Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. With this Sunday's observance, our liturgical year comes to a fitting conclusion. All things and all people belong to Christ—from the beginning of time, today, and for all eternity. Every grace and blessing that we have received from Our Lord Jesus Christ, especially with the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, brings us more fully into his Kingdom. Today in the Holy Gospel, we hear the good thief, Saint Dismas—as tradition names him, beg the Lord on the cross, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom (Luke 23: 42).” This should be our prayer all the time and especially so on this last Sunday of the liturgical year as we reflect on the graces received this past year and look forward to a new liturgical year. The Christian goal for all of us is to allow Christ, the King, to reign fully in our lives now as we long for our place in his eternal Kingdom.

This Wednesday, November 26, is the birthday of Saint Katharine Drexel, born in 1858. Plan a possible visit to her tomb in the Cathedral Basilica on her birthday and ask for her heavenly intercession. Saint Katharine Drexel is very near to us with her prayers.

This Thursday, November 27, 2025, is Thanksgiving Day, a national holiday. I encourage you to include the celebration of Holy Mass as part of your Thanksgiving Day. The Holy Eucharist, the most perfect prayer of thanksgiving, is a most appropriate way to express our gratitude to the Lord for all his favors and blessings to us. *Please see the schedule for Thanksgiving Day and Friday, November 28, elsewhere in this edition of the parish bulletin.*

Next Sunday, November 30, 2025, is the First Sunday of Advent. Advent is usually eclipsed by all sorts of anticipations of Christmas. Sometimes, Advent appears like a very long Christmas Eve. Even if the world around us says it is Christmas, it is not yet. We need to do our part to keep a good and holy Advent. I invite you to plan now on your personal participation in the Advent period. It is a time for devout preparation for the Birth of Christ with some practical spiritual measures. Consider reading the Prophet Isaiah, who instructs us how to prepare for the coming of Christ. Pray more frequently the Joyful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary to meditate with Mary on the coming of Christ. Make a good Advent Confession. Come to daily Mass! Let us not rush Christmas! We need to prepare—our hearts and lives—for the Birth of the Savior. *The First Sunday of Advent also begins our Parish Forty Hours Devotion. Please see the information for the Forty Hours Devotion elsewhere in this edition of the parish bulletin.*

During this month of November, we continue to pray for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. May their souls, and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Thank you to all our parishioners and some of our visitors for your generous response to our annual Parish Fall Collection (Block Collection). The response has been very good to date. SACRED JUBILEE SITE

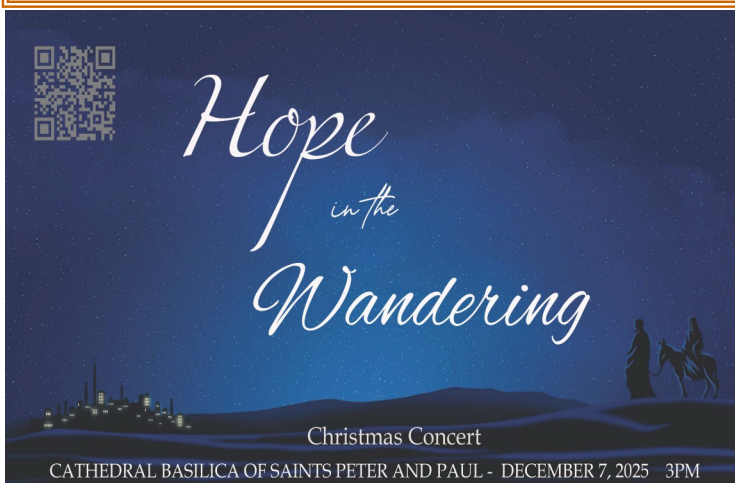

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Este domingo celebramos la Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. Con la celebración de este domingo, nuestro año litúrgico llega a su debido término. Todas las cosas y todas las personas pertenecen a Cristo, desde el principio de los tiempos, hoy y por toda la eternidad. Cada gracia y bendición que hemos recibido de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, especialmente con la celebración de la Sagrada Liturgia, nos introduce más plenamente en su Reino.
