Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel this Sunday, we meet the persistent widow. Jesus makes the point with this widow of the necessity of his disciples—you and me—“to pray always without becoming weary (Luke 18: 1).” All throughout the Sacred Scriptures, the people of the Old Testament and the followers of Christ in the New Testament are exhorted to pray, to bring to the Lord their praise and thanksgiving, their petitions and sorrows, their need for mercy and grace. This exhortation to pray comes to us today as well. The lifeline of our relationship with God is our daily communion with him in our prayer when we celebrate the Sacred Liturgy and in our daily prayer. Yet, we can become frustrated and even bored in our prayer. Does God hear me? Does my prayer make a difference? It seems that I ask the Lord for the same thing repeatedly and experience no response from him. Our questions can be many. These are fair questions. However, before the questions there is the Father of us all, Jesus, his divine Son, and the Holy Spirit. What we know of God, even more so than about the dishonest judge in the Gospel, is that he is constant in his love and providence for us, his desire for us to be united with him now and in heaven, and his promise never to abandon us. He does hear our prayers—even if we grow weary—and responds according to his will for us and all our needs. To begin with our loving God when we consider the fruitfulness of our prayer removes the doubts and frustrations with our prayer when we are tempted to begin with ourselves. *Pray always and do not become weary!*

Today, we recognize the members of the Catholic Medical Association (CMA) at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass. The CMA typically gathers for a Sunday Mass closest to the Feast of Saint Luke the Evangelist (October 18), one of the patrons of medical doctors. The mission of the CMA is to form and support current and future physicians to live and promote the principles of the Catholic Faith in the science and practice of medicine. Let us keep these Catholic members of the medical profession in our prayers.

The presence of the sacred remains of Saint Katharine Drexel in our Cathedral Basilica continues to bring many blessings, especially to the countless pilgrims who visit her tomb for her heavenly help. At the tomb of Saint Katharine Drexel there are envelopes for our parishioners and visitors to list their intentions and donate to the Shrine. These intentions are especially remembered every Thursday in our perpetual Novena to Saint Katharine Drexel following the 7:15 AM and 12:05 PM Masses in the Cathedral Chapel. I am also grateful for the offerings that accompany these prayer requests. They contribute to the promotional development of the Shrine. I invite our parishioners to remember all those requests made at the Tomb of our Philadelphia Saint in their prayers as well, especially at Mass. *Saint Katharine Drexel, pray for us!*

I remind you that October is Respect Life Month and the Month of the Holy Rosary. When you pray the Rosary during these days, please remember the intention of respect for human life from the first moment of conception until natural death.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the young adult ministries in the Cathedral Parish. 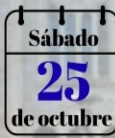

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este es el vigésimo noveno domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En el evangelio de este domingo, nos encontramos con la viuda persistente. Jesús, con esta viuda, recalca la necesidad de sus discípulos —tú y yo— de “orar siempre y sin desfallecer” (Lucas 18:1). A lo largo de las Sagradas Escrituras, tanto el pueblo del Antiguo Testamento como los seguidores de Cristo en el Nuevo Testamento son exhortados a orar, a presentar al Señor sus alabanzas y agradecimientos, sus peticiones y penas, su necesidad de misericordia y gracia. Esta exhortación a orar nos llega también hoy. La base de nuestra relación con Dios es nuestra comunión diaria con Él en la oración, al celebrar la sagrada liturgia y en nuestra oración diaria. Sin embargo, podemos sentirnos frustrados e incluso aburridos en la oración. ¿Me escucha Dios? ¿Mi oración marca la diferencia? Parece que le pido al Señor lo mismo una y otra vez y no recibo respuesta de él. Nuestras preguntas pueden ser muchas. Estas son preguntas justas. Sin embargo, antes de las preguntas, está el Padre de todos nosotros, Jesús, su divino Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. Lo que sabemos de Dios, incluso más que del juez deshonesto del evangelio, es que Él es constante en su amor y providencia por nosotros, su deseo de que estemos unidos a Él ahora y en el cielo, y su promesa de nunca abandonarnos. Él escucha nuestras oraciones, incluso si nos cansamos, y responde según su voluntad para nosotros y todas nuestras necesidades. Comenzar con nuestro Dios amoroso cuando consideramos la fecundidad de nuestra oración elimina las dudas y frustraciones con nuestra oración cuando nos sentimos tentados a comenzar por nosotros mismos. *¡Oren siempre y sin desfallecer!*

Hoy, reconocemos a los miembros de la Asociación Médica Católica (CMA) en la Misa Solemne de las 11:00 AM. OCTOBER: THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY



The Church has set aside the whole month of October to honor the Holy Rosary, a prayer that invites us to enter into the great mysteries of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. Pope Leo XIII—often called “the Pope of the Rosary”—urged the faithful to make the Rosary a daily habit, especially during this month, describing it as a “form of prayer is particularly pleasing to the Blessed Virgin, and that it is especially suitable as a means of defense for the Church and all Christians” (Pope Leo XIII, *Supremi Apostolatus*, §5). The Holy Rosary is a powerful means of seeking God's peace for the world and protection for the Church. It engages our mind, heart, and will, drawing us ever closer to Jesus through the loving intercession of His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Let us renew our devotion to Our Mother in this October: pray the Rosary alone, with family, or together as a community, and ask Mary to help us grow in holiness, unity, and hope for all.

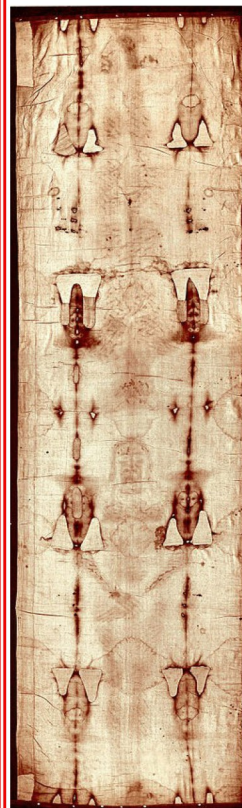

Join us on **Sunday, October 26, 2025**, at the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass to celebrate the 15th Anniversary of Saint Camilla Battista Varani's Canonization. She was canonized a saint by Pope Benedict XVI on October 17, 2010.

Born in 1458, Saint Camilla Battista Varani was the daughter of Duke Julius Caesar Varani of Camerino, Italy. Saint Camilla forfeited her royal heritage to devote her life to Christ, becoming a cloistered Poor Clare nun at age 23. Accounted as being one of the most accomplished scholars of her time, Saint Camilla wrote several works in both Latin and Italian. Throughout her life, Saint Camilla strived to identify herself with the sufferings of Jesus and His Passion.
