Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday! This Sunday invites us to rejoice in the nearness of the celebration of the Lord's Birth. In fact, the nickname for this Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, comes from the first word of the Latin for the Entrance Chant which is "Rejoice" in English. We rejoice for many reasons, old and new. The rejoicing refers to the end of the long night of darkness for the people of old who waited for generations for the promise of the Savior to be fulfilled. It also refers to our rejoicing that Christ was born in history and came among us as one like us in all things but sin. And, more immediately, this rejoicing is personal. Soon, the Infant Savior will be born among us anew. With a devout Advent well observed, the Lord comes to us this Christmas, in our hearts, in the Church and in the world. As quickly and sincerely as we rejoice this Sunday, we must be reminded it is still Advent. There are still many days remaining to prepare for Christmas and, in fact, there is one more week of this holy time.

This Tuesday, December 17, 2024, marks a distinct period in Advent. Since the First Sunday of Advent, the prayers and readings of the Sacred Liturgy guided us to recall the coming of Christ in a more generic way—at the end of time and in our lives. With the 17th each year, Advent takes a turn and recalls in a specific way the historic coming of Christ leading to his Birth in Bethlehem. These days are intended to keep our focus more directly on the great event of the Nativity. I suggest that you observe these special days in a few different ways. Perhaps, you could go on-line and meditatively read the Gospel for each of these days, come to daily Mass, pray with Mary her Holy Rosary reflecting on the Joyful Mysteries and/or spend some time in the Cathedral before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. These days more so than the first part of Advent invite Christians to a devout and joyful anticipation of Christmas. Certainly, a good Advent Confession is a fine way to keep these days of late Advent.

2025 marks a Jubilee Year for the Universal Church. The Jubilee Year opens in Rome on Christmas Eve, December 24, 2024, and in the rest of the world on Holy Family Sunday, December 29, 2024. Pope Francis invites us to be "Pilgrims of Hope" during this Jubilee Year as we thank almighty God for all his many blessings and also seek the forgiveness of our sins. Everyone is welcome to the opening of the Jubilee Year that will take place in the Archdiocese on Holy Family Sunday at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass. The rites for this celebration have the faithful first assembled in Sister Cities Park and then after venerating the Jubilee Cross are led into the Cathedral Basilica by the Archbishop. The Mass will begin with a remembrance of Baptism when our pilgrimage with Christ began and now continues with his grace through this life into the next. The Jubilee Cross will remain in the sanctuary of the Cathedral Basilica throughout the Jubilee Year as a reminder that the crucified Lord is our Way on this pilgrimage of hope, hope in him and in his Word.

The Giving Tree has been most successful again this year. Many children and adults will benefit from the generosity of those who provided gifts. If you still have a gift to return, you can bring it this week to the Cathedral Parish Office.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the support of the young adult ministries in the Cathedral Parish. Queridos feligreses,

¡Hoy es el tercer domingo de Adviento, el domingo de Gaudete! Este domingo nos invita a regocijarnos por la proximidad de la celebración del nacimiento del Señor. De hecho, el sobrenombre de este domingo, domingo de Gaudete, proviene de la primera palabra del latín para el canto de entrada, que en español es “Alégrese”. Nos regocijamos por muchas razones, antiguas y nuevas. El regocijo se refiere al final de la larga noche de oscuridad para los pueblos de antaño que esperaron durante generaciones el cumplimiento de la promesa del Salvador. También se refiere a nuestro regocijo porque Cristo nació en la historia y vino entre nosotros como uno como nosotros en todo, excepto en el pecado. Y, más inmediatamente, este regocijo es personal. Pronto, el Niño Salvador nacerá de nuevo entre nosotros. Con un Adviento devoto y bien observado, el Señor viene a nosotros esta Navidad, a nuestros corazones, a la Iglesia y al mundo. Tan pronto como nos alegramos sinceramente de este domingo, debemos recordar que todavía es Adviento. Todavía quedan muchos días para prepararnos para la Navidad y, de hecho, hay una semana más de este tiempo sagrado.

Este martes 17 de diciembre del 2024, marca un período distinto en Adviento. Desde el primer domingo de Adviento, las oraciones y lecturas de la Sagrada Liturgia nos guiaron a recordar la venida de Cristo de una manera más genérica: al final de los tiempos y en nuestras vidas. Con el día 17 de cada año, el Adviento da un giro y recuerda de una manera específica la venida histórica de Cristo que conduce a su nacimiento en Belén. Estos días tienen como objetivo mantener nuestra atención más directamente en el gran evento de la Natividad. Sugiero que observes estos días especiales de diferentes maneras. Tal vez, podría conectarse a Internet y leer meditativamente el evangelio de cada uno de estos días, asistir a la Misa diaria, rezar con María su Santo Rosario reflexionando sobre los Misterios Gozosos y/o pasar algún tiempo en la Catedral ante nuestro Señor en el Santísimo Sacramento. Estos días, más que la primera parte del Adviento, invitan a los cristianos a una devota y alegre anticipación de la Navidad. Sin duda, una buena Confesión de Adviento es una buena manera de celebrar estos últimos días de Adviento.

El año 2025 marca un Año Jubilar para la Iglesia Universal. El Año Jubilar se inaugura en Roma en la víspera de Navidad, el 24 de diciembre del 2024, y en el resto del mundo el Domingo de la Sagrada Familia, el 29 de diciembre del 2024. El Papa Francisco nos invita a ser “peregrinos de la esperanza” durante este Año Jubilar mientras agradecemos a Dios todopoderoso por todas sus muchas bendiciones y también buscamos el perdón de nuestros pecados. Todos están invitados a la apertura del Año Jubilar que se llevará a cabo en la Arquidiócesis el Domingo de la Sagrada Familia en la Misa Solemne de las 11:00 AM. Los ritos para esta celebración tienen a los fieles reunidos primero en el Parque de las Ciudades Hermanas «*Sister Cities Park por su nombre en inglés*» y luego, después de venerar la Cruz del Jubileo, son conducidos a la Catedral Basílica por el Arzobispo. La Misa comenzará con un recuerdo del Bautismo, cuando comenzó nuestra peregrinación con Cristo y ahora continúa con su gracia a través de esta vida hacia la próxima. La Cruz del Jubileo permanecerá en el santuario de la Catedral Basílica durante todo el Año Jubilar como un recordatorio de que el Señor crucificado es nuestro Camino en esta peregrinación de esperanza, esperanza en él y en su Palabra.

El Árbol de la Donaciones «The Giving Tree por su nombre en inglés» ha tenido mucho éxito nuevamente este año. Muchos niños y adultos se beneficiarán de la generosidad de quienes proporcionaron obsequios. Gracias a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su bondad y generosidad hacia la Parroquia de la Catedral.
