Dear Parishioners,

Today in the United States we celebrate the great Christmas Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The traditional observance of this Christmas feast is January 6th but, in those countries, where the Epiphany is not celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation it is transferred to the nearest Sunday. Christmas continues with the Epiphany of Jesus. Some people even refer to the Epiphany as “Little Christmas.” The Epiphany of the Lord along with the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) are the principal observances of Christmas Time. The Nativity celebrates the mystery of the Lord’s Birth, and the Epiphany celebrates the announcement and promises of salvation with this Birth. We learn from the Epiphany Gospel that once the Three Kings—the Magi—encounter the Infant Savior “they departed for their country by another way.” Our own celebration of the Birth of Jesus on Christmas Day and the days of Christmas Time are meant to impact us in so many ways—in our relationship with the Lord, the manner of our Christian lives, and our outreach to others. Perhaps, today’s celebration of the Epiphany gives us a pause to reflect on just how our Christmas celebration has made a difference in us for this New Year. Are we returning to our everyday life “by another way?”

Traditionally, the New Year is an occasion for making resolutions. Often these resolutions focus on how to improve our health and circumstances of life. May I suggest that among these well-intended resolutions, there might be some spiritual resolutions as well. Consider the decision to spend serious time in prayer each day, in the early morning and/or before retiring to bed. Daily Mass makes a fine resolution and a sure way to focus on the Lord each day. Commit to a more regular practice of Confession. Pray the Holy Rosary more frequently. Read a book about a saint or one of the great spiritual classics. Do something for the poor each month of the New Year. This is just a brief list of some spiritual resolutions to which you could add others. The New Year gives us the opportunity to be fit in mind, body, and soul!

I thank Mr. Christopher Dinan, the Funeral Director of the Dinan Funeral Home on Spring Garden Street, Philadelphia, on behalf of the Cathedral Parish. Mr. Dinan generously donated the 2025 Parish Calendars distributed last month to our parishioners and visitors.

The location of our Cathedral Basilica and Chapel in the heart of Center City allows it to be a place of refuge for the homeless all throughout the day. We have a Christian duty to see the homeless men and women who spend time during the day in the Basilica and Chapel as our brothers and sisters in the Lord. At the same time, issues of safety and respect are also of equal concern. If you see any behavior that is not acceptable, please notify one of the priests or sacristans immediately. Panhandling in the church is forbidden and I ask you not to participate in this. **Also, please be mindful not to leave your personal belongings behind in the pew at any time.**

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish this Christmas Time. Your support of the Parish and its many ministries is overwhelming. The second collection next Sunday will be directed for the support of liturgical ministries in the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL RECTOR

Queridos feligreses,

Hoy en los Estados Unidos celebramos la gran solemnidad navideña de la Epifanía del Señor. La celebración tradicional de esta fiesta navideña es el 6 de enero, pero en aquellos países donde la Epifanía no se celebra como día de precepto se traslada al domingo más cercano. La Navidad continúa con la Epifanía de Jesús. Algunas personas incluso se refieren a la Epifanía como “Pequeña Navidad”. La Epifanía del Señor junto con el Nacimiento del Señor (Navidad) son las principales celebraciones del tiempo de Navidad. La Natividad celebra el misterio del Nacimiento del Señor y la Epifanía celebra el anuncio y las promesas de salvación con este nacimiento. Aprendemos del evangelio de la Epifanía que una vez que los Reyes Magos se encontraron con el Niño Salvador, “se fueron a su país por otro camino”. Nuestra propia celebración del nacimiento de Jesús el día de Navidad y los días de Navidad tienen el propósito de impactarnos de muchas maneras: en nuestra relación con el Señor, en la manera de vivir nuestra vida cristiana y en nuestro acercamiento a los demás. Tal vez la celebración de la Epifanía de hoy nos dé una pausa para reflexionar sobre cómo nuestra celebración navideña ha marcado una diferencia en nosotros para este Año Nuevo. ¿Estamos volviendo a nuestra vida cotidiana “por otro camino”?

Tradicionalmente, el Año Nuevo es la ocasión para hacer propósitos. A menudo, estos propósitos se centran en cómo mejorar nuestra salud y nuestras circunstancias de vida. Me permito sugerir que entre estos propósitos bien intencionados también puede haber algunos propósitos espirituales. Considere la decisión de pasar un tiempo serio en oración cada día, temprano en la mañana y/o antes de acostarse. La Misa diaria es un buen propósito y una manera segura de enfocarnos en el Señor cada día. Comprométase a practicar la Confesión con más regularidad. Rece el Santo Rosario con más frecuencia. Lea un libro sobre un santo o uno de los grandes clásicos espirituales. Haga algo por los pobres cada mes del Año Nuevo. Esta es solo una breve lista de algunas resoluciones espirituales a las que se pueden agregar otras. ¡El Año Nuevo nos brinda la oportunidad de estar en forma en mente, cuerpo y alma!

Agradezco al Sr. Christopher Dinan, Director de la Funeraria de la Funeraria Dinan en Spring Garden Street, Filadelfia, en nombre de la Parroquia Catedral. El Sr. Dinan donó generosamente los Calendarios Parroquiales 2025 distribuidos el mes pasado a nuestros feligreses y visitantes.

La ubicación de nuestra Catedral Basílica y Capilla en el corazón del centro de la ciudad le permite ser un lugar de refugio para las personas sin hogar durante todo el día. Tenemos el deber cristiano de ver a los hombres y mujeres sin hogar que pasan tiempo durante el día en la Basílica y la Capilla como nuestros hermanos y hermanas en el Señor. Al mismo tiempo, las cuestiones de seguridad y respeto también son de igual preocupación. Si ve algún comportamiento que no sea aceptable, notifique a uno de los sacerdotes o sacristanes de inmediato. Está prohibido pedir limosna en la iglesia y le pido que no participe en esto. **Además, tenga en cuenta que no debe dejar sus pertenencias personales en el banco en ningún momento.**

Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad con la Parroquia de la Catedral en esta época navideña. Su apoyo a la parroquia y sus muchos ministerios es abrumador. La segunda colecta del próximo domingo se destinará al apoyo de los ministerios litúrgicos en la parroquia de la catedral.
