Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The disciples in today's Gospel ask, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples (Luke 11: 1)." What prompted this question? The disciples for sure were good Jews and would have known the prayers of their tradition and have been already people of prayer. It must have been something that they witnessed in Jesus when he prayed. The prayer that Jesus in turn gives to his disciples contains the clue. When Jesus begins "Father" he reveals the quality and character of his own prayer and allows us to share the same. His prayer was one of deep and complete intimacy with his Father, a communion between heaven and earth, an occasion of confident love and providence. Jesus when he teaches us to call his Father "our Father" hands on to us the very same relationship the divine Son has with his Father. Our Baptism gives us this same relationship in Jesus with his Father, our Father. We should seek to discover then more fully in our prayer all that belonged to Jesus—and recognized by the disciples—when he was at prayer. This comes when we are settled and not anxious when we pray, when we do so with great faith and sincerity of heart, when our prayer is more about love of God than our own need. We pray the Our Father rather frequently. The lesson of today's Gospel reminds us to do so then with greater devotion and awareness.

Today is World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Grandparents play a very important role in our lives. In recognition of this, Pope Francis established the fourth Sunday of July, the Sunday closest to the July 26 Memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of the Lord Jesus, as an observance of the *World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly*. Pope Francis reminded us with this observance, "Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith."

This Saturday, August 2, 2025, is the seventh anniversary of the translation of the sacred remains of Saint Katharine Drexel to our Cathedral Basilica. It is especially important to commemorate this anniversary this year as we are in the midst of the 25th Jubilee of the canonization of Saint Katharine Drexel by Pope John Paul II in the year 2000. We are blessed to have the tomb of a canonized Saint in the Mother Church of the Archdiocese. When we pray before the tomb, we are near to Saint Katharine in glory. I encourage you to pray at the tomb and know the heavenly aid of this Philadelphia Saint. A sung Mass will be celebrated on Saturday at 12:05 PM in the Basilica.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el decimoséptimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En el evangelio de hoy, los discípulos piden: «Señor, enséñanos a orar como Juan enseñó a sus discípulos (Lucas 11:1)». ¿Qué les inspiró esta pregunta? Seguramente eran buenos judíos, conocían las oraciones de su tradición y ya eran personas de oración. Debieron presenciar algo en Jesús cuando oraba. La oración que Jesús, a su vez, dirige a sus discípulos contiene la clave. Cuando Jesús comienza diciendo «Padre», revela la calidad y el carácter de su propia oración y nos permite compartirla. Su oración era de profunda y completa intimidad con su Padre, una comunión entre el cielo y la tierra, una ocasión de amor confiado y providencia. Al enseñarnos a llamar a su Padre «Padre nuestro», Jesús nos transmite la misma relación que el Hijo divino tiene con su Padre. Nuestro Bautismo nos da esta misma relación en Jesús con su Padre, nuestro Padre. Debemos procurar descubrir más plenamente en nuestra oración todo aquello que pertenecía a Jesús —y que sus discípulos reconocieron— cuando oraba. Esto se logra cuando oramos con serenidad y sin ansiedad, cuando lo hacemos con gran fe y sinceridad de corazón, cuando nuestra oración se centra más en el amor a Dios que en nuestra propia necesidad. Rezamos el Padre Nuestro con bastante frecuencia. La lección del evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que debemos hacerlo con mayor devoción y consciencia.

Hoy es el Día Mundial de los Abuelos y de las Personas Mayores. Los abuelos desempeñan un papel muy importante en nuestras vidas. En reconocimiento a esto, el Papa Francisco estableció el cuarto domingo de julio, el domingo más cercano a la memoria de los santos Joaquín y Ana, abuelos del Señor Jesús, el 26 de julio, como celebración del *Día Mundial de los Abuelos y de las Personas Mayores*. El Papa Francisco nos recordó con esta celebración: «No solo los nietos y jóvenes están llamados a estar presentes en la vida de las personas mayores, sino que las personas mayores y los abuelos también tienen la misión de evangelizar, proclamar y orar, y de animar a los jóvenes en su fe».

Este sábado 2 de agosto del 2025 se conmemora el séptimo aniversario del traslado de los restos sagrados de Santa Katharine Drexel a nuestra Catedral Basílica. 
