Dear Parishioners,

This is the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. “O God, be merciful to me a sinner (Luke 18: 13).” This is the pleading of the tax collector in this Sunday’s Gospel. The Lord Jesus is so clear in his parable to us this Sunday when he compares the righteous words of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector. Yes, it is most important that we always follow the will and the way of the Lord. However, we do so for the glory of God and the service of others. We do not do so to boast and to hold ourselves above others. No matter how faithful we are to what God expects of us there is still the need to be humble before him and recognize our sinful failings. Let us take a lesson from the tax collector and turn to the Lord for his mercy as we aim to live our Christian lives with great integrity.

The month of November begins next Saturday with two very important observances for all Catholics. Saturday, November 1, 2025, is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day. Sunday, November 2, 2025, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls’ Day).

All Saints Day gives us the opportunity to recall all the saints, especially our patron saints, who give us the witness and inspiration we so often need to live our Christian lives with courage and integrity. On All Saints Day, we honor the saints and ask for their heavenly help during this life so that we may be one day with them in heaven. Please see elsewhere in the parish bulletin for the schedule of Masses for All Saints Day.

All Souls’ Day, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, reminds us of the spiritual work of mercy to pray for the dead. We remember the dead especially during the celebration of Mass. Our faith assures us of the power of Christ’s Sacrifice to aid the souls in Purgatory as they are purified for the glory of heaven. On November 2, we remember our beloved deceased with special devotion as well as all through the month of November. The All Souls Envelopes, listing the dead to be remembered especially this month, will be placed at the All Souls Altar in the Basilica. Mass will be offered frequently during the month of November for all the faithful departed, including those listed. I encourage you to obtain a Memorial Candle for your beloved deceased to be placed at the All Souls Altar. Please see elsewhere in the parish bulletin for more information about the Memorial Candles for those who have died.

As a reminder, low gluten hosts for Holy Communion and listening devices for the hearing impaired are always available for those coming to Mass at the Cathedral Basilica. Please see the sacristan in the sacristy before Mass begins about both possibilities.

You should have received the Annual Parish Fall Collection letter in the mail. I thank you in advance for your generosity to our Cathedral Parish with this collection and all throughout the year.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Parish.
