

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This annual observance is more popularly known as *Corpus Christi*, the Body of Christ. In the United States, to allow a greater participation of the faithful in this holy day, *Corpus Christi* takes place on a Sunday. In its origin it was established to be celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday. Holy Thursday is the day to commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist. And so, the Thursday celebration of *Corpus Christi* brings forward the Church’s Faith in Christ’s great gift to us of his Holy Body and Blood, given on the night before he died for us. Every Sunday, when we celebrate the Sacrifice of the Lord and receive Holy Communion, we profess our common faith in the saving death and resurrection of Christ that takes place with the Eucharist and that the same Christ is truly and completely present in the bread and wine that becomes his Body and Blood. This great Mystery celebrated so frequently can become routine and even careless. *Corpus Christi* gives us a necessary pause to proclaim with even greater vigor what we believe and recalls the need to celebrate the Eucharist and receive Holy Communion with renewed reverence and devotion.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us to always enter the celebration of Mass as a divine event. Christ dies for us and rises for us. As Christ carries out this divine work from his place at the right hand of the Father in heaven for all eternity, so we—through the power of the Holy Spirit—encounter this same event here on earth with every Mass. This is why we must be alert to all the parts of the Mass and participate with Christian joy in this actual work of Christ. We are reminded today to be mindful in action and prayer of the real presence of Christ in the reserved hosts in the tabernacle. We genuflect in adoration before we enter our pew and when we leave our pew. We enter the Communion procession for the reception of Holy Communion if we have fasted from food and drink for an hour, are free from serious sin and believe with the Church that the bread and wine is truly the glorified Lord. Our manner of reception of Holy Communion—our bow beforehand, our consuming the host—is a public declaration of our corporate and interior love for this “wonderful Sacrament.”

Religious Freedom Week 2025 begins today, June 22, with the Liturgical Memorial of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, and will conclude on June 29, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. This week is an invitation for all Catholics to reflect on the value of our freedom to express our faith freely in society and to do whatever is possible to protect this freedom. This Friday, June 27, 2025, is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In fact, June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion recalls for us the immediate and constant love of Jesus for each of us. If possible, plan to come to Mass on Friday at 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

Next Sunday, June 29, 2025, is the Solemnity of the Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles. This is our patronal feast, and the Solemnity will be observed at all the Sunday Masses, including the Anticipated Mass. *Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us!*

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish and to the Annual Catholic Charities Appeal. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to special maintenance projects of the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Esta celebración anual se conoce popularmente como Corpus Christi, el Cuerpo de Cristo. En Estados Unidos, para permitir una mayor participación de los fieles en esta festividad, el *Corpus Christi* se celebra en domingo. En sus orígenes, se estableció para celebrarse el jueves siguiente al Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad. El Jueves Santo es el día para conmemorar la institución de la Sagrada Eucaristía. Así que, la celebración del jueves de *Corpus Christi* manifiesta la fe de la Iglesia en el gran don que Cristo nos dio: su Santísimo Cuerpo y la Sangre, la víspera de su muerte por nosotros. Cada domingo, al celebrar el Sacrificio del Señor y recibir la Sagrada Comunión, profesamos nuestra fe común en la muerte y resurrección salvadoras de Cristo que se realiza con la Eucaristía, y en que el mismo Cristo está verdadera y completamente presente en el pan y el vino que se convierten en su Cuerpo y la Sangre. Este gran misterio, celebrado con tanta frecuencia, puede volverse rutinario e incluso descuidado. El *Corpus Christi* nos brinda una pausa necesaria para proclamar con mayor vigor nuestras creencias y nos recuerda la necesidad de celebrar la Eucaristía y recibir la Sagrada Comunión con renovada reverencia y devoción.

La Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo nos recuerda que debemos vivir la Misa como un acontecimiento divino. Cristo muere y resucita por nosotros. Así como Cristo realiza esta obra divina desde su lugar a la diestra del Padre en el cielo por toda la eternidad, nosotros, por el poder del Espíritu Santo, experimentamos este mismo acontecimiento aquí en la tierra con cada Misa. Por eso debemos estar atentos a todas las partes de la Misa y participar con alegría cristiana en esta obra real de Cristo. Hoy se nos recuerda que, en la acción y la oración, debemos ser conscientes de la presencia real de Cristo en las hostias reservadas en el sagrario. Hacemos una genuflexión en adoración antes de entrar en nuestro banco y al levantarnos. Entramos en la procesión para recibir la Sagrada Comunión si hemos ayunado durante una hora, estamos libres de pecados graves y creemos, como la Iglesia, que el pan y el vino son verdaderamente el Señor glorificado. Nuestra forma de recibir la Sagrada Comunión —inclinándonos antes, consumiendo la hostia— es una declaración pública de nuestro amor corporal e interior por este “maravilloso sacramento”.

La Semana de la Libertad Religiosa 2025 comienza hoy, 22 de junio, con la Memoria Litúrgica de los Santos Juan Fisher y Tomás Moro, y concluirá el 29 de junio, Solemnidad de los Santos Pedro y Pablo. Esta semana invita a todos los católicos a reflexionar sobre el valor de nuestra libertad de expresar nuestra fe libremente en la sociedad y a hacer todo lo posible para protegerla. 
