Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. “No servant has two masters. [...] You cannot serve both God and mammon (Luke 16: 13).” The Lord is rather direct in his instruction to us with this Sunday’s Gospel. To live the Christian life without distraction, including the insidious distraction of sin, demands a singular focus in our lives. This focus keeps us in the company of the Lord. The focus must be God. God is our master. God, and not our riches, regardless of the form they take, must receive our complete and undistracted attention as Christians. This way of living the Christian life needs to be habitual and allowed to mature over time. This way of living the Christian life is the witness we must give to others, especially our families and friends. This Sunday as we hear the Lord’s instruction to serve God alone let us reflect on how we do just this. Is prayer a part of my everyday routine? Do I examine my conscience each evening? Do I consider what the Gospel teaches, and the Commandments require in my daily choices? Do I regularly seek virtue over vice? Just how is God the master of my life, the focus of my life? God’s grace is with us as we make him the focus of our Christian lives. Let us be confident in our decision to be a Christian disciple!

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia honors those in the Consecrated Life celebrating anniversaries of religious profession at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass today. These religious priests, Brothers and Sisters represent together thousands of years of living the evangelical counsels of chastity, poverty and obedience in the service of God and his Church. Let us thank God for those in the Consecrated Life and for the many that have influenced our lives. Let us ask the Lord to provide urgently for more numerous vocations to the Consecrated Life in the Archdiocese. We are so grateful in our Cathedral Parish for the Consecrated Life and ministry of Dominican Father Matthew Carroll, of two Religious Sisters of Mercy of Alma—Sister Marie Faustina and Sister Mary Raphael as well as our Parish Visitor of Mary Immaculate, Sister Mary Luchia.

Panhandlers are often attracted to gatherings at our Cathedral Basilica. I assure you that we have services available to assist the poor and homeless that frequent the Cathedral Basilica. Please do not give any money to the panhandlers inside or outside the Cathedral Basilica. If you are approached by a panhandler, please alert one of the parish priests or sacristans or greeters.

Invite a family member, a neighbor and/or a friend to join you for Holy Mass next Sunday at the Cathedral Basilica.

Please keep the intention for peace in our world, especially those parts most torn apart by war, in your prayers. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us!

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el vigésimo quinto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. «No hay criado que pueda servir a dos amos, [...] no pueden ustedes servir a Dios y al dinero (Lucas 16:13)». El Señor nos instruye con bastante claridad en el evangelio de este domingo. Vivir la vida cristiana sin distracciones, incluyendo la insidiosa distracción del pecado, exige un enfoque singular en nuestras vidas. Este enfoque nos mantiene en compañía del Señor. El enfoque debe ser Dios. Dios es nuestro amo. Dios, y no nuestras riquezas, independientemente de la forma que adopten, debe recibir nuestra atención completa y sin distracciones como cristianos. La gracia de Dios nos acompaña al convertirlo en el centro de nuestra vida cristiana. ¡Tengamos confianza en nuestra decisión de ser discípulos cristianos!

Inviten a un familiar, vecino o amigo a la Santa Misa del próximo domingo en la Basílica Catedral.





1700TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE COUNCIL OF NICAEEA

The battle was raging. The Arian heresy had gripped large swaths of the Church, leading many to deny the divinity of Christ. But at the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD, the Holy Spirit, working through the Council Fathers, definitively affirmed the Church's inerrant faith in Jesus Christ, Second Person of the Trinity, consubstantial with the Father.

Seventeen hundred years later, Christians from across the region are invited to gather as we offer our gratitude to God for His self-revelation in Jesus Christ and for the Council of Nicaea that affirmed and protected the essential truth that Jesus is God.
