Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. “They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them (Luke 16: 29).” This is the heart of the lesson of this Sunday’s Gospel. The rich man had many opportunities to live the life of charity and justice, and especially when it came to giving food and drink to the poor Lazarus. In death, the rich man perishes in the netherworld and Lazarus rests in the bosom of Abraham. Abraham tells the rich man that he is across the great divide from Lazarus’ resting place because of the way he lived, the way he ignored the opportunities to give food and drink to a poor man. The rich man does not want his brothers to suffer the same fate. He begs Abraham to send Lazarus to warn his brothers. Abraham refuses and says, “They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.” My friends, we do not want to suffer the fate of the rich man. And it is possible. How do we avoid this fate? Let us heed the advice of Abraham. Let us see all the opportunities given to us to follow the way of Moses, the prophets, and the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Now is the time to live the Christian life as fully and honestly as possible. This is how we avoid the fate of the rich man. Every Sunday, when we participate in Mass, we should listen carefully to the word of God for its instruction to live as God wants us to live. Every Sunday, when we receive Holy Communion, we receive the grace and strength to keep the word we hear. Again, this is how we avoid the fate of the rich man. Let us listen!

This Monday, September 29, 2025, is the Feast of the Archangels, Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. The Archangels are the patrons for so many people and situations in the lives of Christians. Saint Michael is in special way the heavenly patron of the Police. The Police protect us in ways often unknown to us. They constantly put their lives at risk for us. They work daily in harm’s way. The Police need our prayers and support. I invite you to ask Saint Michael, who is a safeguard against evil, to protect our Police. Perhaps you might attend Mass on Monday at either 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM to pray especially for our Police.

October is the month of the Most Holy Rosary. The Memorial of the Our Lady of the Rosary is Tuesday, October 7, 2025. The Rosary gives us a way of raising our prayers to Jesus through Mary, his Mother and our Mother. As we meditate on the different sets of Mysteries with each decade of Hail Mary’s, we are calling to mind the Gospel and our Father’s plan of salvation and redemption accomplished by his Divine Son. I encourage you to turn to the Rosary frequently—daily—during this month of October, if you do not already, and allow this powerful prayer to lead you closer to the Lord with the help of Mary. We can include so many intentions with our Rosary. *Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us!*

October is Respect Life Month in the United States. Every life, without exception, deserves the protection of the law to be born and to die as God and his commandments intend. I encourage you to pray in an intentional way for the protection of human life at every stage and for the legal end to abortion and euthanasia in every part of our land, especially throughout October.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Parish. 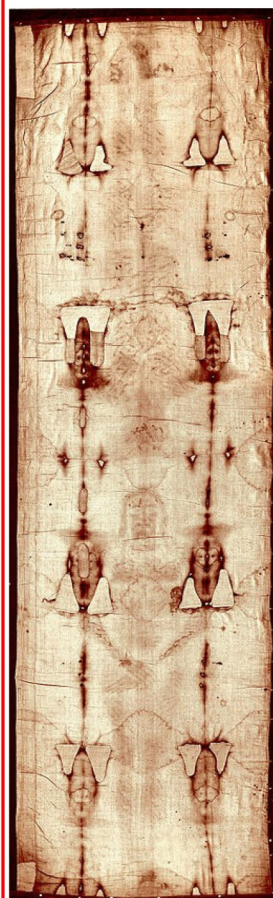
