Dear Parishioners,

This is the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. “Increase our faith (Luke 17:5).” The Apostles in the Gospel this Sunday beseech the Lord Jesus to increase their faith. The Twelve knew the Lord deeply and followed him closely. They heard his saving instructions and witnessed his marvelous deeds. Yet together they pleaded with Jesus to increase their faith. What could have been lacking in their belief at this point in the Gospel story? Perhaps, nothing was lacking in their belief in Jesus, in his words and deeds. However, they knew their own weaknesses, their sinfulness, and their fears. They were aware of their struggles to follow him with the faithfulness he expected of them. Is not this our story as well as modern-day Christians? We love the Lord Jesus. We believe all that he and his holy Church teach us. We are in wonder and awe of his great signs in the Gospel and the Sacraments we celebrate today, especially the Holy Eucharist. Yet, we too know our weaknesses, our sinfulness, our fears—our struggles to follow him faithfully. Like the Apostles, we beg the Lord to increase our faith. We ask for the gift and grace to have confidence in the Lord’s presence to us to do all that he asks of us. We ask for his generous assistance to carry our crosses. We pray for the help to witness to him with a holy way of life—to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. The Lord will not fail to hear our prayer for an increase in faith.

October is Respect Life Month and today is Respect Life Sunday. Not everyone in the same way can participate in the many public and political opportunities to demonstrate a positive position on respect for human life from the first moment of conception until natural death. However, every one of us can pray for the intention of respect for all human life, especially the legal protection of life in our land. This intention will be especially remembered in the Sunday Universal Prayer during the month of October.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary is this Tuesday, October 7, 2025. The Holy Rosary will be prayed following the 7:15 AM and 12:05 PM Mass on October 7. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, has asked all Catholics to pray the Holy Rosary each day of this Month of the Holy Rosary. Grandparents, I encourage you to invite your grandchildren to pray the Holy Rosary with you.

The Parish Pastoral Council serves our parish in many fine ways, especially as a group of parishioners that offers me sound advice. Council meetings cover a wide range of topics and concerns that directly impact the life and mission of the Cathedral Parish. I am extremely grateful to the Council members for their time and interest in the work of the Council and the assistance they give to me. Every year, there is a turnover of one or two members. This year, we are looking for candidates from among our parishioners who can represent those who carry out a liturgical ministry and who can represent the Spanish-speaking members of the Cathedral Parish. Este es el Vigésimo séptimo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario.
“Auméntanos la fe” (Lucas 17:5). En el evangelio de este domingo, los Apóstoles suplican al Señor Jesús que aumente su fe. Los Doce conocían profundamente al Señor y lo seguían de cerca. Escucharon sus instrucciones salvadoras y presenciaron sus obras maravillosas. Sin embargo, juntos le suplicaron a Jesús que aumentara su fe. ¿Qué podría haber faltado en su fe en este punto del relato evangélico? Quizás, nada faltaba en su fe en Jesús, en sus palabras y obras. Sin embargo, conocían sus propias debilidades, su pecado y sus miedos. Eran conscientes de sus dificultades para seguirlo con la fidelidad que él esperaba de ellos. ¿No es esta nuestra historia, así como la de los cristianos de hoy? Amamos al Señor Jesús. 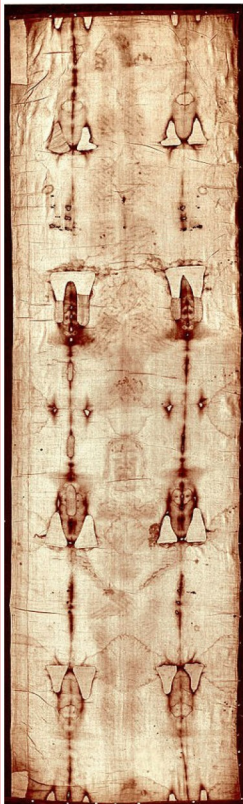

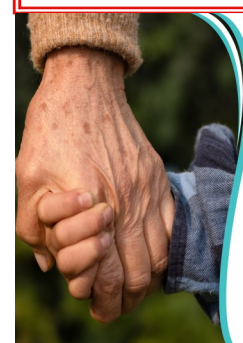
