Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This Sunday, we hear in the Gospel the often-repeated phrase, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things." Often, this phrase, when taken out of the context of the Gospel story, is used in a pejorative way as if to suggest that it is unimportant to take care of the needs at hand. In context, this phrase has a more positive and helpful meaning. We are all very busy. I often hear some of our retired parishioners say that they are busier now than when they were working full time. Usually, our business takes care of the needs at hand, things that need to be done. However, this business should not rule us and deprive us of our true work, the work of God. The work of God is our communion with him in prayer and adoration, reading his Word, and celebrating the Sacraments. Mary, the sister of Martha, who most likely was also typically busy, seized the opportunity with the Lord's visit to sit beside him and listen to him. Jesus was inviting Martha not to miss this opportunity. It is a real challenge for many of us to stop and pray, to give to the Lord the time he deserves, and we need to listen to him. I encourage you to give some thought—to examine your day—to find opportunities to be quiet, to reflect, to be with the Lord. This recollected posture will only enhance every other thing we must do and make all we do an offering to the Lord.

This Tuesday, July 22, is the Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene. Perhaps, when we first think of Saint Mary Magdalene, we recall her rather sinful life and the Lord's generous forgiveness of her. While this is very much a part of the story of this New Testament Saint, the Sacred Liturgy has us focus on her privileged role as a witness to the Resurrection of the Lord. As we live the Christian life, we struggle to be sincere and authentic. We know our sins and seek the mercy and forgiveness of the Lord. All this is very good and to be encouraged. However, it is only one side of discipleship—turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel. The other side is to manifest the Risen Lord. Mary Magdalene, the forgiven sinner, was entrusted before all others to announce the great joy of the Resurrection (see the Collect for the Feast). What does this mean for us? The world needs to hear about the Risen Lord—each of us, our families, our friends, everyone. The Risen Lord is announced by us above all by example and then by words. We do this when Christ is obviously the center of our lives and directs our thoughts and actions. We do this when we can encourage faith in others, especially when they are separated in their thoughts and actions from the Risen Lord. Let us ask for the heavenly help of Saint Mary Magdalene to pray for us sinners and to help us to announce the Lord, risen among us, by our lives. Saint Mary Magdalene, pray for us!

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el decimosexto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Este domingo escuchamos en el evangelio la frase tan repetida: «Marta, Marta, muchas cosas te preocupan y te inquietan». A menudo, esta frase, al sacarla del contexto del relato evangélico, se usa de forma peyorativa, como para sugerir que no es importante atender las necesidades inmediatas. En contexto, tiene un significado más positivo y útil. Todos estamos muy ocupados. A menudo oigo a algunos de nuestros feligreses jubilados decir que están más ocupados ahora que cuando trabajaban a tiempo completo. Normalmente, nuestros negocios se encargan de las necesidades inmediatas, de las cosas que hay que hacer. Sin embargo, estos negocios no deben dominarnos ni privarnos de nuestro verdadero trabajo, el trabajo de Dios. El trabajo de Dios es nuestra comunión con él en la oración y la adoración, leyendo su Palabra y celebrando los sacramentos. María, la hermana de Marta, quien probablemente también solía estar ocupada, aprovechó la visita del Señor para sentarse a su lado y escucharlo. Jesús invitaba a Marta a no desaprovechar esta oportunidad. Para muchos de nosotros es un verdadero reto detenernos a orar, dedicarle al Señor el tiempo que merece, y necesitamos escucharlo. Los animo a reflexionar, a examinar su día, a encontrar oportunidades para estar en silencio, reflexionar y estar con el Señor. Esta postura recogida enriquecerá todo lo que debamos hacer y hará de todo lo que hagamos una ofrenda al Señor.

Este martes, 22 de julio, es la festividad de Santa María Magdalena. Quizás, al pensar en Santa María Magdalena, recordemos su vida, bastante pecaminosa, y el generoso perdón del Señor. Si bien esto forma parte de la historia de esta santa del Nuevo Testamento, la sagrada liturgia nos invita a centrarnos en su papel privilegiado como testigo de la Resurrección del Señor. Al vivir la vida cristiana, nos esforzamos por ser sinceros y auténticos. Reconocemos nuestros pecados y buscamos la misericordia y el perdón del Señor. Todo esto es muy bueno y merece ser alentado. Sin embargo, es solo una parte del discipulado: alejarse del pecado y ser fiel al evangelio. La otra parte es manifestar al Señor Resucitado. María Magdalena, la pecadora perdonada, recibió el encargo, antes que todos, de anunciar la gran alegría de la Resurrección (véase la Oración Colecta para la Fiesta). ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros? El mundo necesita escuchar acerca del Señor Resucitado: cada uno de nosotros, nuestras familias, nuestros amigos, todos. Anunciamos al Señor Resucitado sobre todo con el ejemplo y luego con las palabras. Lo hacemos cuando Cristo es claramente el centro de nuestras vidas y dirige nuestros pensamientos y acciones. Lo hacemos cuando podemos fomentar la fe en los demás, especialmente cuando sus pensamientos y acciones están separados del Señor Resucitado. Pidamos la ayuda celestial de Santa María Magdalena para que ore por nosotros, pecadores, y nos ayude a anunciar al Señor, resucitado entre nosotros, con nuestras vidas. ¡Santa María Magdalena, ruega por nosotros!
