Dear Parishioners,

This is the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. “You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come (Luke 12: 40).” This verse from today’s Gospel should strike all of us with an immediate need to make an honest accounting before the Lord. Am I ready to die today? Is my soul in the state of grace? Am I presuming on the mercy of the Lord? Have I done or am I doing my part to be ready for that hour that none of us expect?

Yes, at the hour of our death, we want to be and should be prepared to meet the Lord in glory. However, the lesson of today’s Gospel is that our preparation begins now for everlasting life. What does this mean? Everything we do at this moment—no matter how young or old we might be—is part of our pilgrimage to our true home in heaven. At this moment, we should have our eyes fixed on Jesus, knowing His love and grace, keeping His commandments, and witnessing to His life at work in us. This habitual way of living the Christian life is how we are then in a constant state of preparation for when the Son of Man comes. In this way, our life on earth is always connected with our life in heaven. The closest we are to heaven on earth is during the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. I encourage you, as you participate in Holy Mass and receive Holy Communion that you pray that *at this moment* you are prepared as ever for the Lord, if He should come *at this moment*.

This Friday, August 15, 2025, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. This summer Holy Day fills us with the hope that what is Mary’s eternal glory may one day come to each of us in the death and resurrection of her Divine Son. As we look forward to celebrating this great Solemnity, we turn to Mary, our Mother assumed into Heaven, and bring to her the many prayers that we have for so many intentions. Masses for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary can be found elsewhere in this edition of the parish bulletin. The 5:15 PM Mass on the Holy Day will be a Solemn Mass celebrated according to the 1962 *Missale Romanum* in Latin. Confessions on the Holy Day, August 15, will take place as usual at 11:30 AM in the Basilica.

Invite a family member, a neighbor, and/or a friend to join you for Holy Mass next Sunday at the Cathedral Basilica.

Este es el décimo noveno domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. «Pues también ustedes estén preparados, porque a la hora en que menos lo piensen vendrá el Hijo del Hombre» (Lucas 12:40). Este versículo del evangelio de hoy debería despertar en todos nosotros la necesidad inmediata de rendir cuentas sinceramente ante el Señor. ¿Estoy listo para morir hoy? ¿Está mi alma en gracia de Dios? ¿Estoy confiando en la misericordia del Señor? ¿He hecho o estoy haciendo mi parte para estar listo para esa hora que ninguno de nosotros espera?
