Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! Marriage is a Sacrament. The coming together of a man and woman in Christ is a visible sign of Christ's love for all of us. This love was expressed in the fullest possible way when Jesus gave up his life for us on the cross with a love that is forever, faithful and filled with life and grace. Thus, when a man and woman stand before the altar and exchange their consent - give themselves over to each other as Christ gave himself over for us on the Cross - they likewise are to love in a way that is forever, faithful and filled with life and grace. This is how marriage is a Sacrament. We hear in today's Holy Gospel a clear and unambiguous teaching from Jesus about marriage. He recalls the plan of the divine Creator that marriage is between a man and woman and is an unbreakable union. Jesus lifts this human coming together to be a very sign of his divine love for us. As with all the teachings of Jesus in the New Testament and passed on to us through the Church, this teaching is part of the "whole package" of the Gospel. To reject the Lord's teaching on marriage is to reject the Lord and then everything else he teaches us for our salvation, our life with him in heaven. Today, the living out of the Sacrament of Marriage as intended by Christ is in great peril. Many baptized Christians live together without the benefit of the Sacrament of Marriage. Many marry outside of Christ and his Church. Marriage is being redefined constantly in our time to mean many things not found in the Word of God. Many married Christians do not invest in the spiritual aspects of their lives together. I encourage you to read today's Gospel again, Mark 10: 2-16, and reflect on it. Let us be bearers of the good news about marriage, especially for our family members and friends.

October is Respect Life Month and today is Respect Life Sunday. Not everyone in the same way can participate in the many public and political opportunities to demonstrate a positive position on respect for human life from the first moment of conception until natural death. However, every one of us can pray for the intention of respect for all human life. Respect Life Month raises our awareness to do just this, to pray for life and especially its legal protection in our land. This intention will be especially remembered in the Sunday Universal Prayer during the month of October.

October is also the month of the Holy Rosary. The liturgical Memorial of the Holy Rosary is Monday, October 7, 2024. We will pray the Holy Rosary together before the 7:15 AM and 12:05 PM Masses on that day. Of course, everyone is welcome. When you pray your Rosary at home or on the way to work, let us remember one another but especially the intention to recover the sacredness of human life during the month of October.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to support the landscape needs of the Cathedral Parish. Queridos feligreses,

¡Hoy es el vigésimo séptimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario! El matrimonio es un sacramento. La unión de un hombre y una mujer en Cristo es un signo visible del amor de Cristo por todos nosotros. Este amor se expresó de la manera más plena posible cuando Jesús entregó su vida por nosotros en la cruz con un amor que es eterno, fiel y lleno de vida y gracia. Por lo tanto, cuando un hombre y una mujer están ante el altar e intercambian su consentimiento, entregándose el uno al otro como Cristo se entregó por nosotros en la cruz, también deben amarse de una manera eterna, fiel y llena de vida y gracia. Así es como el matrimonio es un sacramento. En el santo evangelio de hoy escuchamos una enseñanza clara e inequívoca de Jesús sobre el matrimonio. 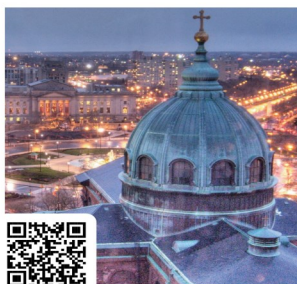
