 51). Esta es la súplica del ciego a Jesús en el santo evangelio de hoy. Muchos de nosotros estamos en el camino de la vida con nuestras preocupaciones y angustias, nuestros miedos y dudas, sobre un gran número de cosas. Hacemos muchas preguntas con la esperanza de respuestas que nos tranquilicen y nos den un poco de paz. Hacemos estas preguntas al Señor y a nosotros mismos. ¿Hay algo en la pregunta del ciego que pueda ayudarnos? Él quiere ver. Su pregunta es mucho más grande que pedir el regreso de su vista. Lo sabemos por la respuesta de Jesús. “Vete, tu fe te ha salvado” (Mc 10, 52). El ciego tenía confianza en Jesús. Reconoció en Él el poder para sanarlo. Deseaba ver con los ojos llenos de fe en el Señor. Nuestras preguntas ante el Señor -y sí, hay muchas- y confiar en las respuestas que vienen a nuestro camino deben estar llenas de la misma fe en Jesús, ver con los ojos de la fe. Como el ciego en el evangelio, cuando vemos con los ojos de la fe, entonces podemos seguir al Señor más fácilmente.

El mes de noviembre comienza con dos celebraciones litúrgicas muy importantes. El viernes 1 de noviembre del 2024 es la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos, un Día de Precepto. El sábado 2 de noviembre del 2024 es la Conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos (Día de los Fieles Difuntos). Por favor, vea en otra parte del boletín parroquial el horario de Misas y Confesiones para el 1 y 2 de noviembre del 2024.

Todos los Santos, como Día de Precepto, requiere que participemos en la Misa y nos comportemos durante todo el día tanto como sea posible como un domingo. Para muchos, este viernes es un día laboral típico y, por lo tanto, representa un desafío observar el día de precepto como lo pretende la Iglesia. Sin embargo, es posible en la mayoría de los casos con un poco de esfuerzo reorganizar los horarios y ser conscientes de todos los santos, especialmente nuestros santos patronos, y su ejemplo y oraciones por nosotros mientras nos esforzamos por vivir en nuestras propias circunstancias la vida cristiana. *El Día de los Fieles Difuntos, la Conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos, nos recuerda la obra espiritual de misericordia de orar por los muertos.* Recordamos a los muertos especialmente durante la celebración de la Misa. Nuestra fe nos asegura el poder del Sacrificio de Cristo para ayudar a las Almas del Purgatorio mientras se purifican para la gloria del cielo. Los Sobres de los Fieles Difuntos, que enumeran a los muertos que se recordarán este mes en la Misa, se colocarán en el Altar de los Fieles Difuntos en la Basílica. Te animo a que obtengas una Vela Memorial para tu ser querido fallecido para colocarla en el Altar de los Fieles Difuntos. Consulta en otra parte del boletín parroquial la información sobre las Velas Memoriales.

Como recordatorio, las hostias bajas en gluten para la Sagrada Comunión y los dispositivos de escucha para personas con problemas de audición siempre están disponibles para quienes asisten a Misa en la Basílica Catedral. Consulta al sacristán en la sacristía antes de que comience la Misa.

Deberías de haber recibido la carta de la Colecta Anual de Otoño de la Parroquia por correo. Les agradezco de antemano su generosidad con nuestra Parroquia de la Catedral con esta colecta y durante todo el año.

La segunda colecta del próximo domingo estará dirigida a los pobres y necesitados del vecindario de la parroquia de la catedral. 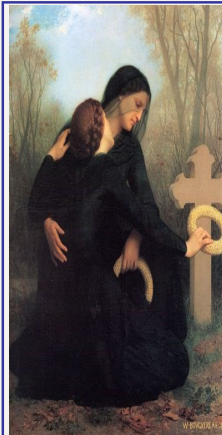
