




Dear Parishioners,

This is the Fourth Sunday of Lent! This Sunday is also referred to as Laetare Sunday, its Latin title. Laetare is the first word of the Introit (Entrance Chant) for this Sunday and means "rejoice". We rejoice this Sunday not because Lent has passed the halfway mark but, more importantly, because the joy of celebrating Easter is so much nearer. As we rejoice that soon our Lenten journey will come to an end with the great celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord, let us also resolve to keep even more vigilantly the discipline of Lent until Easter. The Holy Gospel for this Sunday, the return of the Prodigal Son to his Father, reminds all of us of our need to make a good Lenten Confession. If you have not taken the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation this Lent, plan now when that will take place over these next three weeks. Perhaps you also might consider—if you are not doing so already—coming to Mass during the week, spending some time in adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, reading the Sacred Scriptures, and making the Stations of the Cross during these remaining weeks of Lent. Yes, Easter is near. However, let us not coast through the valuable days of Lent that remain to prepare us for Easter.

This Wednesday, April 2, 2025, the Cathedral Basilica will be open from 7:00 to 9:00 PM with several priests available for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Confessions will be heard in English and Spanish. Please take advantage of this opportunity for a good Lenten Confession in preparation for Easter. Also, please spread the word about this Wednesday evening for Confessions.

You are reminded that it is our Christian duty to provide for the Sacraments for those in danger of death, especially with the reception of the last Holy Communion, Holy Viaticum. In fact, it is a Precept of the Church to receive Holy Viaticum. Please call on the priests to minister to anyone who is seriously ill, especially nearing the end of life. It is best to make this contact with the parish priests while someone is still conscious and able to participate in the celebration of the Sacraments. As March concludes, the month of Saint Joseph, we recall he is the patron of a happy death. Let us pray to him that each of us will have the blessing of a sacramental death when the Lord calls us to our heavenly homeland.

In a short time, an invitation to the Keys and Sword Event 2025 will be sent to all our registered parishioners. A similar invitation will also be sent to friends of the Cathedral Parish throughout the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The event is the principal fund-raiser for the Cathedral Parish. It includes opportunities to support the Cathedral Parish through the purchase of ads for the Ad Book, sponsoring the event through a financial contribution, and/or the purchase of tickets for the event itself. The Keys and Sword Event 2025 will take place on Friday, June 27, 2025, at the Logan Hotel. Plan now to attend this wonderful celebration of the Cathedral Parish.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish and to the Annual Catholic Charities Appeal. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the national collection for the Church in Eastern Europe. ¡Este es el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma! Este domingo es también conocido como Domingo de Laetare, en su título en latín. Laetare es la primera palabra del Introito (Canto de Entrada) de este domingo y significa "alégrate". Nos regocijamos este domingo no porque haya pasado la mitad de la Cuaresma, sino, sino, más importante aún, porque la alegría de celebrar la Pascua está mucho más cerca. Mientras nos regocijamos de que pronto nuestro camino cuaresmal llegará a su fin con la gran celebración de la Resurrección del Señor, decidámonos también mantener aún más vigilantemente la disciplina de la Cuaresma hasta la Pascua. EVANGELIZATION

LENT-4TH SUNDAY OF LENT

Having reflected upon prayer and fasting, let's now look briefly at almsgiving. Almsgiving is, as the name says, giving alms (money, clothes, etc.) to those in need. When you read the Bible, it is amazing the power that is attributed to almsgiving. For example:

Tobit 12:8-9- "Almsgiving with righteousness is better than wealth with wickedness. It is better to give alms than to store up gold, for almsgiving saves from death, and purges all sin. Those who give alms will enjoy a full life."

Proverbs 19:17- "Whoever cares for the poor lends to the LORD, who will pay back the sum in full."

Luke 11:41- "But as to what is within, give alms, and be hold, everything will be clean for you."

Why does almsgiving have such power? Perhaps because giving alms makes us in a particular way like unto God. Recall that God is perfect and complete in Himself; He does not need to create, nor does He need anyone or anything in creation. But He is generous and wants to give of His love to others, and so He creates simply so that He can have others on which to bestow His love. Creation does not benefit God at all; only creatures benefit from it. Almsgiving is similar: when we give alms, we do not directly benefit (in fact, quite the opposite: if we get something back from the person/group, it's not really almsgiving). We give generously without expecting anything back, just as God creates without expecting anything in return. Now, we should give God thanks for creating us, just as those whom we help should thank us. But regardless of whether that thanks comes; almsgiving and creation are both gratuitous outpourings of self for the sake of the other. And for us, that pouring out of ourselves opens our hearts to God's grace, drawing us away from our sins and closer to God.

Does this mean that we have to give money to every person who asks it of us? No. Just as we can misuse the gifts God gives us in creation, so those in need can misuse money to purchase drugs, alcohol, etc. We should, then, be prudent in our almsgiving (e.g., buying food for a person instead of just giving them cash), but not let an overabundance of prudence keep us from giving alms at all.

As we enter into this second half of Lent, may our Lord continue to guide your fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, that you might continue to grow in holiness as Easter draws ever closer.




