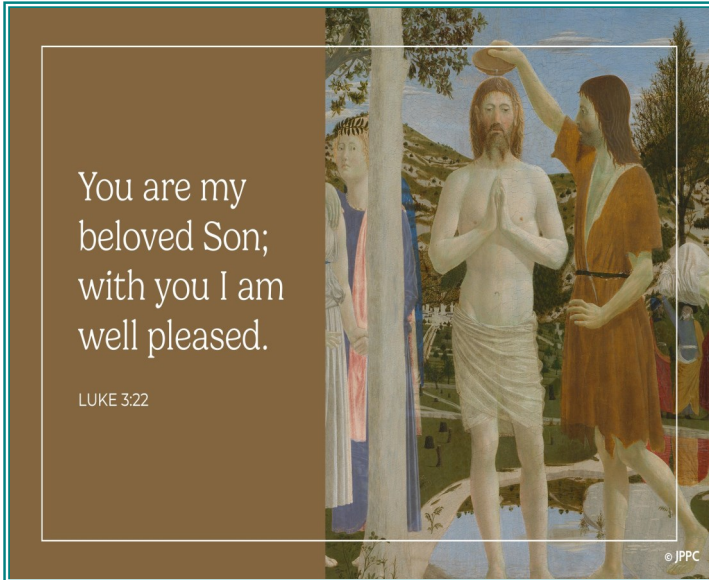

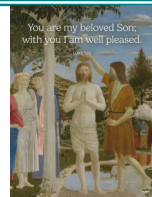

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the liturgical conclusion to Christmas Time. The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River continues the Epiphany revelation of the Lord as our Savior and Redeemer. The optional Collect for Mass this Sunday states, “grant, we pray, that we may be inwardly transformed through him whom we recognize as outwardly like ourselves.” The Epiphany and Baptism of Christ present to us anew the one who shares our humanity and shares with us his divinity. This marvelous exchange again gives us the hope and grace that we can truly be like Christ in all things. Our Christian duty is to be like Christ in all that we are and do. This is how we worship God with our lives and join the Lord in his saving and redeeming work in our own time. Let us pray with the Church that we may be transformed by our celebration of the Christmas feasts.

The celebrations of Christmas here at the Cathedral Basilica have been so very beautiful and spiritually uplifting these past several weeks. The high point of our celebrations was the Solemnities of Christmas and Epiphany. I am so very grateful to our clergy, staff, and volunteers who contributed so much to prepare for the Christmas holy days. I am especially grateful to all our liturgical ministers who are generous with their time year-round and much more so for the Masses of Christmas Time. I thank all our parishioners and visitors who were so very generous in your response to the offertory collections for Christmas Time. These collections represent a significant offering on your part and a tremendous gift to the operational needs of the Cathedral Parish. Once again, many parishioners generously assisted with their donations for the Christmas decorations and flowers. Thank you very much!

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins Saturday, January 18, and continues until January 25, 2025, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. Many of us know many people, often members of our own families, who are baptized Christians but not Catholics. The Sacrament of Baptism—with water and the use of the Trinitarian formula given in Sacred Scripture—unites all Christians in the promises of Christ for salvation and redemption, with the grace to hear his word, to be faithful to his way of life, and to have the hope for heaven. However, the unity Christ desires for all the baptized goes deeper and is more profound. It is a unity in the Truth he teaches us in Sacred Scripture and through the Church. This is a unity that displaces confusion on moral issues among Christians and reaches its climax with an authentic and unambiguous understanding of the Holy Eucharist. This is the unity for which we pray during this week of prayer. Please make this one of your daily prayer intentions from January 18 through to January 25.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish this Christmas Time. Your support of the Parish and its many ministries is overwhelming. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the religious education programs in the Cathedral Parish.
